





### FIRST READING: Isaiah 53:1-5

Old Testament 643

He was despised and rejected by others; a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity... But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities..."


"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."



### Tour to Ebenezer, Georgia Tuesday, October 7, 10:30 am

The Salzburgers were a group of Germanspeaking Protestant exiles from Salzburg, Austria, who settled in Ebenezer, Georgia, (currently located on Ebenezer Road in Rincon, Georgia) in 1734 after being expelled for their faith. Invited by General James Oglethorpe, they established one of the earliest and most successful immigrant communities in colonial Georgia. Known for their industrious farming, strong religious devotion, and resilience, the Salzburgers built schools, mills, and churches, most notably Jerusalem Lutheran Church, the oldest continuously active Lutheran church in America.

More recently, hotelier Richard Kessler, a devout Lutheran with Salzburger roots, created a home for an extensive collection of items by and about Martin Luther in the Martin Luther Exhibition at the New Ebenezer Retreat Center.

In conjunction with the Parish Life Ministry, Messiah's Lynda Beam is organizing a trip to Ebenezer for Messiah members to tour the church, view the collection, and have lunch on the first Tuesday in October. The group will carpool from Messiah at 9:00 am. The cost will be \$25 person for lunch and fees at the Center. Sign up on the Narthex Kiosk and indicate if you are willing to be a driver.

### **SERMON PREVIEW**

### **Finding God in Suffering**

Jesus shocks his disciples when he tells them that the Messiah will suffer, be rejected, and be killed. Peter cannot believe it, and he tells Jesus so. Yet Jesus insists that this is the way of God. If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.

Martin Luther found this truth stated by Jesus to be central to the life of the Christian. He developed a "Theology of the Cross," centered on suffering and hardship, contrasting it with a "Theology of Glory," when God is only found in victory and success. To deny ourselves and follow Christ, then, is not to seek pain but to trust that even there, we are not abandoned. We follow a crucified Lord who walks with us through suffering into life.

How does the FACT that Jesus suffered on a cross and died challenge popular notions of what God "should" be like? When Jesus says, "deny yourself and take up your cross," how might modern people do that today? We don't look at carrying the cross in isolation, we also see it in the light of the resurrection. How does Jesus' resurrection help us understand our suffering further?
