
If you would like to give the old-fashioned way, the offering plate is on the table as you exit the Sanctuary. "Kyrie" is a Greek word meaning "Lord."



New Testament 68 The Parable of the Prodigal son

The Holy Gospel according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

¹¹ Then Jesus said, "There was a man who had two sons. ¹² The younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of the wealth that will belong to me.' So he divided his assets between them. 13 A few days later the younger son gathered all he had and traveled to a distant region, and there he squandered his wealth in dissolute living. ¹⁴ When he had spent everything, a severe famine took place throughout that region, and he began to be in need. ¹⁵ So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that region, who sent him to his fields to feed the pigs. ¹⁶ He would gladly have filled his stomach with the pods that the pigs were eating, and no one gave him anything. ¹⁷ But when he came to his senses he said, 'How many of my father's hired hands have bread enough and to spare, but here I am dying of hunger! ¹⁸ I will get up and go to my father, and I will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; ¹⁹ I am no longer worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands." ' ²⁰ So he set off and went to his father. But while he was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion; he ran and put his arms around him and kissed him. ²¹ Then the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you; I am no longer worthy to be called your son.' 22 But the father said to his slaves, 'Quickly, bring out a robe—the best one—and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. ²³ And get the fatted calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate, ²⁴ for this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found!' And they began to celebrate.

²⁵ "Now his elder son was in the field, and as he came and approached the house, he heard music and dancing. ²⁶ He called one of the slaves and asked what was going on. ²⁷ He replied, 'Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fatted calf because he has got him back safe and sound.' ²⁸ Then he became angry and refused to go in. His father came out and began to plead with him. ²⁹ But he answered his father, 'Listen! For all these years I have been working like a slave for you, and I have never disobeyed your command, yet you have never given me even a young goat so that I might celebrate with my friends. ³⁰ But when this son of yours came back, who has devoured your assets with prostitutes, you killed the fatted calf for him!' ³¹ Then the father said to him, 'Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. ³² But we had to celebrate and rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life; he was lost and has been found.'

In the sermon, the
Word of God is
brought to bear on the
lives of the hearers.
This is the equivalent
of sitting at the feet of
Jesus. But it's more
than mere instruction.

Through the sermon,
God speaks to us with
a two-edged sword of
challenge and promise,
Law and Gospel. The
subject of the sermon is
both God and us.

Through the sermon we come to a better understanding of ourselves, especially our need for God's love and forgiveness. We also come face to face with God's mercy and love.

SERMON PREVIEW

Because It's All Grace

The sermon series on Lutheranism begins this week with the defining emphasis of our tradition: Grace—the goodness of God, which we receive unearned and unmerited. The concept of grace is the key discovery of Martin Luther, which unleashed the Reformation of the church in Europe. We will discuss grace through the lens of the parable of the prodigal son in Luke 15. In it, the wasteful son squanders the advance of his inheritance from his father, only to return home hoping to be a servant. He is welcomed warmly and restored to his status as son. Jesus told this parable to illustrate God's love: we may rebel against God and squander the blessings God gives us, but God's response continues to be grace. Questions for Reflection: What comes to mind when you consider the word "Lutheran?" How acquainted are you with Lutheran principles and teachings? Can you think of a time when you sensed God's grace? What about God's judgment?
