### **FIRST READING: Acts 2:1-21**

*New Testament 103*

*Pentecost was a Jewish harvest festival that marked the fiftieth day after Passover. Luke portrays the Holy Spirit being poured out upon the disciples before the gathered and astonished people assembled in Jerusalem for the festival. Filled with the Spirit, the disciples were able to witness to the power of Christ's resurrection.*

<sup>1</sup> When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup> And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. <sup>4</sup> All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

<sup>5</sup> Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. <sup>6</sup> And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. <sup>7</sup> Amazed and astonished, they asked, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? <sup>8</sup> And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? <sup>9</sup> Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, <sup>10</sup> Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, <sup>11</sup> Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.” <sup>12</sup> All were

amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?”<sup>13</sup> But others sneered and said, “They are filled with new wine.”

<sup>14</sup> But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, “Fellow Jews and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. <sup>15</sup> Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning. <sup>16</sup> No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

<sup>17</sup> ‘In the last days it will be, God declares,  
that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,  
and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,  
and your young men shall see visions,  
and your old men shall dream dreams.

<sup>18</sup> Even upon my slaves, both men and women,  
in those days I will pour out my Spirit,  
and they shall prophesy.

<sup>19</sup> And I will show portents in the heaven above  
and signs on the earth below,  
blood, and fire, and smoky mist.

<sup>20</sup> The sun shall be turned to darkness  
and the moon to blood,  
before the coming of the Lord’s great and glorious day.

<sup>21</sup> Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.’ ”

# SERMON PREVIEW FOR SUNDAY, MAY 24

In Acts 2, Jesus has just said goodbye to his followers and ascended into heaven. They are uncertain and afraid, enclosed in what we call the Upper Room. Suddenly the Spirit arrives with a loud rush of wind. Tongues of fire descend on each believer. Languages burst open. Boundaries collapse. Strangers hear one another. The crowd is bewildered, astonished, amazed.

Instead of being a vehicle of information or doctrine, Pentecost is an event of holy astonishment.

In this sermon we will sit with two questions: “What if the Spirit’s first work is not making people more certain, but making them newly alive to wonder? What if Pentecost is God disrupting our fearful, self-enclosed lives and opening us again to communion, courage, and joy?”

This sermon reflects on how awe loosens the grip of fear and self-absorption, creates deeper connection, helps us hear one another across division, and opens us to a reality larger than ourselves. In a culture saturated with weariness and distraction but starving for wonder, Pentecost may be the story of God giving the world back to us — alive, radiant, and filled with Spirit.

## Questions for Reflection:

- When was a time you experienced genuine awe — a moment that made your world feel larger, deeper, or more alive?
- In Acts 2, the Spirit interrupts fear and isolation. What fears or forms of self-protection keep us enclosed from one another today?
- The crowd at Pentecost is amazed because people hear one another across barriers of language and culture. Where do we most need that miracle of listening now?
- If Pentecost is about becoming open to a reality larger than fear, control, or self-concern, what might the Spirit be trying to awaken in you now?

## *A Special Note*

Today’s sermon references the book *Awe: The New Science of Everyday Wonder and How It Can Transform Your Life* by Dacher Keltner (Penguin Press, 2023). The author defines awe as *the feeling we experience when we encounter something “vast” that challenges or expands our understanding of the world*. His eight wonders of life are: nature, music, visual art, spirituality and religion, collective experiences (crowds, dance, sports, ritual), moral beauty (acts of courage and compassion), life and death, and deep insights or epiphanies.
