St. Bonaventure Girls' Secondary Vocational School Ngara, Tanzania

The Franciscan Sisters of St. Bernadette of Lourdes is a Diocesan Congregation of Sisters located in Diocese of Rulenge-Ngara in Tanzania. We are asking for your prayers and financial support for our project: St. Bonaventure Girls' Secondary Vocational School in Ngara, Tanzania. We started this initiative after many girls came to our Convent seeking refuge from abuse or early forced marriage due to poverty. Ngara, which borders Rwanda and Burundi, hosts many refugees who fled war and still live in camps. These communities face extreme poverty, food insecurity, poor sanitation, and frequent disease outbreaks.



Many girls come to the convent seeking our help to escape early marriage, often driven by families desperate to get dowries for survival. Moved by the urgent needs of these girls and guided by our mission and charisma to support the poor in our society, our sisters thought of building a boarding high school and vocational school. This school will provide education, vocational training, life skills in a safe environment for girls at risk in Ngara.

DRAWING NEW MAPS OF HOPE



Amid contemporary challenges to schools and universities — hyperdigitalization, social insecurity, and the crisis of relationships — a Catholic education should courageously teach the whole human person, Pope Leo XIV writes in a new apostolic letter.

In "Drawing New Maps of Hope." (https://www.vatican.va/content/leo-xiv/en/apost_letters/documents/20251027-disegnare-nuove-mappe.html) Leo reflects on the role of a Catholic education 60 years after the Oct. 28, 1965, proclamation of *Gravissimum Educationis*, the Second Vatican Council's declaration on Christian education.

"The Church celebrates a fruitful educational history but also faces the imperative to update its proposals in light of the signs of the times,"


the pope writes in the letter, on Oct. 28.

"We are aware of the difficulties: hyper-digitalization can fragment attention; the crisis of relationships can wound the psyche; social insecurity and inequalities can extinguish desire," he says. "Yet, it is precisely here that Catholic education can be a beacon: not a nostalgic refuge but a laboratory of discernment, pedagogical innovation, and prophetic witness."

In the eight-page document, the pontiff identifies three priorities for the educational community: cultivation of an interior life through space for silence, discernment, and dialogue with one's conscience and with God; formation in a wise use of technology and artificial intelligence that puts the human person first; and education in language that is peace-building, nonviolent, and open to others.

He also notes the importance of making Catholic education financially accessible.

"Where access to education remains a privilege, the Church must push open doors and invent new paths, because 'losing the poor' is equivalent to losing the school itself," he writes.



Dear Friends and Supporters of St. Catherine Catholic School,



Bishop Dewane celebrated the Mass with St. Catherine Catholic School on Tuesday, November 4, 2025. After the Mass, he spoke privately with our 8th graders in the chapel.

The 8th graders were able to ask him questions about anything. And they did a great job! The students asked him about his experience being called to the vocation of the priesthood. Then they asked how he became a bishop. The bishop talked about vocations and answering the call of God in their lives, whether they are called to religious life or married life. They asked about his favorite Bible verse and book, how many popes he met. He shared that he's met all popes since Pope St. John Paul II. He's even met St. Mother Theresa. One student even asked the bishop, if there was one thing

they could do as young people to make a difference in the world, and he said not to fall into moral relativism. If something is adherently wrong, it is wrong in every situation. He told them to always do what was right, no matter what. It's always a special treat to have Bishop celebrate the Mass with us.

Security Measures

We have solicited bids to harden the security at our School campuses. The preschool campus is very exposed and near the street, particularly Franklin St. The proposal is to replace the 3 ft. chain link fences with a 6 ft. high block wall as well as renovating building S300 to serve as the office/entry for the preschool. The renovation will also include replacing the large glass windows in the doors of the main campus with impact windows, fortifying the entry, and replacing the exterior glass doors with steel doors. The cost of this project will be around \$150,000. We will be starting a "Buy a Block" fundraiser in the next few weeks to pay for this unforeseen expense. In addition to this renovation, we need to expand our camera capabilities at the main campus. We currently have cameras in all interior spaces but few on the exterior. We have a proposal to add cameras similar to the ones recently installed at the preschool and are exploring funding options for this purchase.

Playground Equipment

The original playground equipment that came with the purchase of the Kenilworth Campus has reached the end of its useful life. The large playground had a piece break off and fall with a child on it. Fortunately, the student was not seriously injured.

We will be applying for grants as well as starting a fundraiser for the cost of replacing the playground equipment in the next few weeks as well. The cost of this project is approximately \$150,000.

Enrollment for the 2026-27 school year

We opened re-enrollment for existing families on November 1 this year. Families that re-enroll before December 31 receive a discounted registration fee. Reserve your child's seat early! Tuition will be increased for the 2026-27 school year; however, we will continue to provide substantial financial assistance to those in need.


