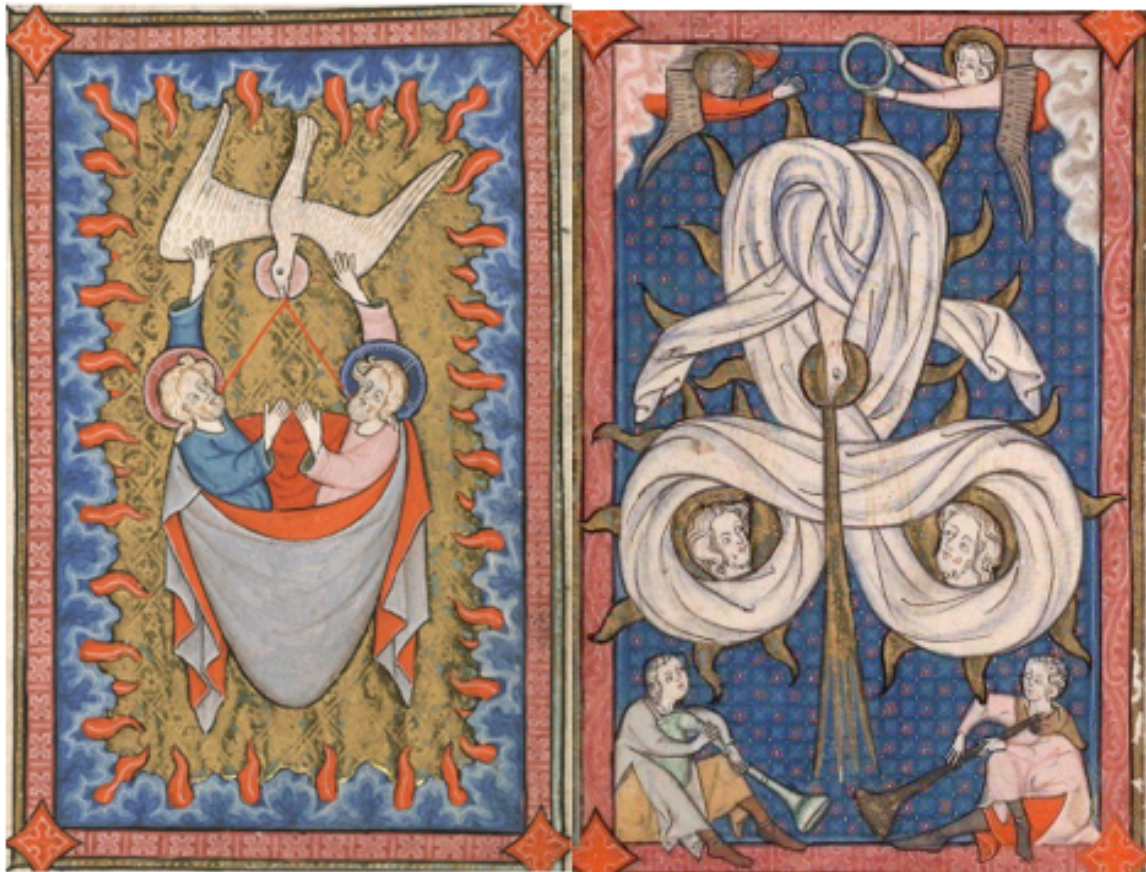

This book entitled “Canticles” is actually a compendium of Christian texts, both from Scripture and contemplation/commentary. A substantial part of the first part is dedicated to the contemplation of the mystery of the Holy Trinity. According to the scholar, Jeffrey F. Hamburger, this section “invites the devotee to pass from meditation (reading) to contemplation (seeing, here defined in visionary terms).” There are twenty surviving miniatures in this section depicting the Trinity. The idea is that even if you keep visualizing God in different ways, God is unknowable. Every artistic rendering only hints at the mystery. In each of the two rendered here, there is substantial amounts of cloth involved, partially obscuring from our sight a full vision, but in both, the interdependence of the three on each other, their connectedness, is made evident: the red triangle in the first connects one to another, and the dynamic flow of the cloth in the other suggests as different connectedness.

For us it is important to not to try to find one image that is perfect, but to accept all images together begin to help us delve more profoundly into the Love of God that is One.
