SERMON PREVIEW

Most people have questions about heaven—where it is, what it will be like, whether it is a place or a state of being, and what we will actually do there. Some imagine clouds and harps, others picture a vague spiritual existence, and many are simply unsure. Yet the Bible speaks often and confidently about our future with God, not to satisfy curiosity, but to anchor our hope. Today we will explore what Scripture reveals about heaven: where it is, what the new creation will be like, the kind of bodies we will have, and what we will do there. Along the way, we will also address some common questions believers ask—because heaven is not meant to be a mystery that confuses us, but a promise that strengthens us.

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

2026 Spiritual Growth Activity

We are inviting our whole church family to participate in a **12-month spiritual growth journey**. Each month we will focus on one simple, but meaningful activity designed to help you draw closer to Christ.

February—Read One Gospel in One Sitting (1.5-2 hours)

Choose either the Gospel of Mark (shorter, fast-moving) or the Gospel of John (reflective, rich-in-meaning) and set aside enough time to read the entire Gospel without rushing. A modern translation such as New International Version, New Living Translation, or English Standard Version is recommended.

As you read, pay attention not just to the events but to **Jesus' character**, noticing how He treats people, how He responds to interruptions, and what emotions He expresses. Watch for His **mission**—what He says He came to do, how He speaks about the Kingdom of God, and what priorities guide His choices. Finally, reflect on His **heart**—what He cares about most deeply, where He shows compassion, and what grieves or angers Him. End with a simple prayer of gratitude and response.

This extended reading helps you see the big picture of Jesus' life and ministry and deepens your understanding of His heart and mission.

Read an Epistle with Study

For those who want an additional challenge...Choose Philippians, Ephesians, or James.

Read it twice. Pay attention to its historical setting, major themes, and key commands (use a study Bible or trusted commentary if helpful). Write a brief summary of what the letter teaches about Christian living and how it applies to your current habits or lifestyle.
