UKAFNP is something Jennie most proud of for being able to improve quality and standards of care for our detainee population and hopefully improve outcomes as a result.




EDUCATION UPDATE

Ewa is a Senior Sexual Offence Examiner and an international expert in injury interpretation. She holds a Diploma and a Doctorate in Forensic Medicine and Forensic Pathology, as well as a Certificate in Postgraduate

Professional Development in Forensic Medicine and the Cardiff University Law School Bond Solon Expert Witness Certificate. YVONNE BLAKE

Norfolk Area Coroner

THE INTERSECTION OF HEALTHCARE & THE CORONOR

I won a scholarship to grammar school but grew up on a council estate, regularly getting targeted for wearing my "posh" uniform — complete with straw boater. After various jobs, I stumbled into work as an auxiliary nurse, loved it, and went on to train at Addenbrooke's. Returning to Norfolk, I worked in orthopaedics and then A&E.



In 1989 I moved to Australia, joining the helicopter rescue and retrieval squad. I trained to rappel from helicopters, flew to serious RTCs with a doctor, treated snake and spider bites, crawled into grain silos to assist with amputations, and even boarded a tanker in rough seas by leaping for a ladder with a 40kg pack – convinced I'd end up as shark bait. The work was cutting-edge and unforgettable.

I returned to the UK in 1993, back to A&E, effectively working as a nurse practitioner before the title existed. When government targets made the job less appealing, I pursued a law degree at UEA while working full-time, then completed the Bar Vocational Course to become a barrister. I worked for AVMA and the NHS Litigation Service before cross-qualifying as a Solicitor Advocate.

I spent seven years as a defence solicitor and duty solicitor, handling countless latenight police station visits. I kept my nursing registration by working weekends in custody healthcare. A chance conversation with the Coroner for Great Yarmouth led to an unpaid role as Assistant Coroner, later Deputy Coroner for Suffolk and part of Essex. I juggled this with my legal work until 2015, when I became Area Coroner for Norfolk. Appointed by the Lord Chancellor, I hear hundreds of inquests each year – from RTCs, suicides, boating and workplace deaths, to prison deaths and industrial disease. It's demanding, often far from 9–5, but endlessly fascinating. My particular interests include disaster victim identification, health and safety deaths, and – another story entirely – the psychology of serial killers.

Laurie has built on her 14 years Emergency
Department and 3 years acute Oncology
nursing experience whilst working in Police

In 2021, she trained as a Liability Nursing
Expert Witness and has taken Counsel
instructions for ED-based civil cases, producing
reports and witness testimony.
Laurie has shared her knowledge and experiences
of being an expert witness within the custody
healthcare practitioner profession; presented at the Step
up to Expert Witness course at MPS and published an article
in February this year about the role of the expert witness in police custody.

In September 2025, she embarks on a new career challenge in the world of education as an FE lecturer in health and social care, whilst maintaining clinical hours in Police Custody.

THE JULIE TEKIN AWARD 2025

Nominations

Total Healthcare for Durham Constabulary

Durham Police's Operation Nightingale, launched in 2023, has been praised by HMICFRS for improving charge rates and victim support in domestic abuse cases. The initiative streamlines medical evidence gathering by enabling forensic practitioners to assess victims in safe locations, rather than hospitals. Examinations include body mapping, photography, and witness statements, producing high-quality evidence for CPS charging decisions.

National Safeguarding Leads Mitie Care and Custody Police Services Mandy Smail and Mandy McDonough, National Safeguarding Leads at Mitie

Mandy Smail and Mandy McDonough, National Safeguarding Leads at Mitie Care & Custody Police Services, are nominated for their leadership of the Safeguarding Quality Improvement Project. Their work has delivered sector-leading achievements, including: adopting the NHS England Safeguarding Assurance and Accountability Framework, access the Child Protection Information Sharing system via SystmOne, and implement bespoke safeguarding referral forms. Their efforts ensure compliance, improve auditing, and provide invaluable support to HCPs during case reviews.

SARCS Highland

The Highland SARCS Team has set a benchmark in trauma-informed, survivor-centred care by embedding Rape and Sexual Abuse Service Highland (RASASH) from the outset. Their innovations include a streamlined referral pathway reducing re-traumatisation, strong collaboration with RASASH to enhance support and training, and a proactive commitment to inclusivity through the LGBT Charter. The result is a safe, welcoming, and accessible service that prioritises dignity, comfort, and recovery for all survivors.

Humberside Police Custody

An audit identified that patients returning from A&E to police custody often lacked safe handover care plans, with A&E staff unaware of the limitations in custody. A focus group developed a teaching package for A&E staff on custody healthcare, alongside a standardised handover sheet to ensure continuity of care. Despite initial challenges, the process is now embedded across LCH custody suites in Yorkshire and the Humber, improving safety and consistency for detainees.

Eoin Bradley - Project Sagamore Met Det Lead

Eoin Bradley has been instrumental in developing the University of Greenwich's new PGCert in Advanced Forensic Practice, bringing innovation, expertise, and collaboration that earned multiple commendations at validation. His leadership has directly improved education for healthcare professionals and patient care, including initiatives such as a pioneering GHB Patient Group Direction trial.

Samantha Fenoulhet - Forensic Clinical Lead

Sam has led the development and implementation of a unique training and competency framework across SARCs, ensuring staff are trained and assessed in the latest techniques with proven outcomes. By focusing on patient experience and supporting regional teams directly, Sam has enhanced service quality and provided greater assurance for patients considering reporting.

Alexander Gore - Clinical Manager

As Clinical Manager in North Yorkshire Custody, Alex identified risks when detainees were taken to custody before being sent to A&E. He responded by delivering training to police on when direct hospital admission is required, now embedded in induction. He also created a 'Red Flags' quick reference guide, adopted by North Yorkshire Police, enabling officers to recognise emergency clinical situations and make safer, faster decisions. This innovation has improved detainee safety, reduced delays to treatment, and enhanced police decision-making.


