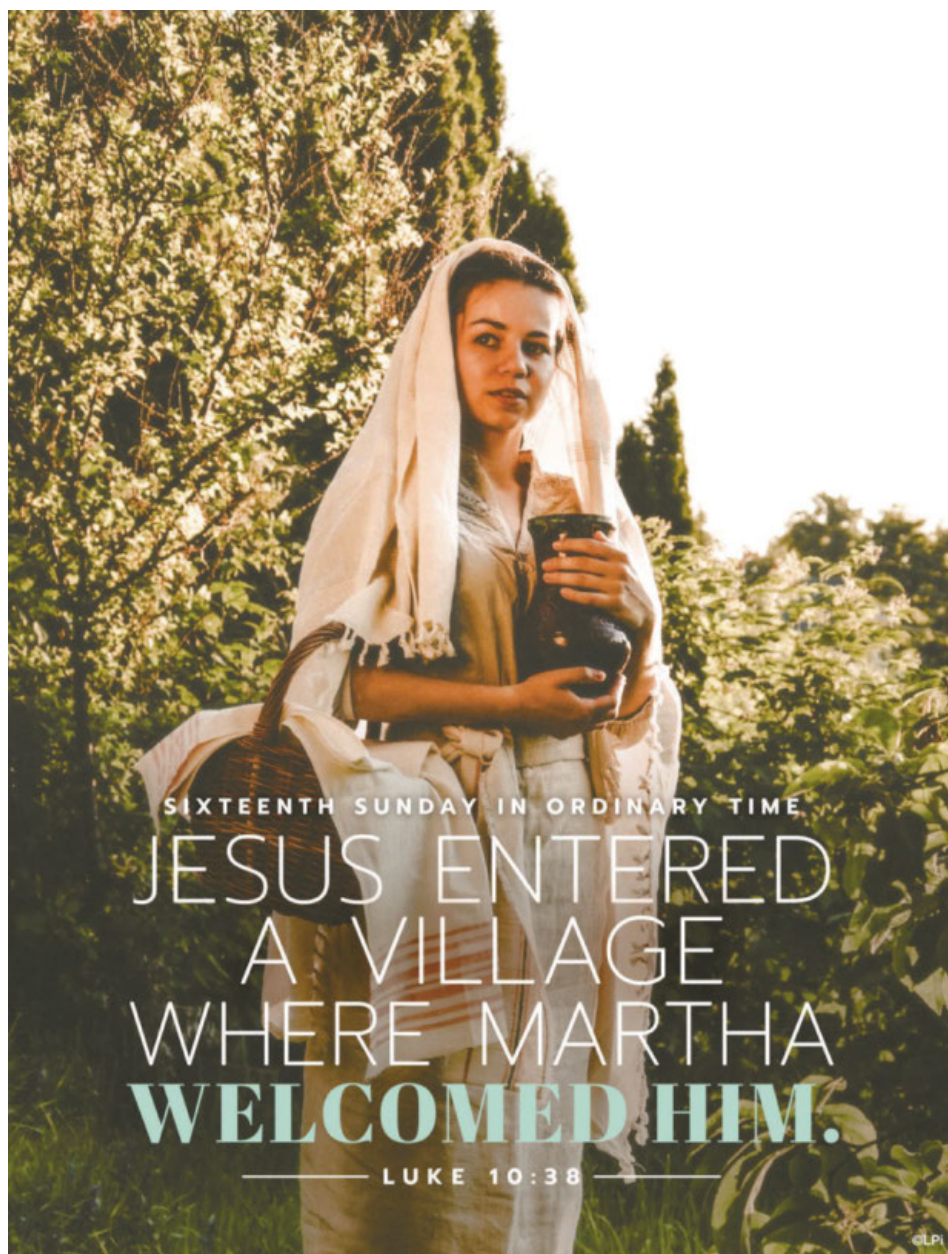

PASTOR'S LETTER

JAMES THE GREATER, APOSTLE

On July 25th, we celebrate St. James the Apostle. The name James comes from two words, Sant Iacob, because his name in Hebrew was Jacob. The Spaniards in their battles shouted: "Sant Iacob, help us." And by repeating these two words so often, they joined them together to form one: James. He was the brother of Saint John the Evangelist. He was called the Greater, to distinguish him from the other apostle, James the Lesser, who was younger than him. With his parents Zebedee and Salome, he lived in the city of Bethsaida, by the Sea of Galilee, where they ran a small fishing business. They had workers in their employ, and their financial situation was quite good, allowing them to be absent from work for several weeks, as their brother John did when he went to spend some time on the Jordan River listening to John the Baptist. James was part of Jesus's group of three favorites, along with his brother John and Simon Peter. He witnessed all of Christ's great miracles, and with Peter and John, he was the only one present at the Transfiguration of the Lord and at His Prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Why did Jesus prefer him so much? Perhaps because (as Saint John Chrysostom says) he was the boldest and bravest in declaring himself a friend and follower of the Redeemer, or because he was going to be the first to shed his blood for proclaiming his faith in Jesus Christ. The Holy Gospel tells of a time when passing through a village in Samaria, the people refused to give them any food, and James and John asked Jesus to rain fire from heaven and burn those rude people. Christ had to scold them for this vengeful spirit, reminding them that He had not come to harm anyone but to save as many people as possible. Another day, James and John commissioned their mother, Salome, to ask Jesus to place them two in the first places on the day of his glory: one on the right and one on the left. The other apostles were upset by this vain request from the two sons of Zebedee, but Jesus told them all: "Whoever wants to be first must be the servant of all, in imitation of the Son of Man, who came not to be served but to serve." Surely, with this lesson from Jesus, James must have learned to be more humble.

After Jesus' Ascension, James the Greater distinguished himself as one of the leading figures among the group of Apostles. That's why, when King Herod Agrippa set out to wipe out the followers of Christ, the first thing he did was order the beheading of James and the imprisonment of Peter. Thus, the son of Zebedee had the honor of being the first of the apostles

to shed his blood proclaiming the religion of the Risen Jesus. Ancient traditions (from the 6th century) say that James even went as far as Spain to evangelize. And since the 9th century, it is believed that his body is in the cathedral of Compostela. Historian Pérez de Urbel says that what is in Santiago de Compostela are relics, or the remains of the Apostle, that were brought there from Palestine. According to tradition, in 831, after a prodigious luminous phenomenon near Mount Liberón, a tomb was discovered with the inscription: "Here lies Jacobus, son of Zebedee and Salome." The place was called Campus Stellae ("field of the star"), from which the city of Santiago de Compostela would later derive. He is the patron saint of Spain and its cavalry. With an impetuous character, he and his brother were called by Jesus himself the "son of thunder." The apostle also witnessed Jesus' agony in the Garden of Gethsemane: "He took with him Peter, James, and John," as the Gospel of Mark recalls, "and began to feel fear and anguish."

In 1075, construction began on the Basilica dedicated to the apostle, and since the Middle Ages, the Sanctuary has been a destination for pilgrims, first from all over Europe and now from all over the world. The Way of St. James is one of the most important routes in the history of Christianity. Let us keep in mind the words of Pope Benedict XVI: "Therefore, we can learn much from James: readiness to accept the Lord's call even when he asks us to leave the 'boat' of our human certainties, enthusiasm to follow him on the paths he shows us above all our own deceptive presumption, willingness to bear witness to him with courage, if necessary, even to the supreme sacrifice of life."

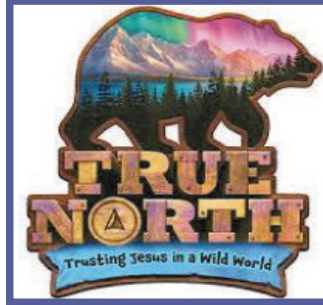
