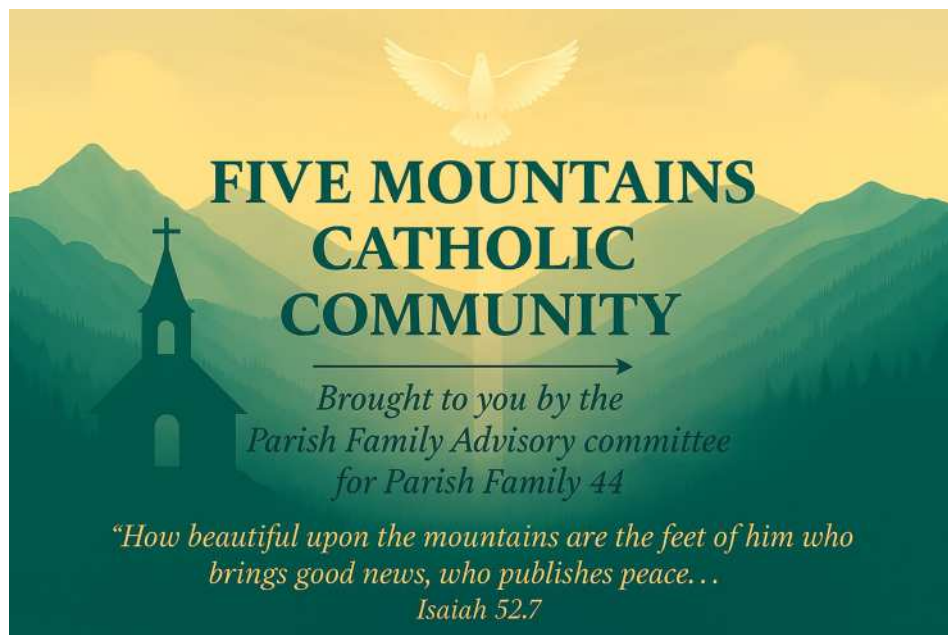

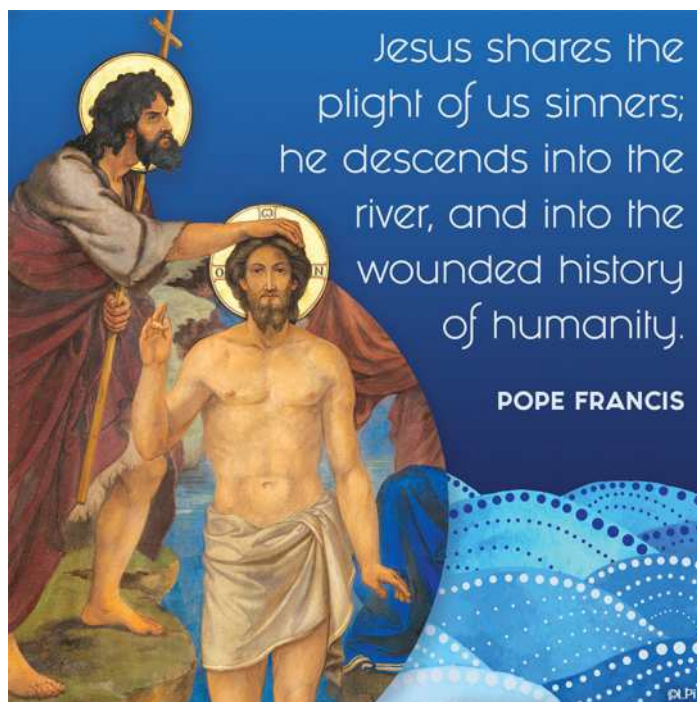
PASTOR'S LETTER

FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

The Baptism of the Lord concludes the Christmas Season. The Church invites us to contemplate Jesus anew, but in a second epiphany of himself: as the Second Person of the Holy Trinity. Jesus, God and man without sin, is baptized by John. Why is this, if in him there is no sin? The question touches on mystery: through a visible sign, Jesus, with his Baptism, is opening the door of salvation to all humankind. Our nature, damaged by original sin, is restored by the baptismal water. In the fifth century, St. Maximus of Turin, referring to this water of the Lord's Baptism, noted the following: "When the Savior is washed, all the water necessary for our baptism is purified, and the font is cleansed so that it may then be administered to the peoples who are to come to the grace of that bath." In other words, Christ is the source of all purity, and if He does not cleanse us, sin will maintain its dominion over us. The waters of Baptism have a profound meaning: a new life and authentic freedom. St. Gregory Nazianzen, a fourth-century Church Father, taught: "John is baptizing, and Christ approaches, perhaps to sanctify the one by whom he is to be baptized, and certainly to bury the whole of the old Adam in the waters, sanctifying the Jordan before us and for our sake; and thus, the Lord, who was spirit and flesh, consecrates us through the Spirit and water." Baptism is the sacrament that completely renews us, to the point that it is "a new birth," but into the life of Grace, which is the fullest. The power of this sacrament is incalculable." On Sunday, January 7, 2001, in his homily for the Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord Jesus Christ, Saint John Paul II reflected on our baptism: "Christian baptism, confirmed by the sacrament of confirmation, makes all believers, each according to their specific vocation, co-responsible for the great mission of the Church. Each one, in their own sphere, with their own identity, in communion with others and with the Church, must feel solidarity with the one Redeemer of humankind." The baptism of Jesus, proclaimed each year according to a different Synoptic Gospel, is a revelation of the messianic nature of the Servant of the Lord, upon whom the Holy Spirit will rest (Is 42:1-4) and who has been anointed for his redemptive mission (Acts 10:34-38: 2nd reading). Baptism consecrates us through the Spirit and water. This consecration is the new birth (Jn 3:5), which makes us adopted children of God (Rom 8:15). In his remarks before the Sunday Angelus prayer, Pope Francis reflected on the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan River, an event in which "the Epiphany of God takes place, revealing his face in the Son and making his voice heard." Before the faithful gathered in St. Peter's Square, the Pope said that the feast of the Baptism of Jesus "makes us think about many things, including our own baptism." "Jesus unites himself with his people, who are going to

receive baptism for the forgiveness of sins. I like to recall the words of a hymn from today's liturgy: Jesus goes to be baptized by John 'with his soul naked and his feet bare,'" he added. Pope Francis explained that "when Jesus receives baptism, the Spirit is manifested and the Epiphany of God takes place, revealing his face in the Son and making his voice heard, saying: 'You are my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.'" The Pope said that by "revealing himself through the Son, the Father establishes a privileged place to enter into dialogue and communion with humanity. It is the face of the beloved Son." "Secondly," he added, "the voice: 'You are my beloved Son.'" This is another sign that accompanies the revelation of Jesus." In that sense, the Pope reiterated that the feast the Church celebrates today "leads us to contemplate the face and voice of God, which are manifested in the humanity of Jesus." "And so let us ask ourselves: Do we feel loved? Do I feel loved and accompanied by God, or do I think that God is distant from me? Are we able to recognize his face in Jesus and in our brothers and sisters? And are we accustomed to hearing his voice?" Then, he invited us to ask ourselves: "Does each of us remember the date of our baptism? This is very important! Think: On what day was I baptized?" "And if we don't remember, when we get home, let us ask our parents or godparents the date of our baptism. That date should be celebrated as a new birthday: the date of our birth in the Spirit of God."

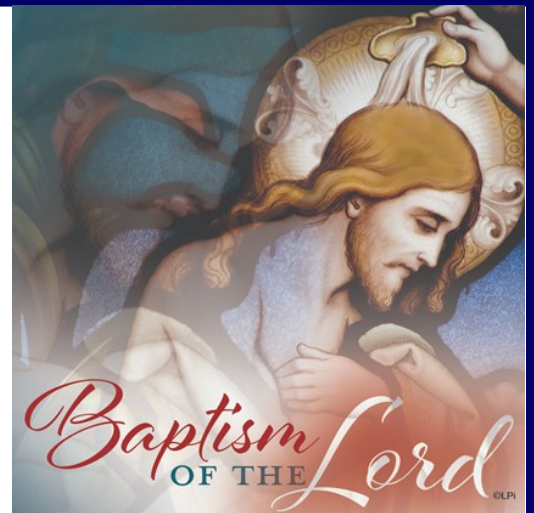


STEWARDSHIP

The Baptism of the Lord Stewardship Refection

“This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased” - Mt 3:17

***Loving Father,
You have claimed us as Your own through the waters of baptism
and filled us with the gift of the Holy Spirit.
Renew in us the grace of our baptism,
that we may listen to Your voice,
follow Your Son with humility,
and joyfully offer our lives in loving service to others.
We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.***



As we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we are shown both the identity of Jesus and the meaning of our own baptism.

In the Gospel, Jesus comes to the Jordan to be baptized by John, not out of need, but in obedience to the Father's will: ***“Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness” (Mt 3:15).*** In entering the waters, Jesus humbles Himself and stands fully with humanity. As He rises from the Jordan, the heavens open, the Spirit descends like a dove, and the Father proclaims, ***“This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased” (Mt 3:17).*** This moment reveals the Trinity and marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

The first reading from Isaiah helps us understand this mission. The Lord presents His chosen servant, one who will bring justice not by force, but with gentleness: ***“A bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick he shall not quench” (Is 42:3).*** He is called to be ***“a light for the nations,”*** to open eyes and free those in darkness (*Is 42:6–7*).

In Acts of the Apostles, Peter proclaims that God shows no partiality and that Jesus, ***“anointed by God with the Holy Spirit and power, went about doing good” (Acts 10:38).*** Everything Jesus does flows from His relationship with the Father and His openness to the Spirit.

This feast invites us to remember that the same Spirit was given to us in baptism. We, too, have been claimed as beloved sons and daughters of God. Baptism is not only the beginning of faith, it is a lifelong calling. What we have received is meant to be lived and shared.

Stewardship naturally flows from this baptismal identity. If Jesus' mission was to bring light, healing, and hope, then our time, talents, and resources are entrusted to us for the same purpose. Like Christ, we are sent to “go about doing good,” using the gifts God has given us for the sake of others and the building up of His Kingdom.

May this feast renew our gratitude for the gift of baptism and strengthen our commitment to live as faithful stewards, listening to the Father's voice, guided by the Spirit, and following Christ in generous service.

Closing Trinity Prayer

Glory to You, O Father,
from whom every gift comes
and who calls us Your beloved sons and daughters.

Glory to You, O Son,
who sanctified the waters of baptism
and gave Your life in loving service for the world.

Glory to You, O Holy Spirit,
who entrusts us with gifts to share
and sends us forth to serve with
generous hearts.
All honor and praise are Yours,
one God, for ever and ever.

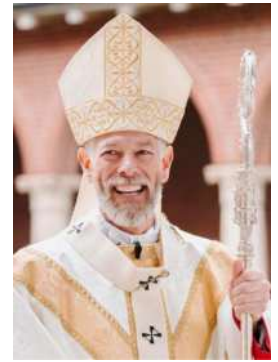

Reflection on the Consecration to the Sacred Heart

by Archbishop Alexander K. Sample, Chairman of the Committee for Religious Liberty

On November 11, the bishops of the United States voted to consecrate this nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The consecration will take place in 2026 to celebrate America's semiquincentennial, that is, the two hundred and fiftieth anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. What does this mean? Why consecrate the nation to the Sacred Heart?

Devotion to the Sacred Heart has developed over the centuries following the experiences of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque and the apparitions she witnessed in the seventeenth century. Popes have lauded the practice of consecration of the self, home, and even whole nations to the Sacred Heart.¹ In his encyclical instituting the Solemnity of Christ the King, Pope Pius XI, drawing on the teaching of Pope Leo XIII,² commended the "pious custom" of consecrating the nation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus as a way to recognize the kingship of Christ.³ By celebrating this important national anniversary with this devotion, we have the opportunity to encourage all Catholics to honor our Lord and to "infuse the spirit of the Gospel into various communities and departments of life."⁴
