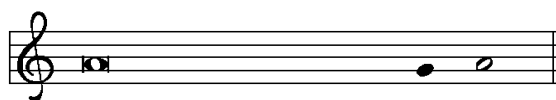

FIRST READING: Ezekiel 33:7-11

Old Testament 758

God appointed Ezekiel as a sentinel for the house of Israel. Ezekiel must faithfully convey God’s warnings to the people. Remarkably, God—who is about to attack Jerusalem—gives a warning with the hope that repentance will make the attack unnecessary.

⁷ So you, mortal, I have made a sentinel for the house of Israel; whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me. ⁸ If I say to the wicked, “O wicked ones, you shall surely die,” and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but their blood I will require at your hand. ⁹ But if you warn the wicked to turn from their ways and they do not turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but you will have saved your life.

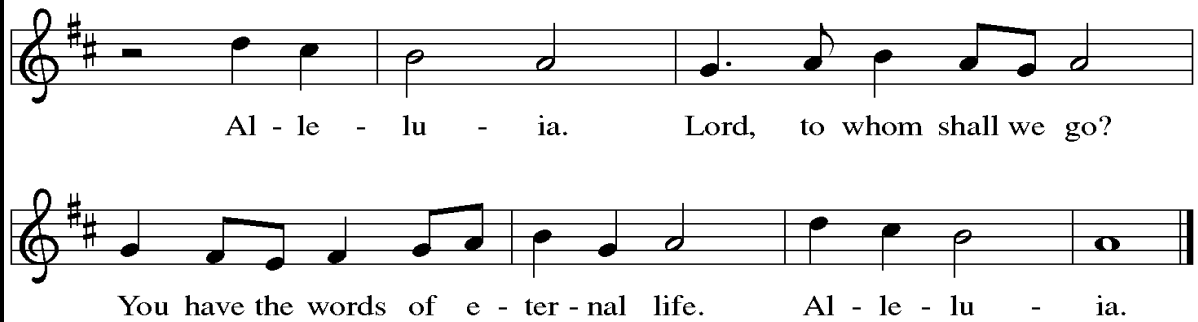
⁸ Owe no one anything, except to love one another, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. ⁹ The commandments, “You shall not commit adultery; you shall not murder; you shall not steal; you shall not covet,” and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” ¹⁰ Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

¹¹ Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is already the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; ¹² the night is far gone; the day is near. Let us then throw off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; ¹³ let us walk decently as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in illicit sex and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. ¹⁴ Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

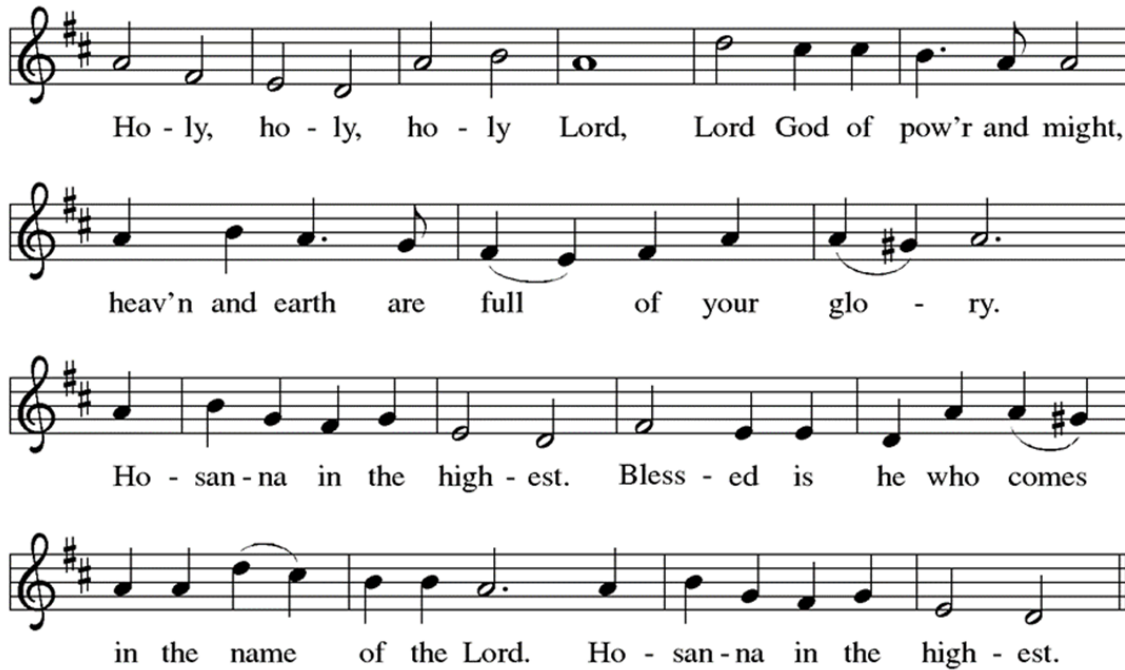

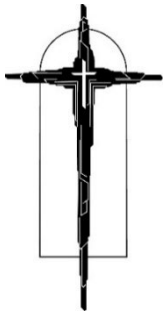

How to Win Over Worry

Matthew 6:25-34

vs. 25: *Do not worry about your life...*

vs. 31: *Do not worry, saying, "What shall we eat..."*

vs. 34: *Do not worry about tomorrow...*

Worry, does not come from problems, worry comes from your heart.

If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? vs. 30 "You of little faith" = Oligopistoi = "little faith one"

Two Ways Not to Fight Worry

1. Psychology
2. Probability

How To Win Over Worry: Eight Statements of Faith

1. My life is more important than any worry.

Is not life more important than... vs. 25

2. I am more valuable than crows.

Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? vs. 26

3. I will stop trying to control the uncontrollable.

Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life? vs. 27

4. I will look and listen to God's creation.

See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these. If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? vs. 28-30

5. I am not a pagan.

So do not worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the pagans run after all these things and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. vs. 31-32

6. I will seek first God's kingdom.

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. vs. 33.

7. I have a relationship with the God of surprises.

*But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. vs. 33
The LORD does whatever pleases him, in the heavens and on the earth, in the seas and all their depths.
Ps 135:6*

8. I will live day by day.

Therefore, do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own. vs. 34
