The Cleansing of the Ten Lepers (c.1035-c.1056) Codex Aureus of Echternach.

This Gospel Book has the text of the Gospels, but more importantly, it tells the Gospel stories in a series of illustrations, like a comic book, telling the stories in pictures (this one is the third and final band of a page beginning with the raising of the son of the widow of Nain, therefore Luke's Gospel). It was created in Echternach, Luxembourg, and it now resides in Nuremburg. One of the curiosities is that it depicts the lepers first addressing Jesus in what looks like an enclosure, and then after they are healed in the open. The enclosure represents their being cut off from the community, their isolation. In the second part of the image they are all healed and are heading off to the Temple (some are already out of the picture), except the one who returns to give thanks to God through Jesus.

In the first reading this weekend, Naaman the Syrian general who is healed through Elisha's intervention, returns to give thanks. Thanks is not a debt to be paid, but a movement of the heart towards the one we wish to thank. It takes him a while, but Naaman seems to get it. The gratitude of the one leper who returns in the Gospel is drawing him back to Jesus, into a deeper connection. Jesus has suffered and died for our sins, rising so that we might follow him to eternal life. Are we aware that we are participating in this mystery of salvation each moment of our lives? Are we grateful so as to be drawn more deeply into his love? Or are we trying to pay a debt that he has already paid?
