



# DIOCESE OF VENICE IN FLORIDA

July 10, 2025

Dear Monsignor/Father,

Greetings in the Lord, Jesus Christ. With this letter, I wish to address recent news concerning Churches and political endorsements.

As you are likely aware, the IRS recently issued an interpretation of the Johnson Amendment that would allow religious organizations to endorse candidates. Please know that the Church's stance on this matter has not changed, and there should be no endorsement of political candidates or of a particular party. On this matter, a statement from the USCCB may be found enclosed herewith.

Please know that this policy is not intended to be disrespectful of your individual political views. However, these views are your personal views, while that which is proclaimed from the pulpit and the altar cannot be solely the view of the Priest and must reflect the whole Church. While all are familiar with how sensitive and divisive these issues can be, the Priest is called to be pastoral to all. Your understanding and assistance in avoiding endorsements are appreciated, as are your efforts to form the consciences of the Faithful.

I take this opportunity to extend to you the assurances of my continued consideration, as well as my prayers for you and your ministry.

## WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND ELDERLY

In 2021, Pope Francis established the celebration of the World Day for Grandparents and Elderly on the fourth Sunday of July, near the liturgical memorial of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus (July 26). The theme for the 2025 celebration selected by the pope is "Blessed are those who have not lost hope" (cf. Sir 14:2). "These words, taken from the Book of Sirach, express the blessedness of the elderly and highlight the hope placed in the Lord as the path to a Christian and reconciled old age.

'In this Jubilee Year, the *World Day* – established by Pope Francis in 2021 – aims to be an opportunity to reflect on how the presence of grandparents and the elderly is a sign of hope in every family and ecclesial community" (Kevin Card. Farrell).

The U.S. bishops have approved the transfer of the celebration of World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly in the U.S. to the first weekend after Labor Day (September 6 and 7, 2025) to coincide with National Grandparents (and the Elderly) Day in the United States as many local communities, schools, and parishes have celebrated for some time.

In July in the United States, the observance of Natural Family Planning Week takes place beginning on the Sunday before July 25 and ending on the following Saturday.



We are in need of more volunteers to serve as Liturgical Ministers. Please help if you can. A Liturgical Minister is simply being involved with or assisting with the Mass. While the Priest is the presider and main guide for the movement of the liturgy, it is a community effort to complete the Mass, and to do so in a safe, dignified and reverent manner.

## ALTAR SERVERS

Altar Servers must have received First Communion to serve. These young people serve at weekend Masses, and other liturgical celebrations.

## LECTORS

Lectors proclaim the readings from the Scriptures during the celebration of the Mass and other liturgies, and read the pulpit announcements and prayers of the faithful.

## SACRISTANS

Sacristans are "humble servants" of Christ who serve by preparing the altar and sanctuary for Mass, and arranging and managing the liturgical books, sacred vessels, bread, and wine.

## **USHERS & GREETERS**

Ushers and greeters do much more than just seat people, take up the collection, stand watch in case of emergency, and greet people. They are the "Open Doors" to fellow worshipers, and hence serve as the face of the Church! They welcome each new arrival, make them feel at home, and point them towards Christ.



#### St. Catherine's Youth Group Ave Maria Conference







This summer, several of our youth had the unforgettable opportunity to attend the **Ave Maria Youth Conference** in Florida—a weekend filled with faith, friendship, and powerful encounters with Christ. Alongside **700 high school students** from across Florida, our teens experienced a vibrant atmosphere of praise and worship led by **Epic the Band**, heard dynamic talks from nationally known speakers like **Michael Gormley** and **Mari Pablo**, and most importantly, encountered the living God through the **Sacrament of Reconciliation**, **Eucharistic Adoration**, and the **celebration of the Holy Mass**.

From laughter and late-night conversations to moments of silent prayer and heartfelt confessions, this was a **beautiful and transformative experience** that won't soon be forgotten.

Here are testimonies from some of the students of our youth group that attended:

**Madeline Domisiw**: "This weekend I learned that God is the only one who could make your heart feel complete and that when you look at yourself in the mirror you are awesome because God made you."

**Ella Bruce**: "Something that I learned this weekend is that we are all worth something, that God made us the way he did for a reason. We are not worthless or a waste of space because God decided to put us into this world. I also

learned that we always need to have God at the center of any relationship, and that he is the only one that can complete us."

**Manuel Domisiw**: "The main thing that really stuck out to me this weekend was the talk about regretting the things that I didn't do. This talk personally stood out to me because before, I was too scared to do a lot of things such as roller coasters. Now I see that fear holds a person from being free, and if I am to be afraid, I know that I can just pray to Jesus or any of the saints to give me strength and courage. The other talks and events were also great.. Overall, this conference has strengthened my relationship with God and helped fix my mindset."

**Manuel Gomez-Diaz**: "A message that really stuck out to me was being a man includes being a sacrifice. Jesus is an example of this being the sacrificial lamb for the world and we can also follow saints who mirror Jesus like characteristics. Sacrificing means laying down your life for others which can mean putting others before you. This stands out in marriage or any relationship and being a steward to others. Another role model is St. Joseph who protected Jesus at birth and provided for his holy family by being a carpenter."
