It means a future that will raise their families out of poverty.


She would like to invite us to participate in a program this Advent.

As I grew up with All Souls Day, it was often caught up in a certain amount of *angst*, as our future after death seemed to be either one of torment or joy. We did everything we could to try to not be worthy of Hell, but Purgatory always seemed to be a much more likely prospect than Heaven. We often worried about the one's we loved who had died. Our prayers for them seemed to be geared toward getting them out of Purgatory and into Heaven.

As a child, I longed for the Heaven that Dürer depicted. As I was already fond of art, it was an image with which I was familiar (down to thinking the guy on the lower level to the right in armor looked like Bob Hope). At the time I did not understand the significance of the "Mercy Seat" of God the Father holding up the crucified Son (the act of Salvation in which we hope) with

the Holy Spirit above, or that the crowds gathered around represented, in three rings: the angels; the martyrs and those from the Old Testament, Mary and John; and the saints since including those of recent memory in 1511. I did not grow up with the upper image of Purgatory, but knew it, to fear it, in words. The upper image includes a crucifix on the altar above - so each points to the reality that Salvation comes through the death and resurrection of Jesus. And that is my point. As we look to the celebration of All Souls Day, we need to keep in mind that it is through the mercy of God that we have salvation, and that those who have gone before us have always been in God's care. When we pray for them, it is our love for them that connects them to us and to God. We support heaven for them with our love.
