PASTOR'S LETTER



SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

The remaining 11 apostles returned to Jerusalem after Jesus' Ascension into Heaven. Acts 1:14 states: "All of them persevered with one accord in prayer, together with some women, and with Mary, the mother of Jesus, and his brothers." During this time, the Apostles chose a replacement for Judas Iscariot. They cast lots between two men, and the lot fell upon Matthias. After nine days of prayer, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples. They heard a sound like a "mighty wind," and "tongues as of fire" rested upon their heads. Stepping forward, Peter addressed the crowd that had gathered. Although just a few weeks earlier he had denied Christ three times, Peter boldly proclaimed the Gospel. That day, three thousand people believed in Christ and were received into His Church. Saint Luke describes the scene of the descent of the Holy Spirit as "the day Pentecost arrived" (Acts 2:1). This fiftieth day (*pentekoste*) was, for Israel, a spring harvest festival that concluded the days of celebration following Passover. It was also a celebration of the giving of the Law on Mount Sinai. Thus, for Christians, it becomes the moment in which Christ—having returned to the glory of the Father—becomes present in the human heart through the Spirit: a law given by God and written upon hearts. As Pope Francis stated in his General Audience on June 19, 2019: "The new and definitive Covenant is no longer founded on a law written on stone tablets, but on the action of the Spirit of God, who makes all things new and is inscribed upon hearts of flesh." From Pentecost onward, the Church begins and launches itself into its evangelizing mission. The Catechism of the Catholic Church (paragraphs 731-732) states: On the day of Pentecost, when the seven weeks of Easter had come to an end, Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given, and communicated as a divine person: from his fullness, Christ the Lord pours out the Spirit in abundance. On that day, the Most Holy Trinity is fully revealed. From that day on, the Kingdom proclaimed by Christ is open to those who believe in him: in the humility of the flesh and in faith, they already share in the communion of the Most Holy Trinity. In the first half of the third century, Tertullian and Origen were already speaking of Pentecost as a feast that followed that of the Ascension. In the fourth century, Pentecost was commonly celebrated in Jerusalem—as the pilgrim Egeria recounts—and presented the theme of

the renewal that the coming of the Spirit had brought about in the hearts of men. Pentecost is considered the birth of the Church, for it was on this day that the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles and filled them with the gifts they needed to guide the Church. This event took place after Jesus ascended into heaven and promised to send the Advocate. According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, Pentecost inaugurated the "time of the Church," during which Christ manifests, makes present, and communicates his work of salvation through the Liturgy of his Church, "until he comes." During this time of the Church, Christ lives and acts in his Church and with her in a new way—one proper to this new time. He acts through the sacraments; this is what the common Tradition of East and West calls "the sacramental economy"; it consists in the communication (or "dispensation") of the fruits of Christ's Paschal Mystery in the celebration of the Church's "sacramental" liturgy (No. 1076). In the Sacrament of Confirmation, we are sealed with the Holy Spirit and receive from him the seven gifts that help us live out our baptismal promises. These supernatural gifts will increase our strength as we deepen our prayer life and grow in virtue. The Church—a living communion in the faith of the Apostles, which she transmits—is the place where we come to know the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Most Holy Trinity. God the Father is the First Person, and God the Son (Jesus) is the Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity. According to the Catechism, paragraph 691 states: "Holy Spirit" is the proper name of the One whom we adore and glorify with the Father and the Son. The Church has received this name from the Lord and professes it in the baptism of her new children (Mt 28:19). The term "Spirit" translates the Hebrew word *ruah*, which, in its primary sense, means breath, air, or wind. Indeed, Jesus uses the sensory image of the wind to suggest to Nicodemus the transcendent newness of the One who is personally the breath of God—the divine Spirit (Jn 3:5-8). On the other hand, "Spirit" and "Holy" are divine attributes common to all three divine persons. By joining these two terms, Scripture, liturgy, and theological language designate the inexpressible person of the Holy Spirit, without any possible ambiguity regarding other uses of the terms "spirit" and "holy."

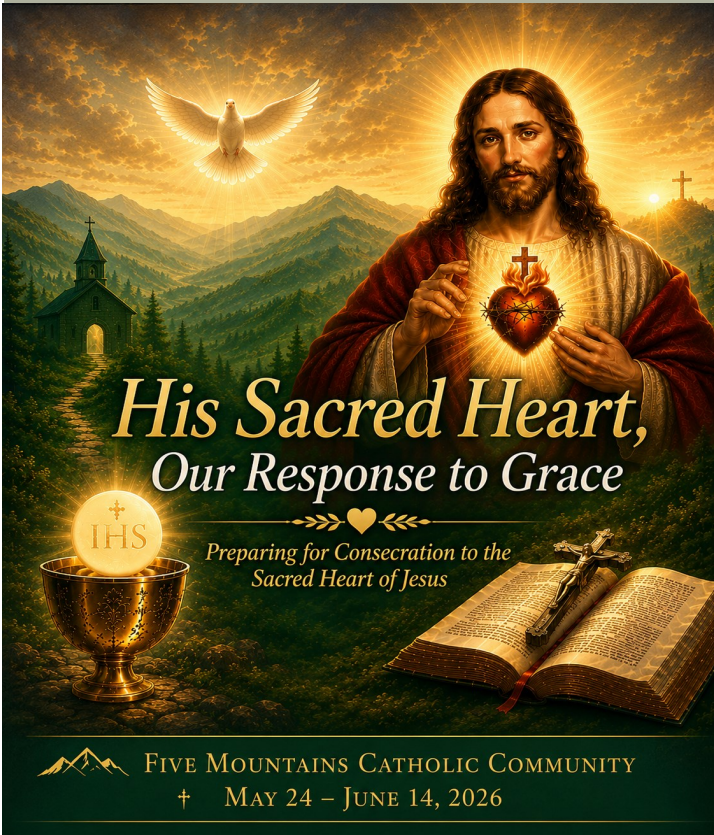

WEEK 1 — MAY 24, 2026 “Learn from Me, for I Am Gentle and Humble of Heart”

Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves.”
— *Matthew 11:29*

The Sacred Heart of Jesus reveals the depth of God’s mercy and love. As we begin preparing for Consecration to the Sacred Heart, we are invited not only to admire His Heart, but to become more like Him.

Consecration means placing our lives into the loving care of Christ and allowing His Heart to shape our hearts.

One of the clearest ways we imitate Jesus is through the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. Jesus fed the hungry, comforted the sorrowful, healed the sick, forgave sinners, and welcomed the forgotten.

Mercy is love in action. As disciples, we are called to bring that same mercy into our homes, parish, and community.

Reflection

The world often teaches us to protect ourselves first. The Sacred Heart teaches us something different, to love with compassion, humility, patience, and generosity.

Every act of mercy opens our hearts more deeply to Jesus.

When we forgive, Christ’s mercy becomes visible.
When we comfort others, Christ comforts through us.
When we serve with love, the Heart of Jesus is revealed.

Consecration is not only a prayer we say once; it is a daily way of living.

Ponder

How has Jesus shown mercy to me?
Which Work of Mercy challenges me most?
How is Jesus inviting me to love more deeply?

Guided Prayer

Sacred Heart of Jesus,
gentle and humble of heart,
teach me to love as You love.
Help me become an instrument of Your mercy in my family, parish, and community.
Consecrate my heart to Yours,
so that my life may reflect Your compassion and love.
Amen.

Practice for the Week

Choose one Corporal Work of Mercy and one Spiritual Work of Mercy to intentionally practice this week.

Examples:

- Visit or call someone who is lonely.
- Donate food or clothing to someone in need.
- Pray for someone who has hurt you.
- Encourage someone who is discouraged.

Let each act become a prayer flowing from the Heart of Jesus.

set our hearts on fire with Your love.
Free us from selfishness and indifference.
