
American Saints with Professor Lisa Lickona

This stencil print has a Scripture text attached to it: Matthew 10:16 "Behold, I am sending you like sheep in the midst of wolves; so be as shrewd as serpents and simple as doves."

In Luke's Gospel, they are sent out as "lambs among wolves," followed with the instructions on how they are to go and how they are to proclaim the Good News. They are to call down peace upon the household they enter. If they are open to the peace shared it will remain with them, if not it will return to them. This is as much to say that each of the 72 going out must have peace within themselves as they go, a peace they have through Christ.

In the image, five figures seem to be engaged in conversation in a paradise setting. The setting is the peace they have from their faith in the Good News they have received from Jesus. That peace is an attitude through which they are to deal with the world they are going out to share that same peace with. To announce Good News, to share peace, presumes that you possess it yourself and live from it. These five apostles gain a lived sense of this peace from the community with each other that they maintain and are sustained by.

Body of Christ, sustained and deepened by the Eucharist we participate in and
share.
