

that he can reach out from us to the world.

What strikes me most about these two images is that the disciples and Mary are gathered together in a tight format of figures, as though the event of Pentecost was able to take place, because they were together as a community. They do not exist as separate entities experiencing the descent of the Holy Spirit independently, but together as a community. In the first, they are surrounded by flames, almost as though they were corralled in by the event – drawn closer together around Mary

through whom Christ came into the world and was incarnate. In the second, the Spirit appears bringing the divine fire to bear down upon them, because they are gathered together, drawing their prayer into closer union. Pentecost was meant to exert its power from outside, but also from inside. It takes place – today as on its first instance – because of our free-will decision to come together, opening ourselves to join together in community. It is a collective gift with many different manifest expressions, rather than an individual manifestation for each of us. As for the disciples, so long ago, Christ's love calls us into a union, so
