FIRST READING: Acts 3: 12-19

NT 105

After healing a man unable to walk, Peter preaches to the people, describing how God's promises to Israel have been fulfilled in Jesus. Through the proclamation of Christ's death and resurrection, God is offering them forgiveness and restoration in Jesus' name.

¹²[Peter] addressed the people, "You Israelites, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we had made him walk?¹³The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our ancestors has glorified his servant Jesus, whom you handed over and rejected in the presence of Pilate, though he had decided to release him. ¹⁴But you rejected the Holy and Righteous One and asked to have a murderer given to you, ¹⁵and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. Rodney comes to Messiah from Flemington Presbyterian Church in Hinesville, where he has served as Director of Music and worship pianist. He resides in Savannah.

After appearing to the disciples on the road to Emmaus and disappearing, He suddenly re-appears in their midst offering a word of peace. The disciples are frightened, thinking Jesus is a ghost. But they watch Jesus eat fish, assuring them the resurrection of his body was real. Then Jesus teaches them about everything in the Old Testament being fulfilled by Christ, opening their minds to scripture and teaching them that the Messiah must suffer and rise again in three days. Questions for reflection: What part of your life needs peace right now? What kind of fish do you like? Has your mind ever been opened to Scripture? Where, when and with whom?




