This week, the second reading describes the New Jerusalem. In the Romanesque period they would try to depict what the words say. Just as you enter the front doors of this church and you look up, this is the scene you see. Here they have even bent the side walls so you can see the angelic spirits in the twelve portals. Less clear are the twelve courses of the foundation (the twelve apostles of the Lord), and the names of the twelve tribes over the doors. There are abbreviations that have worn down around the perimeter. It is clear that there is no Temple within, only the Lord God and the Lamb. The Lord God has a cruciform halo (Paul had said in Colossians 1:15a, that Jesus "is the image of the invisible God..." so God is depicted as Jesus) and the Lamb also has a cruciform halo because Jesus is the lamb of sacrifice who was dead, but who now lives. In this image, the halo connects them, making them one and presents them as the invitation to share in their union.

In the gospel Jesus promises that the Father and he will "make our dwelling with him (the one who loves him and keeps his word/commands)", just as the New Jerusalem (the Church) is the way God will dwell with us.

The four rivers flow from the throne as they do in Eden (Genesis 2:10-14).
