

"Gian Lorenzo Bernini (1598-1680), The Ecstasy of St. Teresa (1647-1652), marble sculpture with bronze rays.

In the Cornaro Family Chapel, in S. Maria della Vittoria, in Rome, Bernini's sculpture seems to hang weightlessly in the air, opening to heaven. Bernini has chosen to portray a moment in Teresa's Autobiography of a spiritual vision: an angel with a flame-tipped arrow, repeatedly piercing her heart. "The pain," she writes, "was so severe that it made me utter several moans. The sweetness caused by this intense pain is so extreme that one cannot possibly wish it to cease, nor is one's soul then content with anything but God." (The Life of Saint Teresa of Ávila by herself, Chapter 29) It is hard enough to try to describe in words the experience of union with God through prayer, but Bernini sought to do so in stone. Her body, in total surrender to God's Love, is relaxed and open. The angel's loving, gentle approach belies what otherwise might seem a violence...and yet, as Saint Cardinal John Henry Newman wrote in his 1865 poem "The Dream of Gerontius", "...know that the flame of the everlasting Love, doth burn ere it transform."

The "Our Father" is a prayer that invites us to surrender to the infinite Love of God, to his kingdom, to his will, and to his care for us.

Are we ready to surrender to that love?
