In the Apostles' Creed, the phrase "holy catholic Church" refers to the universal Christian church, not exclusively the Roman Catholic Church. It signifies the belief in a single, unified body of believers across time and space, united by their shared faith in Christ.

During Pentecost there is Holy Communion on the first and third of each month. All who are seeking Christ and his grace are welcome at our communion table.

Today, we will receive Communion by **intinction** (dipping the bread into the wine or juice).

Here is the process:
Approach: Please follow the direction of the ushers to come forward via the center aisle.

Receive the Bread: Extend your hands to receive a piece of bread or a wafer from the minister.

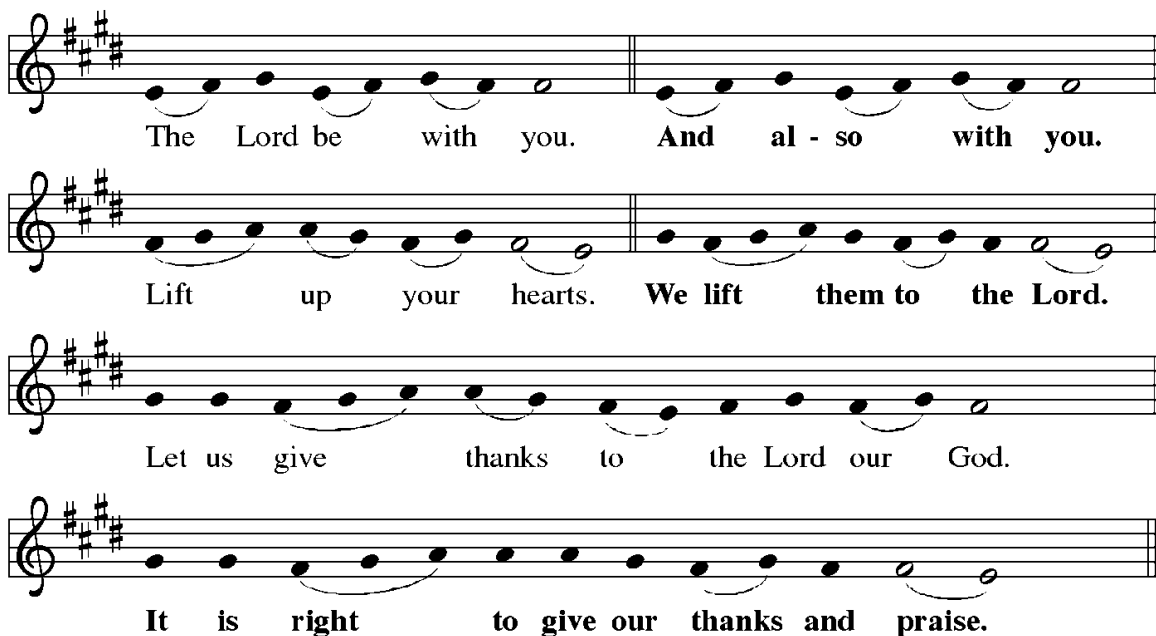
Dip: Hold the bread carefully and dip a portion into the chalice.

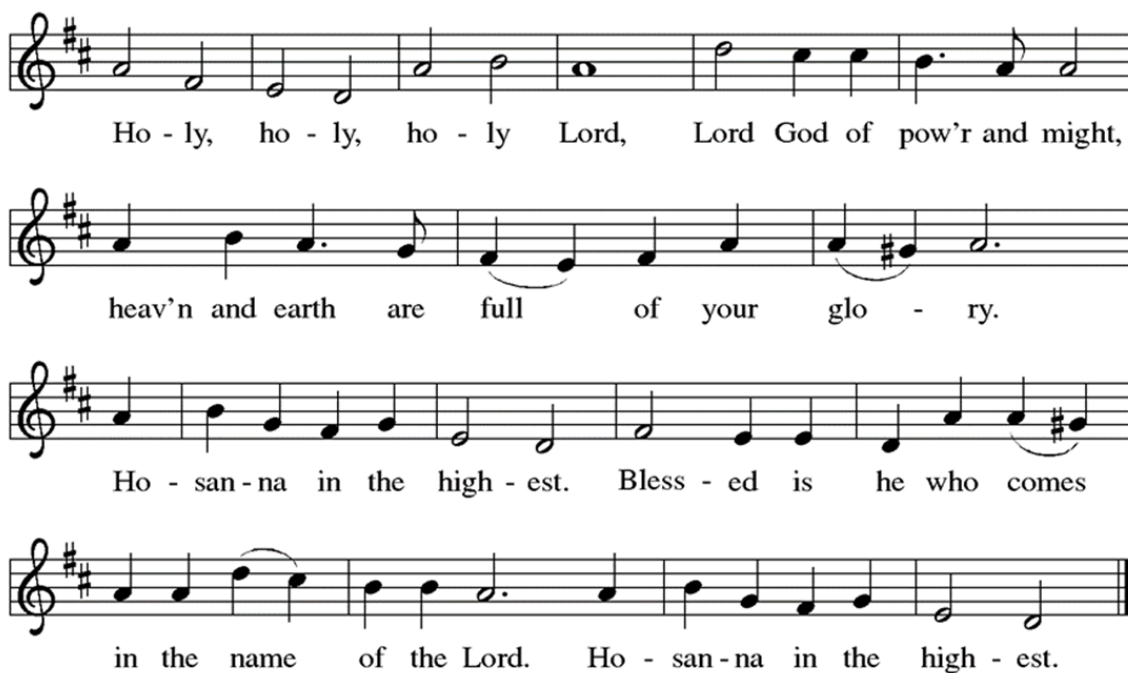

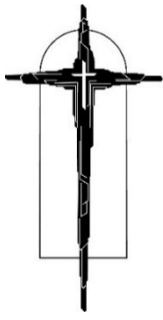
