From Self-Centeredness to Christ

In this Sunday's Gospel, Peter loves Jesus, yet he cannot accept a Messiah who suffers. "God forbid, Lord!" he says. Peter's concern is not evil, but it is still shaped by a human way of thinking: he wants Christ's mission to fit his own expectations. We all have the tendency to make the self—my comfort, my image, my preferences, my wounds, or my control—the center of everything. It can appear quietly: needing to be right, refusing correction, resenting another person's blessings, or treating relationships mainly as a source of affirmation. Jesus firmly redirects Peter: "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

The Way of Freedom

Jesus does not ask us to despise ourselves. Rather, he calls us to be freed from the false self that must always be admired, protected, served, and in control. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." This is not a path of humiliation; it is the path toward genuine love, humility, and spiritual freedom.

To deny yourself in the Gospels means to renounce the self as the ultimate authority in one's life and to place Christ first. It is not self-hatred or the rejection of one's God-given dignity; it is the free surrender of selfishness, sin, pride, and self-will so that one may live in faithful love.

Jesus' invitation

Jesus says: "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." Luke adds the word daily, showing that this is not a single heroic moment but a repeated choice of discipleship.

The call follows Jesus' prediction of his Passion. Thus, self-denial is inseparable from following the crucified Lord: accepting the cost of truth, fidelity, forgiveness, service, and love when they conflict with comfort, reputation, control, or personal preference.

What it does mean

- Renouncing sin: Saying no to impulses and habits that draw us away from God and neighbor.
- Surrendering self-will: Asking not merely, "What do I want?" but "Lord, what do you ask of me?"
- Accepting the cross: Bearing unavoidable suffering with Christ rather than allowing suffering to make the heart bitter or closed.
- Choosing sacrificial love: Giving time, attention, forgiveness, and practical care without needing admiration or repayment.
- Living for the Gospel: Jesus links "losing" one's life for him with truly saving it; self-centered existence ultimately diminishes the person, while self-gift in Christ brings fullness of life.

What it does not mean

- Denying oneself does not mean permitting abuse, neglecting legitimate health needs, denying one's emotions, or pretending that one has no worth. Christian self-denial is ordered toward authentic life and charity, not toward destruction of the person Christ loves and redeems.
- A helpful distinction is this: we do not deny the true self God created; we deny the false self that insists, "My comfort, my image, my grievance, and my control must come first." The Gospel's invitation is to let Christ—not the ego—occupy the center.

A daily practice

- Before a difficult conversation, decision, or irritation, one might pray: "Jesus, free me from the need to win, to be praised, or to control. Teach me to choose truth with charity, humility with courage, and love over self-preoccupation."
- In this sense, self-denial is not mainly about giving up small pleasures, though fasting can train the heart. It is about belonging so completely to Christ that his will, his truth, and his love shape our choices each day.

A Gentle Examination

This week, we might prayerfully ask:

- Do I listen in order to understand, or mainly to prepare my response?
- Do I receive correction with humility, or become defensive?
- Do I seek recognition more than I seek to serve?
- Have I made my own comfort or preferences more important than another person's needs?
- Can I rejoice sincerely when someone else is honored or succeeds?

In his August 16 article in the **Highlands News-Sun**, David Dunn-Rankin offered a sobering reflection on the lack of civic engagement among Floridians. His concern challenges us not only as citizens, but also as Catholics and parishioners.

Civic engagement involves more than voting. It means staying informed, volunteering, supporting institutions that serve the common good, and accepting personal responsibility for the well-being of our neighbors. The same principle applies within the Church.

St. Catherine Catholic School is not a separate organization that merely carries a parish name. It is one of the church's most important ministries—a work of evangelization that helps parents form children intellectually, morally, and spiritually. Therefore, the school belongs to the entire church, not only to families with children currently enrolled.

Catholics do not support church ministries only when they benefit personally. Young adults sustain ministries for seniors. Healthy parishioners assist the sick. Those who are financially secure help families in need. Likewise, parishioners whose children are grown—or who have never had children in the school—share responsibility for Catholic education.

The Church reminds the faithful of their obligation to provide for the Church's worship, charitable works, and apostolates. Catholic education is one of those apostolates. Financial support helps compensate dedicated teachers, maintain safe facilities, provide instructional materials, and keep a Catholic education accessible to families who could not otherwise afford it. A recurring gift, support for the Guardian Angel program, participation in fundraisers, or a legacy gift can make a lasting difference.

The school also needs parishioners' time and talents. Retired educators can tutor. Business owners and professionals can mentor students. Musicians, artists, tradespeople, and members of parish organizations can share their gifts. Everyone can pray, attend school events, encourage teachers, recommend the school to families, and speak positively about its mission.

Our Classical Catholic Education program seeks to form young people who recognize truth, appreciate beauty, choose goodness, and serve others courageously. These students will become tomorrow's parents, parish leaders, teachers, business owners, volunteers, and citizens.

If we are concerned about declining civic engagement, we must support the institutions that form responsible citizens. Not everyone can contribute in the same way, but everyone can do something. Supporting St. Catherine Catholic School through prayer, service, advocacy, and financial sacrifice is not someone else's responsibility. It is our shared mission and an enduring investment in the future of our Church and community.

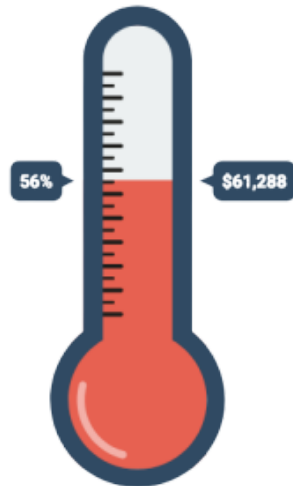
