
The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all.





Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?... so we too might walk in newness of life.



SERMON PREVIEW

Because of the Sacraments

Lutherans are sacramental Christians, which means that we believe we experience God through the Word. That Word, however, comes not just through the Bible but through ordinary earthly elements such as water in baptism and bread and wine in communion. The Roman Catholic Church has seven sacraments. Luther read the Bible and concluded Jesus gave just two sacraments. Baptism and Holy Communion became touchstones for our faith--special ways Jesus comes to us and transforms us. In the sacraments we receive forgiveness and newness of life.

Questions for Reflection:

Luther taught that in the Sacraments, "God's Word is the chief thing." How does it change your understanding of baptism or communion to see them as something God does for you, rather than something you do for God? In Luke 22, Jesus says, "The Cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood." What difference might it make that the promise is personal, as in "for you"? How can the reality of your baptism and the gift of Christ's table shape the way you approach your work, relationships, and community in the coming week?
