#### In Defense of the American Dream

For many years the landscape surrounding immigration has loomed over and enshrouded the Sunshine State, a state heavily invested in labor provided by immigrants. As the climate surrounding the hot topic cannot be ignored, the Sunshine State should not solely be known for monikers such as Alligator Alcatraz and Deportation Depot. And Florida's bishops agree upholding human dignity is paramount when discussing the complicated issue.

"Because they are looking for a future of hope they still believe in the American dream." Florida Catholic Media videographer Andres Rozo interviewed both Bishop Frank J. Dewane of Venice and Archbishop Thomas Wenski of Miami on the topic of immigration, especially on the topic of deportation. The migrant detention facility, known as Alligator Alcatraz for its deliberate placement within the inhospitable environment of Florida's Everglades, is located on the cusp of both the Diocese of Venice and the Archdiocese of Miami.

"Our immigration program has been broken for decades," Archbishop Wenski said. "It's not so much that people are breaking the law, but the law is breaking people." "(The country) is not targeting this correctly," Bishop Dewane said. "It's not humane. And there's nothing proportional about what's happening here."

The bishops of the United States have called for comprehensive immigration reform for decades and Archbishop Wenski reiterated that the responsibility "has to be laid at the doors of Congress because Congress makes the laws and if laws are inadequate then Congress should change address those inadequacies and reform the laws." Relying on an "enforcement-only approach" — such as detention facilities that solely focus on deportation — is not the basis of is not the "optimal approach to address immigration crisis," the archbishop said. And rhetoric in which people are referred to as "illegal," strips those people of their inherent human dignity.

"I think we've missed a whole component of human dignity, and that used to be such a trademark of our country," Bishop Dewane said. "I don't grant anyone human dignity. God gave it to him. ... It's up to me and you and all of our listeners to recognize that in every person."

"They contribute to the economy, in many ways. First, they enter in the exchange of good. Now someone might say, 'Oh that's only tax, and we don't tax too much.' But To view the video on immigration, visit they (the immigrants) don't set up the structure, they enter into it," Bishop Dewane continued. "I'm not an economist, and I'm not trying to be. But I do speak out

on a moral platform and will continue to speak for the migrants here in this country."

Immigrants come to the United States seeking a better life that does not exist where they live. To them, the United States offers hope, and the archbishop said it is what makes them good workers who offer positive contributions to our society. "Because they're looking for a future of hope they still believe in the American dream,' he added.

The video comes at a time when other prelates are commenting on immigration as well. In his bimonthly column, Bishop John Noonan of Orlando wrote that Scripture notes God does not reserve his love for certain people. And the apostles of before and of today are anointed to do the same.

"Today, there are many things and events that unsettle the heart of God. For many years, we have spoken about immigrants, labeling them illegal aliens or aliens, the meaning of which describes someone unsuitable for this earth. Yet, as we read God's Word, we know that we are part of His Body, creating His dwelling place with one another for all time. When we begin to label people, we also begin to separate them from us. The one who is labeled becomes the outsider, unworthy of God's compassion and tenderness," Bishop Noonan wrote. "We are in communion with Christ for our neighbors, not just the ones whom we choose, but all people because God chooses all."

Alligator Alcatraz is being used as a model for other states to set up similar facilities. Florida Gov. Ron De-Santis announced plans to open a "Deportation Depot" at Bakersville Correctional Institution in North Florida - a facility located within the territory of the Diocese of St. Augustine. Days before that announcement, Bishop Erik Pohlmeier of St. Augustine released his second statement on immigration in 2025, urging Catholics to approach the issue through the lens of the Gospel.

"Many individuals held in detention are not hardened criminals. Some have legal protections, are awaiting hearings, or have come here seeking safety and a better life. They still deserve fair treatment, compassion, and due process under the law," Bishop Pohlmeier said. "Our starting point must be to see the person first, then work for just solutions that uphold both the common good and the sanctity of every life."


