THE QUIET RETURN OF THE “OLD SELF”

Saint Paul describes the old way of living as “earthly,” centered on us and our desires, and he will go on to list attitudes like greed, anger, malice, and lies as part of that old wardrobe we are meant to take off. In our language today, we often speak about a way of living where everything, in the end, bends back toward my feelings, my needs, my image, my control.

Easter can be quietly swallowed up by that culture if we are not alert. We can treat today as a beautiful religious “event” and ask only: Did the liturgy move me? Did the music uplift me? Did I enjoy the family gathering, the food, the traditions? These are not bad questions, but they all begin from the same point: me.

The New Testament offers another picture. After meeting the Risen Christ, the disciples are not left circling around their own experience. Mary Magdalene is sent: “Go to my brothers and tell them.” Peter is sent to preach to the nations that “this man God raised on the third day” and that forgiveness of sins is offered through his name. The Resurrection moves them from self-preoccupation to mission. The center of gravity shifts from “my life” to “Christ, your life.”

So we must ask, gently but honestly: in the way I live, who is at the center? When I make decisions about my time, my money, my work, my relationships, whose voice carries the most weight—the voice of the Risen Lord, or the voice of my preferences and fears?

Signs that Easter is truly at work

How can we recognize that this Easter is more than a passing spiritual high? The Scriptures point to concrete signs.

First, there is a new freedom from fear. The apostles will go from hiding behind locked doors to standing in public squares, proclaiming that Jesus is Lord, even at the cost of their lives. They will still feel human fear, but they will no longer be ruled by it. When the Spirit of the risen Christ is at work in us, we begin—often very slowly—to step out of the “tombs” we have accepted: the tomb of bitterness, of cynicism, of “I can’t forgive,” of “I can’t change.” Courage is not the absence of fear; it is acting in trust despite fear because Christ is trustworthy.

Second, there is a new capacity to forgive. On Easter evening, Jesus stands before the very men who deserted and denied him, and his first words are, “Peace be with you.” He breathes the Holy Spirit on them and entrusts them with the ministry of forgiveness. Where his life is alive in us, we feel a growing desire—perhaps fragile and hesitant, but real—to stop nursing old injuries and to ask for grace to forgive. This does not mean forgetting or allowing abuse; it means letting Christ’s mercy have the last word, not the wound.

Third, there is a new desire to serve. Those who meet the Risen Christ are sent outward. They cannot keep the news to themselves. When Easter takes root in us, we find ourselves more attentive to others. We notice who is alone at the edge of the parish, who is struggling quietly in the family, who is burdened in our workplace. And we feel a gentle nudge to move toward them—not to fix everything, but to share Christ’s presence with a word, a visit, a hidden act of generosity.

None of these signs will be perfect in us. They grow like seeds. But their very presence, however small, is evidence that “Christ, your life” is already at work.

From feeling to decision

Easter joy is a gift. The Alleluia, the light, the flowers, the Gloria returning after Lent—all of this is meant to lift our hearts. But if the Resurrection remains only a feeling, it will fade quickly as the pressures of ordinary life return.

So perhaps today, before the day ends, make one simple Easter decision in Christ’s presence. For example:

- “Lord, each morning this week I will take five minutes to read the Resurrection Gospel before anything else.”
- “Lord, today I will reach out to one person I have been avoiding in my family or parish.”

“Lord, I will go to confession this Easter season and entrust to you what still feels dead in me.”

Then ask the Holy Spirit—who raised Jesus from the dead—to be the strength behind that decision.

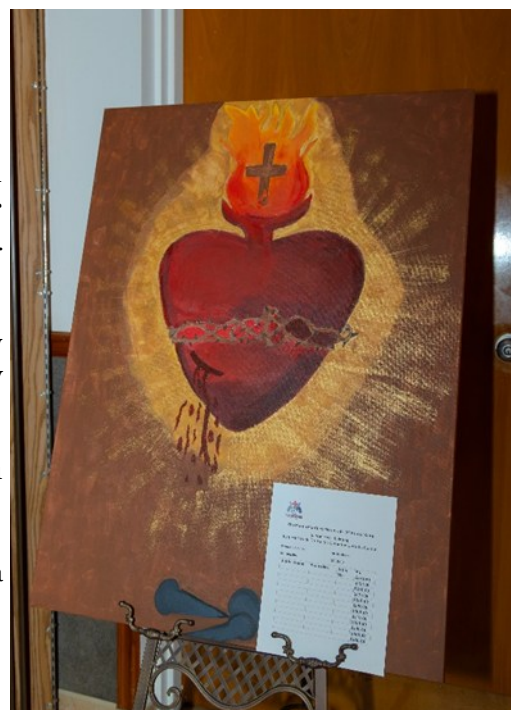

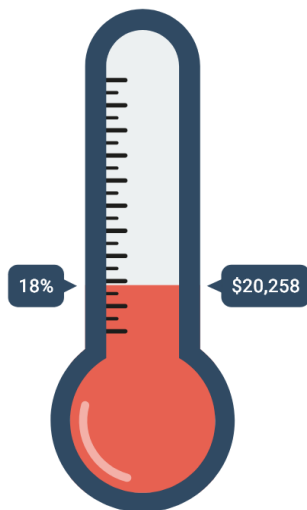
