FIRST READING: Exodus 24:12-18

Old Testament 65

At Mount Sinai, Moses experienced the presence of God for forty days and forty nights. The “glory of the Lord” settled on the mountain, and on the seventh day God called out to Moses. On the mountain God gave Moses the stone tablets inscribed with the ten commandments.

¹² The Lord said to Moses, “Come up to me on the mountain and wait there; I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction.” ¹³ So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up onto the mountain of God. ¹⁴ To the elders he had said, “Wait here for us, until we come back to you. Look, Aaron and Hur are with you; whoever has a dispute may go to them.”

¹⁵ Then Moses went up on the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. ¹⁶ The glory of the Lord settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days; on the seventh day he called to Moses out of the cloud. ¹⁷ Now the appearance of the glory of the Lord was like a devouring fire on the top of the mountain in the sight of the Israelites. ¹⁸ Moses entered the cloud and went up on the mountain. Moses was on the mountain for forty days and forty nights.

PSALMODY: Psalm 2

People: ⁸ **Ask of me, and I will give you the nations for your inheritance and the ends of the earth for your possession.**

Leader: ⁹ You shall crush them with an iron rod and shatter them like a piece of pottery.”

SECOND READING: 2 Peter 1:16-21

New Testament 209

At the transfiguration, God’s voice was heard, declaring Jesus to be the beloved Son. By the activity of the Holy Spirit, God’s voice continues to be heard through the word of scripture.


¹⁶ We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, “This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.” ¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

¹⁹ So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. ²⁰ First of all you must understand this, that no prophecy of scripture is a matter of one’s own interpretation, ²¹ because no prophecy ever came by human will, but men and women moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God.

SERMON PREVIEW

On a high mountain Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. In this moment of clarity, the disciples glimpse who Jesus truly is—not just teacher or healer but the very presence of God among them. He suddenly appears to them as a dazzling white. This revelation of God's beloved Son offers a vision of glory that stands in sharp contrast to the suffering that lies ahead. We call this event the "transfiguration," meaning that Christ's appearance is changed, transfigured. In hearing this story, we are invited to see Jesus more clearly—in both moments of radiant light and deep shadow.

Questions for Reflection: When have you had moments of clarity about God's greatness? Our own Oskar Johnson-Liu is being confirmed this Sunday, what do you think this story has to say to him as he takes this important step in his life of faith? How can glimpses of God's glory help you live more faithfully in the ordinary and challenging parts of life?

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF FAITH FORMATION

2026 Spiritual Growth Activity

We are inviting our whole church family to participate in a **12-month spiritual growth journey**. Each month we will focus on one simple, but meaningful activity designed to help you draw closer to Christ.

February—Read One Gospel in One Sitting (1.5-2 hours)

Choose either the Gospel of Mark (shorter, fast-moving) or the Gospel of John (reflective, rich-in-meaning) and set aside enough time to read the entire Gospel without rushing. A modern translation such as New International Version, New Living Translation, or English Standard Version is recommended.

As you read, pay attention not just to the events but to **Jesus' character**, noticing how He treats people, how He responds to interruptions, and what emotions He expresses. Watch for His **mission**—what He says He came to do, how He speaks about the Kingdom of God, and what priorities guide His choices. Finally, reflect on His **heart**—what He cares about most deeply, where He shows compassion, and what grieves or angers Him. End with a simple prayer of gratitude and response.

This extended reading helps you see the big picture of Jesus' life and ministry and deepens your understanding of His heart and mission.

Read an Epistle with Study

For those who want an additional challenge... Choose Philippians, Ephesians, or James.

Read it twice. Pay attention to its historical setting, major themes, and key commands (use a study Bible or trusted commentary if helpful). Write a brief summary of what the letter teaches about Christian living and how it applies to your current habits or lifestyle.

Dear Oskar,

I will be praying for you today on your Confirmation Sunday. The Rite of Confirmation is a time when you renew your Baptismal Vows.

You do not remember your Baptismal Vows as you were an infant. I would suggest that you read a small part of **Luther's Small Catechism** titled *The Sacrament of Holy Baptism*. Luther references many Bible verses about Baptism. A good Scripture verse about Baptism is Acts 2:38. "Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit."

As you mature into a young man, may the Holy Spirit lead you to attend worship services and take Holy Communion. Continue your relationship with God as you pray each day and spend time reading a good Study Bible. The Study Bible will have footnotes to guide your understanding of Scripture. Read *The Apostle's Creed* and *Explanation in Luther's Small Catechism*. The Explanation of the Third Article is a section that is especially meaningful.

I will end this letter by quoting three Scripture verses for your Confirmation Sunday:

- Proverbs 3:5-6: Trust in the LORD with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your paths straight.
- John 21:24-25: This is the disciple who testifies to these things and who wrote them down. We know that his testimony is true. Jesus did many other things as well. If every one of them were written down, I suppose that even the whole world would not have room for the books that would be written.
- Romans 8:37-39: No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

May God be with you on your Confirmation Sunday.
