Victory Oh Lord! (1871)

The painting aptly describes the power of three against the power of one. What the three knew was that the army needed to be able to look up and see Moses' hands up-raised, holding the staff. Moses began well, but as human beings do, he began to wear out, not being able to keep his arms up by his own power. Faith is hard to maintain on our own. We tire. What one could not do, three could. Jesus asks, "But when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on the earth?" Faith was never meant to be maintained on our own. It was intended

that we support each other in it, which is why we are called into the community, the Body of Christ. Our belief in God's power to work in us, despite our willfulness and sinfulness, is possible in that we have each other, to support each other when our faith is on the ebb. Moses endures this trial for the sake of his community, his people. Aaron and Hur join him in endurance and in faith. They believe in God's promises, and they support each other in that belief. As a community in faith we do not believe for our own sakes, but for each other's. We gather in support of each other, but we also gather so that in faith, we can be one.
