"The Creation" (mid to late 13th century) mosaic, ceiling of the Baptistry in Florence..

The reading from Colossians begins with "Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God..." Up until the Gothic Era, in the creation story, God is depicted in the iconography of Jesus (blue cloak over red tunic, cruciform halo, dark beard), because of Paul's statement. We have not tangible, revealed image of God, except Jesus. Colossians goes on to inform us "For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell." Moses tells us that the Lord's command is not far from us or unreachable, but in our mouths and in our hearts. For Jesus, the commands of the Lord are not equated with the Law, but how the Law teaches us to receive mercy from God and to give it. If all things were created by God, God's command is within us, all things came together in mercy through the sacrifice of Jesus, then who is our neighbor, and when is it appropriate to assist them? The priest and the Levite put the restrictions of the Law before the mercy of God, while the Samaritan put mercy before anything else.

What have we learned from this parable?
