FIRST READING: Isaiah 49:1-7

Old Testament 638

Here the servant, identified as Israel, speaks for herself and describes her honored mission. Called before her birth like Jeremiah and John the Baptist, the servant is not only to restore Israel. The servant's ultimate assignment is to bring news of God's victory to the ends of the earth. God in faithfulness has chosen Israel for this task.



and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit.’³⁴ And I myself have seen and have testified that this is the Chosen One.”

³⁵ The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples,³⁶ and as he watched Jesus walk by he exclaimed, “Look, here is the Lamb of God!”³⁷ The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus.³⁸ When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” (which translated means Teacher), “where are you staying?”³⁹ He said to them, “Come and see.” They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o’clock in the afternoon.⁴⁰ One of the two who heard John speak and followed him was Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother.⁴¹ He first found his brother Simon and said to him, “We have found the Messiah” (which is translated Anointed).⁴² He brought Simon to Jesus, who looked at him and said, “You are Simon son of John. You are to be called Cephas” (which is translated Peter).

SERMON PREVIEW

An Invitation to Illumination

John 1:29–42 continues the reflection on Jesus' baptism. John the Baptist names Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world and testifies that the Holy Spirit descended on him like a dove. As Jesus passes by, two people follow him. He turns and asks, "What are you looking for?" and invites them to "come and see." After spending time with Jesus, they announce that they have found the Messiah. Their witness draws others to Jesus, including Simon, who will be called Peter, the first named among the twelve disciples.

Questions for reflection:

- What does it mean for John to point away from himself and toward Jesus?
- How do Jesus' questions and invitations shape the beginning of faith in this passage?
- What role does simple testimony play in drawing others to Jesus?
- Where do you see yourself in this story: as one who points, one who follows, or one who is brought along?
