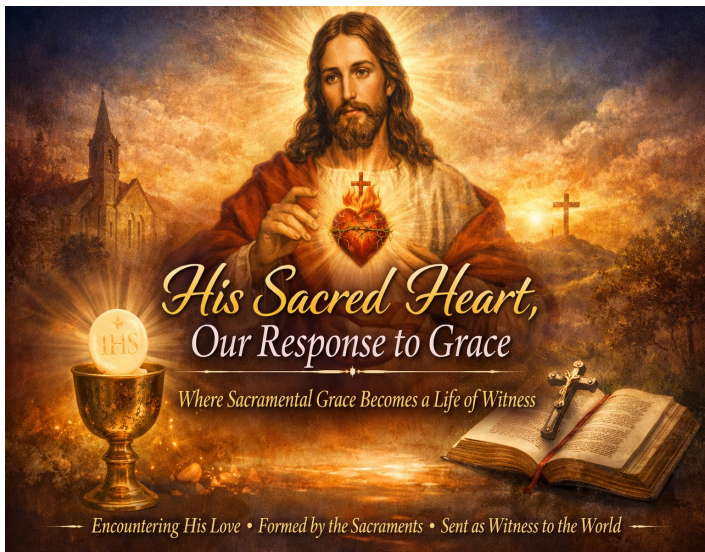

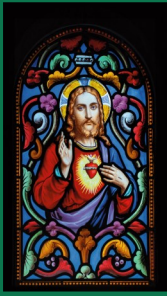

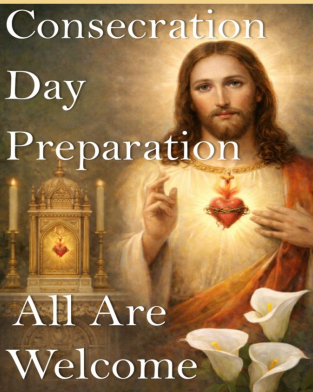

The Holy Face of Jesus Presentation

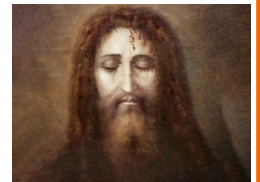
Sunday, April 26th

◆ St Joseph's Church

As we stop and reflect on Jesus in this Easter Season, please join us as we learn about this well established but sometimes hidden or forgotten devotion to the Holy Face of Jesus.

It's time to get this devotion to Jesus ignited again. This was St Therese's most powerful of all devotions; in fact, in her title, she is known as St Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face. Many graces and miracles are attributed to this very special devotion.





Saint Joseph the Worker

It is a heartfelt and joyous celebration to honor Saint Joseph, the husband of Mary, the putative father of Jesus, worker, patriarch, and patron of the universal Church. That text from the Letter to the Romans, speaking to us about the faith and hope of Abraham, reflects well what is the faith and hope of Saint Joseph. It was hard and costly for Abraham to trust in God, who put him on a path and filled him with promises that he did not see fully fulfilled, and even more so when God asked for the sacrifice of the son of promise. But Abraham believed when it might have seemed that his hopes were vanishing. And as the Apostle said, this was credited to his righteousness. This is what Joseph experienced. He also had his Passover, the passage of God through his life that he had to learn to discover and see to fully trust God. Joseph had his Passover, not without passion and death within himself, in order to discover the light that would give him fulfillment. Joseph lived his Passover in silence, but encouraged by that step of God in his life because God also wanted to count on Joseph's collaboration for that saving step of God in Christ Jesus, the one who was going to appear as Joseph's son, and in whom the definitive and eternal Passover was to be accomplished. 'He was good,' the Gospel tells us about Joseph as a definition of his life. But in that 'he was good' many great things of Joseph's soul are enclosed, such as his faith and his availability for God, as well as his capacity for sacrifice in fulfilling his duty as a father and head of that family that was going to be the Holy Family of Nazareth. When his heart was troubled and his soul full of doubts, he maintained his goodness and his desire to never harm anyone, trusting that in the midst of that darkness, one day the light could appear. And the light came into his life with an angel sent by the Lord in his dreams, just as one day an angel also came to Mary to announce to her the divine motherhood that was going to be conceived in her womb, to announce to Joseph what collaboration God was asking of him in that Mystery of Salvation that was being conceived in Mary's womb. 'Do not be afraid,' the angel always announces when he comes from God. He said it to Mary, he would now say it to Joseph, just as he would one day say it to the women who went to the tomb seeking the crucified one who was already risen. And it is that God comes to us not for fear but for peace. In our smallness and weakness, we feel disturbed and full of fear when the mystery of God appears in our life, but God's passage will always be for peace, because God's passage through our life will always be manifesting to us what the love of God is. 'When Joseph woke up', the evangelist will end up telling us, 'he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him.' It was the beginning of his collaboration in the work of God. It was the beginning of his Passover, of that passage of God through his life, a life full of faith and animated by hope. He was a soul of God in which

God was also taking delight because of the availability and the greatness of that heart. Always available for God, for sacrifice, for love, for living the Passover. The knowledge of the Scriptures, which could not be absent in Joseph as in every pious Jew, made him see light behind those darkneses because he discovered the design of God. The path of Passover for Joseph, like the path of God through his life, would be the flight to Egypt to save the child's life, as later would be his silent life in Nazareth, where they would finally settle. The true Passover, the definitive and eternal one, we have in Jesus, the true Passover of God for us in his death and in his resurrection. Saint Joseph is a powerful intercessor whom we turn to many times in our needs, asking for his patronage and protection. Let us not fail to do so. But let us ask him for our faith and for our hope. May his example help us to enliven our faith, to keep our hope alive. May his glorious intercession before the throne of God obtain for us that gift of faith, that gift of hope, that openness of our heart, that capacity for sacrifice for service and for fulfilling our responsibilities, and also that final perseverance in a good death of which Saint Joseph is also advocate and protector. If the house of Nazareth, where Joseph was the head of the family, was like the seminary where Jesus grew in stature, in wisdom, and in grace before God and men, let us ask then Saint Joseph for our seminaries where future priests are formed and forged in spirit, who will carry out the same work as Jesus and who also need to grow in wisdom and in grace before God and men. Saint Joseph also had his passover, the passage of God through his life, which he knew how to see and take advantage of. From Saint Joseph, let us learn the spirituality of silence. It is the spirituality of discernment between the darkness of the soul and the dawn of God and His plans. It is the "listening to the Angel" who visits the heart when it struggles with doubts and fears, and whispers what must be done. It is responding with acts of obedience, saving words, making the profession of faith a proclamation of total certainty in God. May we learn from Saint Joseph to discover our Passover, that saving step of God through our life, and to live it with generosity of heart.

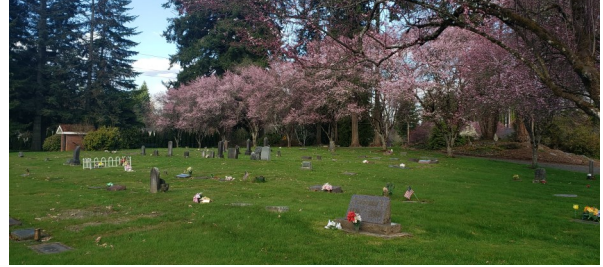

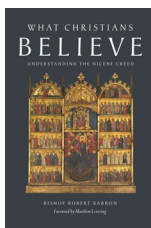

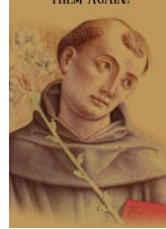
