**Baptistery Ceiling, Florence, 13<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> century, John Witnesses to Jesus.**

On the ceiling of the Baptistery in Florence, Italy, is a mosaic cycle which I refer back to quite often because of the four narrative lines covering five of the eight sections of the ceiling. The bottom and fourth narrative line covers the life of John the Baptist. This is the sixth of fifteen panels (Annunciation to Zechariah, Birth of John, John's entry into the desert, two scenes of Baptism precede and the Baptism of Jesus is next). His scroll announces "ECCE AGNUS DEI ECCE QUI TOLI," or "Behold the Lamb of God, Behold Him who takes away[the sin of the world]." Water flows from the hill on which Jesus stands, as he is the source of living water, a Baptism in the Spirit. In this narrative, John's ministry moves toward his imprisonment and death after the Baptism of Jesus. Announcing Jesus is the fulfillment of his ministry and what God sent him to do. If you read the panels above, in the other three narratives (Adam and Eve expelled from the Garden, Joseph sold into slavery in Egypt, the Magi returning in a boat), you will find people, whether they realize it or not, fulfilling God's will for the salvation of all: Adam and Eve have access to God's care even as they lose access to Eden; even through his brothers' sin, Joseph will bring salvation to his people; the Magi help save Jesus from Herod's fear, by listening to God's message through the Angel.

In our readings this week we are asked to consider the mission we have been commissioned to complete through the living out of our own faith. How do we help progress the movement of God's salvation in our lives? Is his mercy and love for all people evident in the decisions we make? Do we create room for all in our lives?
