

# **PASTOR'S LETTER**



# SAINT BONAVENTURE, BISHOP AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

On July 15, we celebrate Saint Bonaventure, bishop and doctor of the Church. The only thing we know about this illustrious son of Saint Francis of Assisi, regarding his early life, is that he was born in Bagnorea, near Viterbo, in 1221 to John Fidanza and Maria Ritella, After taking the habit in the Seraphic Order, he studied at the University of Paris under the direction of the English master Alexander de Hales. Bonaventure, whom history would later call "the Seraphic Doctor," taught theology and Sacred Scripture at the University of Paris from 1248 to 1257. He combined his penetrating genius with a very balanced judgment, which allowed him to go to the heart of the issues and set aside all that was superfluous to discern all that was essential and expose the sophistries of erroneous opinions. It is not surprising, then, that the saint distinguished himself in scholastic philosophy and theology.

Bonaventure offered all his studies to the glory of God and his own sanctification, never confusing the end with the means and never allowing his work to degenerate into dissipation and vain curiosity. After taking the habit in the Seraphic Order, he studied at the University of Paris and taught theology and Sacred Scripture there. The saint distinguished himself in scholastic philosophy and theology. He saw in himself only faults and imperfections and, out of humility, sometimes abstained from receiving communion, even though his soul yearned to approach the source of grace. But a miracle of God allowed Saint Bonaventure to overcome such scruples. During his years in Paris, he composed one of his best-known works, the "Commentary on the Sentences of Peter Lombard," which constitutes a veritable collection of scholastic theology. William of Saint Amour made a direct attack on Saint Bonaventure in his work entitled "The Dangers of the End Times." An attack that the saint responded to with a treatise on evangelical poverty, entitled "On the Poverty of Christ." In 1257, Saint Bonaventure and Saint Thomas Aquinas jointly received the title of doctor.

Saint Bonaventure wrote a treatise "On the Life of Perfection," intended for Blessed Elizabeth, sister of Saint Louis of France, and the Poor Clares of the convent title of "Seraphic Doctor" for the of Longchamps. Other major works of his are the "Soliloquy" and the treatise "On the Threefold Way." In 1257, Bonaventure was elected Superior General of the Friars Minor. He was not yet 36 years old, and the order was torn between those who preached inflexible severity and those who called for a relaxation of the original rule. The young Superior General wrote a letter to all the

provincials demanding perfect observance of the rule and the reform of those who had relaxed it. The first of the five general chapters presided over by Saint Bonaventure met in Narbonne in 1260. There, he presented a series of declarations of the rules, which were adopted and exerted a great influence on the life of order. Saint Bonaventure began writing about the life of Saint Francis of Assisi.

The saint governed the Order of St. Francis for 17 years and is therefore called its second founder. In 1265, Pope Clement IV attempted to appoint St. Bonaventure Archbishop of York upon the death of Geoffrey of Ludham, but the saint successfully dissuaded the Pontiff. However, the following year, Blessed Gregory X appointed him Cardinal Bishop of Alban, ordering him to accept the office out of obedience. He was entrusted with the preparation of matters to be discussed at the Ecumenical Council of Lyons concerning the union of the Greek Orthodox. The most distinguished theologians of the Church attended this Council. As is known, Saint Thomas Aguinas died while addressing it. Saint Bonaventure was undoubtedly the most notable figure at the assembly. He arrived in Lyon with the Pope several months before the opening of the Council. Between the second and third sessions, he met the general chapter of his order and resigned from the office of superior general. When the Greek delegates arrived, the saint began talks with them, and union with Rome was achieved. In thanksgiving, the Pope sang Mass on the feast day of Saints Peter and Paul. The Epistle, the Gospel, and the Creed were sung in Latin and Greek, and Saint Bonaventure preached at the ceremony.

Saint Bonaventure was characterized by simplicity, humility, and charity. He deserved the title of "Seraphic Doctor" for the angelic virtues that enhanced his learning. And even if he had not belonged to the Seraphic Order, he would have deserved the angelic virtues that enhanced his learning. He was canonized in 1482 and declared a Doctor of the Church in 1588.

# ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

On July 14th, we celebrate the feast of the "Lily of the Mohawks." St. Kateri Tekakwitha is the first Native American woman to be canonized. Orphaned by a smallpox outbreak, Kateri survived with severe scarring and impaired eyesight. Despite tragedy, she was a devout girl at a young age, often building crosses from sticks in the woods. When she was 18, she began secret instruction in the Catholic faith with French missionaries. Her commitment to Christianity and vow of virginity was misunderstood and ridiculed by her fellow villagers. She escaped to a nearby mission, where she attended daily Mass, taught the children, and cared for the sick and the elderly. Sometimes the greatest misunderstandings can come from those closest to us. Like St. Kateri, God invites us to be faithful to our commitments of faith and to always respond in love.


As part of SVDP's annual Friends of the Poor walk event we have created another way for you to support the event that doesn't involve walking. How about eating instead!!



### What is a Benedictine Oblate?




