
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Brigid, Goddess of Many Worlds

Christian Nationalism has become a prominent topic in American discourse, raising deep concerns about its impact on the nation's foundational values. At its core, Christian Nationalism is the belief that the United States is, or should be, a nation defined by Christian identity and governed by Christian principles. While faith has always played a role in American life, the rise of Christian Nationalism poses a direct challenge to the ideals of pluralism, democracy, and religious freedom that form the bedrock of this grand experiment that we call The United States of America

The United States was founded on the principle of separation of church and state, enshrined in the First Amendment. This separation ensures **that government** neither favors nor discriminates against any religion, allowing citizens of all faiths, OR NONE, to participate fully in public life. Christian Nationalism, by seeking to merge religious doctrine with governmental authority, undermines this foundational principle and threatens to erode the constitutional protections that guarantee liberty for all.

America's strength lies in its diversity. People from countless backgrounds, beliefs, and traditions have contributed to the nation's growth and resilience. Christian Nationalism, however, elevates one faith above all others, marginalizing religious minorities and those free from religion. This exclusionary mindset fosters division and undermines the inclusive spirit that has allowed America to thrive as a multicultural society. one cannot be as powerful as The United States, and be a xenophobic, theocratic, mess. And in this way, America is failing.

True patriotism is rooted in a commitment to the nation's ideals: liberty, justice, and equality. Christian Nationalism distorts patriotism by equating loyalty to the country with adherence to a specific religious identity. This conflation puts at risk the unity and mutual respect that are essential for a healthy democracy, and it alienates millions of Americans who do not share the same religious beliefs.

Ironically, Christian Nationalism also threatens the freedom of Christians themselves. Because which form of Christianity is allowed? There are myriad denominations, and not all of them are acceptable to the diminutive and insular MAGA version of Christianity. When government adopts a particular religious stance, it gains the power to dictate what is and is not acceptable within that faith. This undermines the autonomy of religious communities and sets a dangerous precedent for the future, where any faith could be privileged or suppressed by those in power.

Christian Nationalism stands in stark opposition to the values that make America unique. It challenges the principles of constitutional government, pluralism, religious liberty, and true patriotism. Defending the separation of church and state is not just about protecting minority rights, it is about preserving the very soul of the nation. America's greatness lies in its commitment to freedom and diversity, and these ideals must be safeguarded against any ideology that seeks to undermine them, at any and all costs.

Outside of witchy activities, I enjoy reading, painting, and cross-stitching. I hope to see y'all in Eleusis!





Dying to Know *with Diana*

Hey, Folks!

I am Diana Rowan, and I am back with another installment of "Dying to Know with Diana!" Since this month's edition of Panegyria is focused on the element of Earth, I thought I would touch on something that is gaining ground in the deathcare industry: green burial.

What exactly is "green burial"?

Simply put, it is a method of burying a body that is more environmentally friendly than a traditional burial.

Okay, but what constitutes a "traditional" burial?

Think about a mainstream, Western funeral that does not involve a cremation. There's an embalmed body that is placed inside a hermetically sealed casket that is then placed inside a vault, which is then buried under six feet of dirt.



A basic green burial eliminates part of the traditional burial process, or all of it. It depends upon the person dying and the choice of body disposition they make. Since these columns tend to be brief, I thought I would introduce some of the most common green burial types that specifically involve Earth.

Sorry, cremation fans! (Side Note: Cremation is not as environmentally friendly as one would think because of the carbon output of the cremation chambers. Also, cremation produces ash that plants cannot use. That means, unfortunately, you cannot naturally be turned into a tree after being cremated.)

As always, you will want to make sure the following burial methods are legal and available in your area. You can do this by checking local laws online and reaching out to funeral homes and cemeteries.

After-Life Pro Tip #1: Just because a burial method is legal in your area does not mean that all cemeteries will provide it.

They can set their own guidelines for mowing ease, historical preservation, etc. Make sure you call ahead.

The first method I wanted to discuss is the most accessible, "Natural Burial." It is simply being buried in the ground without embalming, a casket, or a vault. In most areas, it is not required to be embalmed (unless in very specific situations) or buried in a casket. You can simply be put into the Earth. Some people opt for a burial shroud made with natural cloth, much like how it is done in Islam. An accommodating cemetery may have a special area just for this purpose.

A method that is gaining traction and is legal in thirteen US states as of this publication is Natural Organic Reduction or "human composting." If you are familiar with typical garden composting, it is very similar to that. However, instead of being put in someone's backyard, you are taken to a facility, like Recompose in Seattle, Washington, and placed into a hexagonal container. There, your remains are cared for until the process is complete. Once fully composted, you can have your soil sent to wherever you would like. Perhaps a favorite garden?

(Composting is legal in Arizona, California, Colorado, Delaware, Georgia, Maine, Maryland, Minnesota, Nevada, New York, Oregon, Vermont, and Washington. Source: <http://orderofthegooddeath.com>.)

These are only two ways to have an environmentally friendly burial. You can also mix and match elements of a green burial with a traditional burial. You could have a casket that easily breaks down and nourishes the earth, or you could just skip embalming. The dangers embalming poses to the environment merits its own column.

The important thing is that you find a burial method that is right for you.

Alright, my lovelies!


This month, there are two new releases at the same time! Within this edition, let me introduce you to two projects that stand well on their own, but are poetic sisters in concept. The first book comes to us from a Poet named Diana Rowan, all the way in Nebraska. She had long known the call of our beloved Greek Goddess, Persephone. In fact, she'd attended Spring Mysteries Festival and became even more enveloped in the Goddess's message.

It was an honor to receive her request to publish a whole chapbook collection of her Persephone Poems titled **Eons**. Every page is haunting. When reading the poems, the lyricism whispers the refrain like echoes bouncing off deep cavern walls. It's chilling, but you're swept up in this sense of empathy that you can't look away. It's beautiful how Diana applies the well-known myth of Persephone, one who was taken against her will by Hades to the Underworld, as well as mixes in the new view of the Goddess's myth with a rebirth of the Self, and the independence of Spirit. In just a week after the release of her poetry collection, 'Eons' is now number eighty-eight on Amazon's list of New Age Goddesses, breaking into the top one hundred!



Now, let's marvel at the cover. Created by Amanda Dracars, it's a gorgeous, mirrored view of Persephone as the Goddess of Spring, gathering flowers on the earthly plane, contrasted to Persephone as the Queen of the Underworld. 

Goddess of Many Worlds

If there's one thing from my childhood that has stayed with me into my adult years it is this: I refuse to follow whatever is popular. So when I began studying witchcraft in 2015, I read books and saw numerous blog posts talking about Brigid around Imbolc and said to myself, "This is annoying. She can't be that important! There has to be other goddesses out there besides her." And although it's true there are many goddesses, it wasn't until I attended a workshop on Brigid at Summer Magick Festival in 2024 that I understood Brigid as the goddess of many faces and names. She is in all, and all is in her, just as the ATC sees Hekate in all realms, all gods coming from one; Brigid is another avatar of that concept. She is the overseer of the hearth and home, associated with flames and the bards. She is also seen as a goddess of poetry, smith-working, sacred wells, and protector of childbirth. So I'm here to share my personal research and experience with Brigid, the goddess of many talents. My sources are labeled as "A, B, C, D, and E," and listed on the next page.

Let's start with the home and hearth aspect: it's important to know about her earliest incarnations, "As Breo-Saighit, she was called the Flame of Ireland, Fiery Arrow. She was a Goddess of the forge as well, reflecting on her fire aspect. Legend says that when She was born, a tower of flame reached from the top of her head to the heavens. Her birth, which took place at sunrise, is rumored to have given the family house the appearance of being on fire." (A). The nickname "Fiery Arrow" I find interesting because there is a Norse god named Váli who is depicted as being an archer and celebrated as the return of light around Valentine's Day (thoughts for another time).



The fiery home imagery reminded me of reading *Baba Yaga's Book of Witchcraft* by Madame Pamita, where she discusses the symbolism behind Baba Yaga's hut and why it always has smoke and flame coming out of it. But it also reminded me, more obviously, of Hestia. Both she and Brigid are known to be sacred virgins, and both were in charge of eternal flames. Hestia had the Vestal Virgins to tend to the flame, while Brigid was also said to have priestesses in her shrine. However, once Brigid's shrine became Christianized and fell into Catholic conquest, a rumor spread that 19 nuns stayed at the shrine to keep a holy flame to Brigid's memory. As witches, we all know that fire is a transformative element. It can defend, but it can also take away, which sometimes leads to rebirth. Fire and flame are one of the greatest gifts to humanity, so it seems appropriate that a goddess of eternal flame would carry an amazing legacy.

Did you know that blacksmiths were sometimes considered sorcerers in the medieval period? Many people grew suspicious of their involvement in witchcraft if they made strong weapons. "Their ability to turn raw materials such as iron ore or bog iron into usable tools and weapons made them seem like they were in possession of magic. Because of their working with iron, which is almost universally thought of as warding off evil, it is believed to imbue the smith with special powers or the ability to see or defeat evil" (B).


Sometimes called "Brigid the Smith," or "Brigid of the Forge," I found that she being associated with blacksmiths comes from the gift of fire and learning to yield it in the creative process. And you know who else is associated with the block and anvil? Hephaestus. Both he and Brigid also share the power of creating life, and Brigid has been attributed as a saint or goddess who watches over childbirth, which is bringing a form to new life; just as Hephaestus has the ability to create life too, albeit they are golden handmaidens and robots in his mythology, but nonetheless both deities take charge of *forging* new life.

Just before I attended Summer Magick, I was looking into dedicating to a deity called Sulis-Minerva because at that point in my craft, I hadn't worked with Roman-British deities and I thought I kept seeing signs that pointed to her (springs, rivers, snakes, and more). But while listening to the presenter at the Brigid workshop, I thought of a connection between the wells of Brigid and the baths of Sulis-Minerva.

Sulis is a goddess of sacred waters who was worshipped in Britain, and although "Minervas" are mentioned in Celtic paganism as well, the name is mostly associated with the Roman equivalent of Athena. However, "In a Druidic ritual, Brigid is honored with a central well containing candles. It was common in olden times to dress the well with flowers and greenery. Often coins and other silver objects were offered to the well. Many of Brigid's Holy Wells still exist, some sacred to Her for thousands of years. Her waters were said to heal all manner of disease," (A) and, "After the Roman conquest of Gaul and Britain, Brigantia was equated with the Roman deity Minerva, as were other Celtic goddesses such as Sulis and Belisama. Academics refer to these goddesses as the "Celtic Minervas," and the Irish Brighid is often included in the Celtic Minerva family even though she was never directly equated to Minerva because the Romans never conquered Ireland," (D). Also mentioned in this blog post is how Brigid and Sulis have depictions of them carrying a gorgon's head, similar to the depictions of Medusa that archaeologists have found across Turkey, Crete, Cyprus, and more. When I originally wrote this piece on Brigid in May of 2025, I was in the middle of my dedication to working with Medusa, so coming across this piece of information was a divine coincidence! Just another sign from the gods that I was on the right path and finding the right clues.



But what makes Brigid and her connection to sacred waters so important in witchcraft is how water is seen not only as a purifier, but also as a representation of the chthonic. Brigid is the daughter of Dagda, the chief god of the Tuatha Dé Danann and god of life and death, and some lore says she was born of either the goddess Danu or Bóinn, both associated with rivers. In Wicca, we see water as the element of death and initiation. So, as Brigid is a holy, eternal flame of life, she can also be seen as the keeper of mysteries and guide of souls at her sacred waters.

The worldly associations with Brigid don't end here either. While my attraction to Celtic paganism and the stories of the Tuatha Dé Danann grew fonder, I stumbled across a post that talked about Brigid's association to a particular white animal that is also venerated in the Egyptian and Hindu pantheons: a cow. We see the Egyptian goddess Hathor and her many associations with cattle in statues and hieroglyphs in the pyramids, and Saraswati and Shakti are known to appear as white cows in Hindu iconography (although there is a solo white cow deity called Kamadhenu that is said to have been born out of the churning cosmic ocean, but that's for another think-piece).



In Irish folklore, Saint Brigid is closely linked to a white cow with red ears, a powerful emblem of abundance and nourishment. "According to legend, Brigid was nurtured on the milk of this sacred cow, which often accompanies her in stories and imagery, underscoring her connection to sustenance, fertility, and divine providence," (F) which we see a similar story in Norse mythology where the sacred cow Auðumbla nourishes the giant Ymir with her milk and she licked the ice until the first god, Buri, was revealed (shoutout to Priestx Solinox Silverstar and their Intro to Norse Mythology class at WSTS for this knowledge).

Just like how I made connections of Brigid to various pantheons and regions, I believe that sacred fire is one of the elements that connects all faiths and all religions. I bet you can study every Eastern and Western religion and find a prayer or ritual that involves flames and how it resonates between the human spirit and the deity they are evoking. Water would be next, but I'll write about that when the season comes.

And just like how every February we celebrate Imbolc and the return of the light, I believe it's important to remember the lore of Brigid and the goddesses and evolve them so that the generations after us can see the connections and keep the eternal flame of witchcraft alive.

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

Form & Substance

In Tropical Astrology, the signs are divided into four groups based on the elements: Earth, Air, Water, and Fire. These groups are also known as Triplicities because there are three Signs in each Elemental Group.

The Triplicities

Earth Signs: Capricorn, Taurus, Virgo

Air Signs: Libra, Aquarius, Gemini

Water Signs: Cancer, Scorpio, Pisces

Fire Signs: Aries, Leo, Sagittarius

This month, we will explore the nature of the element of Earth as it is understood in Astrology.

Earth is the element of Substance and Form - it relates to all things physical. While the other elements relate to non-physical experiences of human life, such as desire and passion, thoughts and ideas, or instincts and emotions, the element of Earth represents the literal ground we stand upon and the needs of our physical bodies. The three Earth Signs of Astrology relate to our physical embodied experiences and the resources that we will need for survival and success. No matter what sun sign or moon sign you were born under, we all possess bodies that need food, and we all have some level of desire for material objects to bring us comfort or ease, and we all desire some sense of achievement or power in our lives. Certainly, power and achievement grant us some level of ease in obtaining the material objects that help us to survive and thrive; therefore, the Earth element also relates to our ambition.

The element of Earth relates not only to our physical bodies and material belongings, but also to our innate human desire to build and create. Alan Oken states, "Man's strongest instinct is the will to be, and the first manifestation of that desire is to create something out of matter to prove his existence". [Alan Oken's Complete Astrology - As Above, So Below. Ibis Press, 2006] We have a strong desire to live and survive in our physical forms, but also to create and build things out of form and matter around us - to leave our mark upon the world by changing our landscape or creating something new with the materials we have at our hands. Here we see that the Earth element relates to procreation and fertility, as well as ambition, creation, building, leading, manifestation, and accumulation. It is in our nature as beings of the earth to accumulate objects to use to build new objects, to create something new that will help us survive, grow, and find success.

All three of the Earth Signs in Astrology carry energetic lessons of these desires to survive, build, create, and manifest. It is through the element of Earth that we bring the hopes and dreams of Spirit into Form.

Capricorn:

The Cardinal Earth sign seeks to reduce chaos by creating Law and Order, creating social structures and hierarchies so we know whom to look to as the leader of our project when we build something. The structure of Capricorn creates rules and boundaries for our safety and well-being, so that our ambitions (ideally) do not bring harm to ourselves or others, ensuring that our well-being has long-term sustainability. Capricorn reminds us of proper timing (when to plant our seeds, and when to harvest), and it also reminds us to use discipline and follow certain rules (save some of our seeds for next year's planting, preserve some of our harvest for harsh winter months, etc).

Taurus:

The Fixed Earth sign relates to our basic survival needs that include food, shelter, and pleasure. Taurus reminds us that while survival is necessary, we need enjoyment and pleasure to fulfill our lives just as much as we need the basics. We all know that just having food and shelter isn't enough - we need to have all of our senses stimulated in order to truly feel alive. The Form and Structure of the human life also includes pleasure found in art, music, flavor, and touch. While Taurus is an earth sign that teaches us the importance of stability and security, it also teaches us that we will not feel stable or secure without these bodily pleasures that we find from food that tastes good, smells, sights, and sounds that please us, and physical sensations that help us feel safe, relaxed, and even ecstatic with bliss.

Virgo

The Mutable Earth sign teaches us about service and sacrifice. We do not only build and create for our own benefit, but for the benefit of our families and communities. Virgo reminds us that we are not just here to find personal pleasure and satisfy our own personal ambition, and sometimes our greatest satisfaction will be found when we deny

ourselves our own pleasure in order to build something for others. When we go to work, we are sacrificing our time and leisure and often our pleasure to build or create something that will be used or enjoyed by others. We make a sacrifice by putting forth our energy to harvest the crops and preserve the food, not just because we are going to eat it, but in the service of others who will eat it as well. In Virgo, we are reminded that our greatest resource is community, and that community only lasts and succeeds when we all work together to build it and strengthen it.

Regardless of whether you have your Sun, Moon, or Rising sign in any of these Earth signs, we all have the energy of Earth and the Earth Triplicity within us. 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Wavebound Whispers by Silas the Sea Witch

Welcome back to another Wavebound Whispers. Our year sure has already started out with an unprecedented dynamic. Just like last month we will begin with our channeled message from the Ocean Mother.

Everything happens for a reason. You hear this all the time, don't you? What do you think the reason is? If you listen to your intuition, you already know. You don't have to be psychic to know either but know that everyone has the ability to be psychic. It just takes some time to focus on the message. If you listen closely, you will hear my voice in your interior, and inside the waves. If you have problems with these, just collect a seashell and hold it to your ear, and listen for my message. What my message means to you will hold a different meaning for others. Neither is incorrect, and both will arrive to the same conclusion. My message is clear. Spread love, not hate, lest you be sucked down into the unending spiral of the whirlpool.

Have you been keeping up with your morning daily water ritual? Yes? GREAT! If not, don't worry, it's never too late to try or create your own way of connecting. Some of the most creative ways are the most effective. And of course, what works for me might not work for you. I invite you to create your own morning routine connecting with water.

This month's theme is the Earth Element. The Earth element naturally represents stability, nurturing, and protection. What does that have to do with the Ocean, you ask? Well, of course, the Ocean does have a floor. The sandy or rocky bottom of the ocean provides stability, otherwise there would be no ocean, right? And so, our journey begins.

Let's go beneath the ever-moving surface of the sea, past the shimmer of light and dancing currents. There lies the quiet presence of Earth. As sea witches, it can be easy for us to focus solely on the water itself—the tides, the emotions, the flow—but the ocean would not exist in the way we know it without the grounding, stabilizing force of the Earth. Water may move, but Earth remains stable.



The ocean is cradled by Earth. Every wave breaks because land exists to receive it. Every tide pulls back because the seafloor holds it in place. Mountains rise on land, but greater mountain ranges still lie hidden beneath the sea, ancient and unmoving, older than most of our stories. These submerged mountains, trenches, and continental shelves are Earth's bones, shaping how the water flows above them. In this way, Earth gives water its pathways, its rhythm, and even its moods.

Think of sand—perhaps the most intimate meeting of Earth and Sea. Sand is Earth made small through time, pressure, and water's patient persistence. It is stone softened into millions of grains, each one holding memory. When you walk barefoot along the shoreline, that grounding sensation you feel is Earth speaking through the Sea, letting its presence be known, its own little way of saying 'Hi'. Sand carries the magic of stability, protection, and endurance, making it a powerful ally for sea witches who need grounding without disconnecting from emotional flow. Having a bowl of this on your altar is a benefit and reminder of its nature.

Shells, too, are Earth-Water correspondences. Though born of living creatures, shells are mineral homes, calcium structures shaped by ocean life and hardened by Earth energy.

They teach us about boundaries—how to remain open yet protected, soft within yet strong without, and also give us the strength to create and enforce these boundaries in our daily life. This is Earth wisdom expressed through the sea, reminding us that even in constant motion, we need structure to survive.



Salt is another sacred bridge between these elements. Formed through the evaporation of seawater, salt is water transformed into crystal—fluid becoming solid, emotion becoming wisdom. It grounds, preserves, and purifies. When you work with sea salt, you are working with the moment where Earth says, “Stay.” It is ideal for protection magic, boundary setting, and anchoring emotional work so it does not overwhelm you. Its use is so much more. I like to think of sea salt as a universal and necessary item. There’s a reason that you’ve seen witches on TV use salt to create barriers.



In the darkest depths, the sea floor itself is a vast altar of the earth. Clay, rock, and coral accumulate layer upon layer, holding the remains of ancient life, sunken ships, and forgotten

forgotten offerings. The ocean does not discard- it saves and remembers. Earth helps preserve these memories, while water moves over them like breath. This is why the sea is such a powerful place for ancestral work, past-life exploration, and long-term spellwork. What is anchored in Earth beneath water tends to endure.

When working with ocean energy, remember to invite Earth in consciously. Ground after emotional rituals. Balance intuition with practicality. Let your magic settle and root itself, like coral slowly building a reef. Water may guide you, but Earth will anchor you.

As we honor the Earth within the Sea, we learn that flow and stability are not opposite—they work together. And together, they teach us how to move forward without losing ourselves, and how to keep balanced when the tides change suddenly.

I have waited patiently for the wrongs to be righted, however you have not shown love and compassion to your fellow man.
