NATIONAL MIGRATION WEEK

The Catholic Church in the United States will observe <u>National Migration Week</u> from September 22 to 28. This year, as the Universal Church marks its jubilee year, the World Day of Migrants and Refugees will be observed on October 4–5, coinciding with the <u>Jubilee of Migrants</u>.*

For 45 years, the U.S. Catholic Church has celebrated National Migration Week by reflecting on its history as an immigrant Church and the ways in which the country has been enriched by generations of immigrants, including the many Catholics who have adopted this land as their own. It is also an opportunity to grow in appreciation of the challenges faced by migrants and refugees, both in the United States and beyond, and to express solidarity through prayer, accompaniment, and advocacy. Pope Francis had chosen "Migrants, missionaries of hope" as the theme for this year's commemoration, underscoring a key hallmark of his pontificate and in recognition of the courage and resilience of migrants and refugees who bear daily witness to hope despite hardship.

The U.S. bishops have consistently <u>expressed solidarity</u> with immigrants amid the fear and anxiety prompted by current immigration enforcement efforts. The bishops have <u>called for, and continue to press for</u>, "a more humane system of immigration, one that protects our communities while safeguarding the dignity of all." This includes <u>encouraging bipartisan collaboration</u> among policymakers.

In his <u>message</u> for this year's World Day of Migrants and Refugees, Pope Leo XIV has continued to emphasize the dignity of migrants, saying, "In a world darkened by war and injustice, even when all seems lost, migrants and refugees stand as messengers of hope. Their courage and tenacity bear heroic testimony to a faith that sees beyond what our eyes can see and gives them the strength to defy death on the various contemporary migration routes."

National Migration Week invites Catholics across the country to reflect on how hope can shape and inform our collective response to migration. Catholic dioceses, parishes, schools, and organizations nationwide are encouraged to mark this observance with prayer services, educational programs, community outreach, and support for migration-related ministries. The <u>Justice for Immigrants website</u> offers a comprehensive 2025 National Migration Week toolkit, including resources to help communities prepare spiritually and pastorally.

*Typically, NMW culminates in the World Day of Migrants and Refugees on the last Sunday in September.

Grant to them an increase in spiritual gifts and grace, so they may be prepared for the tasks at hand.


Lead them not into temptation and protect them from the grasp of the evil one.

WHAT IS A ROSARY CONGRESS?

The Rosary Congress begins with the celebration of daily Mass and ends with Mass at the same time the next day. During these designated 24 hours, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for perpetual Adoration, and the five decades of the Rosary are prayed by the faithful every hour, on the hour.

This year's Rosary Congress theme, My soul magnifies the Lord (Lk. 1:46), is the beginning of the Blessed Virgin Mary's hymn of praise at the Visitation commonly known as the Magnificat. Mary, pregnant with the Incarnate Word of God, Jesus, is prompted by the inspired greeting of her cousin, Elizabeth, who is herself pregnant with a son, later to be known as John the Baptist, the "Forerunner of the Lord." This exultant joy of the Blessed Mother for the tremendous favor bestowed on her by the Triune God is an example to us as we meditate, through the Rosary, on the mysteries of Christ's life and the salvation He won for us!


RITE OF CHRISTIAN INTIATION OF ADULTS


