The gospel this week ends with what is known as the "Rehabilitation of St. Peter." "Peter, do you love me?" Jesus asks three times to match the number of times Peter denied him. Eichenberg has chosen to depict the moment tradition places the death of Jesus, 3 pm, at which moment Peter realizes the depth of his sin against his Lord, whom he loves.

Easter celebrates that no matter how far we fall, Jesus reaches out to us, to lift us up. In Eichenberg's image, Peter uses a tree for

In Eichenberg's image, Peter uses a tree for support as he sinks into his grief, called out by the rooster's crowing above, against a backdrop of an hourglass of light. He does not realize the tree is the crucified Christ, inclining his head towards Peter. We fail to participate in the life we have available to us in Christ, as his body. We hurt others, and we hurt ourselves in the process. But, Jesus' death and resurrection was to heal our brokenness, again and again, until, finally, we enter into his embrace. His goal always was and still is our salvation.

So he will ask us as many times as we need, "Do you love me?"...so we can answer, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you."
