Albrecht Altdorfer
(c.1480-1538), **The Battle of Alexander the Great at Issus** (1529).

Considered to be the crowning glory of Altdorfer's work, the artist has depicted an ancient battle, that took place in 333 BC, where the victory of Alexander the Great over the Persian king, Darius III, marked his ascent towards ruling the known world. The armies depicted are dressed and equipped as they would have been in the early 16th century, which may be a marker that it also represents the Siege of Vienna, when European forces were successful in turning back the progress of Suleiman the Magnificent of the Ottoman Empire.

In our Gospel this week, people are concerned about

when their known world, the one they feel they had a handle on, is going to be turned on its end (the destruction of the Temple), and Jesus tells them of terrifying things including "wars and insurrections" and "nation will rise against nation, kingdom against kingdom." In the painting, God's heaven dominates the battle in the foreground, as much to say that despite all that humankind does to wrest control over one another and their world, God rules the world, time, and space. Jesus knows how this will end: in his death and resurrection. Neither sin nor death are stronger than God's infinite love for his creation. Alexander would die, and his empire would be broken up among his generals. Jesus warns his followers that they will suffer at the hands of the world, but that they are not to be concerned about their lives or what they are to say: God's love will win out over all things. Altdorfer's painting becomes a promise of this hope, and a reason to put our trust and faith in God who loves us.
