Our 100+ miles of trail offer unique experiences, taking us through diverse habitats such as sugar maple stands, hemlock and cedar forests, riparian corridors along rivers, apple orchards, and expansive fields. These natural corridors are beautiful and essential for mental health and well-being. Our trails also bridge geographical boundaries, linking Essex to Caledonia counties and connecting our vibrant downtowns from Burke to East Haven and, one day, Lyndon.

Our trails promote the importance of land stewardship.

The diversity and abundance of our trails are a testament to our generous landowners, the open spaces and healthy forests in our region, and the resilient nature of our soil types. These elements create a sustainable environment that benefits us all. We experience this as we ride through scenic fields filled with hay bales or cows and witness a vibrant and flourishing forest after a timber harvest. These experiences connect us to the culture of the Northeast Kingdom.

On a more personal level, trails connect people to themselves.

Whether it's a Women's Ride WEDNESDAY, a family outing, a run with friends, or a quiet solo ski, each adventure on our trails fosters a deeper connection to our inner selves and to those we share these moments with.



Legislative Action

AN ACT RELATING TO OUTDOOR RECREATION

KT took action at the State House during the 2024 legislative session,

advocating for outdoor recreation through Bill H.673. Even though it didn't make it to the finish line, this bill would have resulted in concrete recommendations on many aspects of outdoor recreation, including how we, as a state, invest in trail maintenance and stewardship.

Answering how we develop an appropriate mechanism to recognize private landowners is a critical component of retaining public access, which is near and dear to KT's heart and essential to sustaining Vermont's valuable and cherished outdoor recreation economy. KT's Landowner Advisory Committee also lent a hand and joined in the advocacy by crafting a letter to send to our legislators on behalf of all KT landowners. KT and other trail organizations look forward to championing this effort again next session.

Kitchel Upgrade and Expansion

Kitchel is one of the oldest trails on the KT network. Named for Doug Kitchel, one of KT's founders, in 2009 KT Landowner Knight Ide donated his time and machine to make it the first excavated trail on the network. It quickly became a crowd favorite! This year, as a nod to our founders and rich history, we partner again with Knight and the IdeRide builders to welcome Kitchel into its new era by adding two new descending trails alongside the existing Kitchel corridor. The design preserves, enhances, and integrates the existing trail while adding two more awesome options. The result will be three premium flow trails of varying difficulty. Fun for everyone!

Climate Readiness and Resiliency

More Moose Haven Maintenance and New Trail Alert! Thanks to funding from the Northern Forest Center's Sustainable Vermont Trails Grant and an onX Access & Stewardship Grant, KT undertook the More Moose Haven Maintenance project. The project addressed necessary trail repair and rehabilitation to minimize erosion and constructed Sunny's .74 mile trail built by IdeRide that circumnavigates the field around the gazebo at the top of Moose Haven. It features remnants of an old sawmill, numerous old stone walls, and stunning views of Burke Mountain.



St. Johnsbury Academy Annual Stewardship Day

Sophomore students from St. Johnsbury Academy joined KT and partners from Vermont Adaptive Ski & Sports, Adaptive Sports Partners, and the Kelly Brush Foundation to rebuild a bridge using KT's harvested and milled hemlock lumber on Loop trail to make it aMTB accessible. Students learned the importance of creating access for all who wish to recreate, and some basic construction and trail-building skills!

Kingdom East School District

KESD and KT partner to provide youth access

to the trails through summer camp and afterschool bike club, programs that break down barriers and inspire youth to pursue outdoor opportunities that they might not otherwise have access to! In 2023, over 180 local youth had the ability to mountain bike through a KESD program, sponsored by KT through a grant from Vermont Afterschool. We love partnering with KESD as they share similar core values of access, inclusion, and healthy living!

This year, KT hosted over 65 local and visiting camps, clinics, group rides, and races organized by third-party organizations, increasing educational and recreational opportunities for all!



International Fellowship

KT had the opportunity to work with the Institute for Training and Development (ITD) in May to host Timna Varela, Executive Director at the nonprofit Partners in Education Roatan - PIER, based in Roatan, Honduras! During her month-long stay, Timna worked with KT, our partner organizations, and community as she developed projects to promote sustainable economic development through education in Roatan! In November, KT's Community Collaboration Director, Lukas Ray, was invited by ITD to visit Timna and PIER in Honduras for a week! The experience was profound, and Lukas was immersed in vibrant perspectives and initiatives, including the many correlations between our two communities, steeped in outdoor recreation!

Outdoor Empowerment Programming

Powered Magazine Program

KT partnered with Powered Magazine, a nonprofit organization created by and for people of color who find joy in the outdoors, to provide programming for BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, and other People of Color) youth and adults to learn the joys of mountain biking in a safe and supportive environment. Both organizations saw the joy mountain biking can provide and wanted to offer an experience to those who may not have the opportunity to learn to ride.

Programs like Powered can serve as a platform for building a supportive community where participants can share experiences, overcome challenges, and celebrate triumphs together. As a group leader with Powered noted: "Our participants found joy in MTB and the natural beauty that surrounds KT."

We would like to extend our deepest thanks to The Wildflower Inn for providing access to their gazebo and field, Sport Thoma for providing bikes for adult programming, and Kingdom East School District for providing youth bikes from Burke Town School.

Powered and KT are both invested in continuing programming in 2024!

1PVD Cycling Visit



Network Sustainability



Forest Future Strategic Road Map

KT's Executive Director, Abby Long serves as the outdoor recreation voice for the Vermont Forest Future Strategic Roadmap Advisory Panel, tasked to create the Vermont Forest Future Strategic Roadmap. This report seeks to strengthen, modernize, promote, and protect the forest products sector and the greater forest economy, of which outdoor recreation is a part. In January 2024, after an 18-month process, the completed roadmap was released to the public.



NEK Outdoor Recreation Community Hub Master Plan

KT's USDA funded Capacity Study, completed in 2021 was driven by public engagement. The study's top priority recommendation was a Community Hub to serve as a Welcome Center for KT. Following this recommendation, KT received another USDA grant to complete a master plan for the Hub, a facility necessary to enhance the visitor experience and improve residents' quality of life. It will provide a space for KT to conduct business, host educational programming and gathering space, catalyze economic development, and support the local workforce.


KT also purchased and began restoration efforts of two historic homes in downtown East Burke, to be integrated into the Hub as administrative offices, meeting and program space, and workforce housing opportunities.



STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK

We are grateful to Cynthia Stuart of Stuart Consulting for leading KT through our Strategic Framework process. Many of KT's landowners, trail enthusiasts, local community members, and business owners were invited to focus group meetings and participated in KT's online survey to define the organization's goals, measure performance against our mission, foster organizational alignment, and ignite inspiration! Throughout this planning process, KT's intention has been to analyze and emphasize the various facets that guide Kingdom Trails in its ongoing development and growth. Four 'Crowning' Principles were established as the foundation of the framework to lead us into the next 30 years of KT.


The Kingdom Trail Association, along with so many others across the state of Vermont, faced significant

financial challenges due to historic flooding and persistent rain during July and August, which drastically reduced the number of trail users we usually welcome. This unprecedented weather had a notable impact on our revenue, leading to an overall financial loss. Despite these difficulties, KT remained committed to its values and priorities, including continuing to pay our dedicated and valued employees competitive wages and benefits.

In alignment with our mission to support both the community and our organization, we made a strategic investment with the purchase of two historic homes in downtown East Burke. These properties are intended to serve dual purposes as future office space and workforce housing. We are gradually restoring these homes to their original 1850s character with the support of grants, and we are proud to have recently welcomed our first resident employee into one of these newly renovated workforce housing units.

Our ability to weather these financial difficulties was bolstered by our prudent use of cash reserves, which we have diligently saved over time. These reserves provided critical support during the extreme weather events, enhancing our resilience. Additionally, this fiscal year marked a significant milestone for KT as we initiated financial investments aimed at diversifying our revenue streams. This strategic move is designed to make our organization more sustainable and less vulnerable when facing unpredictable times.

Furthermore, this fiscal year was pivotal as we developed the organization's next Strategic Framework. This comprehensive plan will guide our future budgets and efforts, ensuring we meet the ambitious goals set forth by our Crowning Principles: Trail Network, Community Connections, a Thriving Organization, and Positive Impact. We have already begun implementing our strategic plan and are confident that it will lead to a more robust and impactful Kingdom Trail Association in the years to come.



Operating Financials
