Jesus' baptism is an act of radical self-emptying: the sinless Son places himself among sinners, accepts a rite he does not need, and publicly submits to the Father's will for the sake of our salvation. It reveals humility, solidarity, and mission, not self-focus, self-promotion, or grasping at status.

What John's baptism meant

John's baptism was explicitly "a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins," meant for people confessing their guilt and seeking conversion. Jesus, however, is without sin and does not need repentance, which is why the tradition stresses that "Jesus did not need to be baptized as did the Israelites who came to John as a confession of their sins."

Because he is sinless, Jesus' choice to undergo a sinner's baptism cannot be self-serving; he gains nothing he lacks. Instead, the act only makes sense as self-gift on behalf of others.

Solidarity, not self-promotion

Catholic theology emphasizes that in the Jordan Jesus "chose to join the ranks of sinners" and be "numbered among them," though he is the Holy One without sin. This is described as an act of **solidarity**: he places himself with those in need of forgiveness, to draw them into communion with God.

Rather than seeking to stand apart from others as superior, Jesus deliberately stands with the guilty, foreshadowing how he will later bear the sins of humanity on the cross. Jesus moves toward the weak and identifies with them.

Humility and kenosis

The Catechism presents Jesus' baptism as his "acceptance and inauguration of his mission as God's suffering Servant," an anticipatory sign of his coming passion and death. By going down into the water, he symbolically "loads all mankind's guilt upon his shoulders" and carries it into the depths, anticipating the descent of his death and the rising of his resurrection.

This is a concrete expression of kenosis: the Son who is publicly proclaimed "my beloved Son" chooses the path of humiliation and service, not self-exaltation. Christ uses his divine Sonship to stoop down and save.

Obedience to the Father


When John hesitates, Jesus answers, "Let it be so now; for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness," pointing to obedience to the Father's saving plan rather than to a personal need. "Fulfilling all righteousness" means freely aligning his human will with the Father's design to justify sinners, even when it involves misunderstanding and humiliation.

Narcissism resists any path that involves self-emptying obedience; Jesus' baptism manifests loving submission to the Father's will for the sake of others.

Manifestation for our sake

The Jordan event is also an epiphany: the Spirit descends like a dove and the Father's voice declares Jesus the beloved Son, revealing him publicly as Messiah and Son of God. This manifestation is not Jesus grasping at honor, but the Father's free confirmation that the one who lowers himself among sinners is precisely the Son in whom he is "well pleased."

Thus, the whole scene teaches that divine glory is revealed in humble, self-giving love, not in self-assertion—and Christian baptism will conform believers to that same pattern of dying to self and living for God and others.

Dear Friends and Families of St. Catherine Catholic School,

We need your help. We have three sets of playground equipment at the main campus for varying age groups. Two of the sets were existing when the building was purchased and are estimated to be 15-20 years old. The 3rd and smallest set was moved from the preschool to the main campus and is estimated to be 10-15 years old. The main playground set has rusted completely through and is no longer useable. I expect the 2nd set isn't far behind. There was never a budget set aside to replace this equipment, so we find ourselves with the main playground closed while we monitor the others.

Elementary school playground equipment offers numerous evidence-based benefits for children's holistic development, supporting physical health, social skills, emotional well-being, and cognitive growth during a critical stage of childhood.

Playground activities like climbing, swinging, sliding, and running promote moderate-to-vigorous physical activity, essential for building gross and fine motor skills, strength, balance, coordination, and cardiovascular health. Equipment enhances upper-body strength, grip, and agility, while active play helps combat childhood obesity by improving heart rate, muscle development, and overall fitness. Studies show that well-designed playgrounds encourage more movement, with children spending significant recess time in active play, contributing to daily physical activity recommendations.

Playgrounds foster unstructured social interaction and help children practice cooperation. Outdoor play also reduces stress, improves mood, and supports mental health by providing a break from structured classroom settings. Activities like navigating climbers or creating games enhance brain development, focus, and even academic performance, as physical activity readies the brain for learning. Research links active recess to improved concentration and cognitive skills in areas like planning and strategy.

We have received several proposals to replace the current playground equipment and the cost for all three is about \$150,000. Again, there has never been a budget set aside to replace this equipment, so we are asking for your help. 
