



## **WORD**

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 23:23-29

**Old Testament 685** 

Because Jeremiah preaches the unpopular message of God's judgment, he suffers rejection. Today's reading distinguishes between the true prophet, like Jeremiah, who speaks God's word, and the false prophet who misleads the people through dreams. One is like wheat; the other like worthless straw.

<sup>23</sup> Am I a God near by, says the Lord, and not a God far off? <sup>24</sup> Who can hide in secret places so that I cannot see them? says the Lord. Do I not fill heaven and earth? says the Lord. <sup>25</sup> I have heard what the prophets have said who prophesy lies in my name, saying, "I have dreamed! I have dreamed!" <sup>26</sup> How long? Will the hearts of the prophets ever turn back—those who prophesy lies and who prophesy the deceit of their own heart? <sup>27</sup> They plan to make my people forget my name by their dreams that they tell one another, just as their ancestors forgot my name for Baal. <sup>28</sup> Let the prophet who has a dream tell the dream, but let the one who has my word speak my word faithfully. What has straw in common with wheat? says the Lord. <sup>29</sup> Is not my word like fire, says the Lord, and like a hammer that breaks a rock in pieces?

#### PSALM: Psalm 82

Arise, O God, and rule the earth. (Ps. 82:8)

- <sup>1</sup>God stands to charge the divine council assembled, giving judgment in the midst of the gods:
- <sup>2</sup> "How long will you judge unjustly, and show favor to the wicked?
- <sup>3</sup> Save the weak and the orphan; defend the humble and needy;
- <sup>4</sup> rescue the weak and the poor; deliver them from the power of the wicked.
- <sup>5</sup> They do not know, neither do they understand; they wander about in darkness; all the foundations of the earth are shaken.
- <sup>6</sup> Now I say to you, You are gods, and all of you children of the Most High;
- <sup>7</sup> nevertheless, you shall die like mortals, and fall like any prince."
- <sup>8</sup> Arise, O God, and rule the earth, for you shall take all nations for your own.

#### SECOND READING: Hebrews 11:29-12:2 New Testament 199

The author of Hebrews presents us with rich stories of faith. In a long list of biblical heroes, we find examples of trust in God that enabled them to face the trials of life faithfully. In addition to this "cloud of witnesses," we have Jesus, the perfect model of faithful endurance.

- <sup>29</sup> By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land, but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned. <sup>30</sup> By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days. <sup>31</sup> By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.
- <sup>32</sup> And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets, <sup>33</sup> who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, <sup>34</sup> quenched the power of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, were made strong out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. <sup>35</sup> Women received

their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. <sup>36</sup> Others suffered mocking and flogging and even chains and imprisonment. <sup>37</sup> They were stoned to death; they were sawn in two; they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented <sup>38</sup> of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains and in caves and holes in the ground.

<sup>39</sup> Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, <sup>40</sup> since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.


<sup>12:1</sup> Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, <sup>2</sup> looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.

<sup>54</sup> He also said to the crowds, "When you see a cloud rising in the west, you immediately say, 'It is going to rain,' and so it happens. <sup>55</sup> And when you see the south wind blowing, you say, 'There will be scorching heat,' and it happens. <sup>56</sup> You hypocrites! You know how to interpret the appearance of earth and sky, but why do you not know how to interpret the present time?"







# THEOLOGY 101: AN INTRODUCTION TO CHRISTIAN THEOLOGY August 28-September 25, Thursday, 4-5 pm.

Theology is not just something pastors or scholars do. If you practice your Christian faith, take the spiritual dimension of life seriously, and think about God, you are a theologian. This five-week class introduces participants to different types of theology (Biblical, historical, systematic, constructive, practical) and some of the basic doctrines within systematic theology (theological anthropology, Christology, soteriology, ecclesiology, etc.) We will review some of the classical doctrines. Students will be encouraged to explore and articulate their own theological convictions. Recommended books: Stone and Duke, *How to Think Theologically*, and Migliore, *Faith Seeking Understanding*, 4<sup>th</sup> edition."

The class is open to all interested individuals and will be taught by Rev. Dr. Karen Scheib, Emerita Professor of Pastoral Theology, Candler School of Theology, Emory University. ## **SERMON PREVIEW**

#### From Wilderness to the Finish Line

The writer of Hebrews takes us on a sprint through Old Testament salvation history—from the Red Sea to the walls of Jericho, from judges and prophets to those who endured difficult trials. All of them ran their legs of the race by faith, even when they could not see the finish line. Today, the baton is in our hands. We, too, have our own

"race marked out," surrounded by that same great cloud of witnesses invoked in Hebrews. The wilderness moments—when we feel trapped, weary, or unsure—are part of the course, not signs we have lost our way. But the race does not end in the desert. Fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, we press on, knowing the One who parted the sea and broke down walls will bring us to the joy set before us. Questions for reflection: Who can you remember who had strong faith? How has your faith sustained you in times of trial? If life is like a race, how do you want to finish well?
