
On the Feast of All Souls, we pray for the souls of all those who have died. There are many choices of readings for this day, all focusing on our belief in the resurrection of the dead and Jesus' promise of eternal life. The Gospel story of the raising of Lazarus offers us many important insights about this aspect of our faith.

Jesus was good friends Lazarus with and his sisters, Martha and Mary. Lazarus had fallen ill, and Martha and Mary had sent word to Jesus. Jesus delays his journey to them, however, and when he arrives in Bethany, he finds that Lazarus is dead and has been buried for four days.

The scene described at Bethany is a sad one; Lazarus and his family have many friends who have

come to mourn his death. Martha goes out to meet Jesus when he arrives. She cries with him, saying that if Jesus had been there, Lazarus would not have died. Yet she remains confident that God will do whatever Jesus asks. Jesus consoles her with the promise that Lazarus would



rise from the dead. Martha affirms her belief that there will be resurrection of the dead in the last days. Jesus promises her even more; he says that he himself is the Resurrection and the life for all those believe who him. in Martha professes her faith in this, acknowledging that Jesus is Christ, the Son of God.

This is the profession of faith we continue to make, and it is the promise on which we base our hope for eternal life for ourselves and for all those who have died. In his and Resurrection, Jesus has conquered death for all those who believe in him.

We believe that we continue share relationship with who have died. When we

pray for the souls of the faithful departed, we are praying for those whose souls are journeying through purgatory, being prepared for eternal life in heaven. We believe that our prayers for them will help to speed their journey to eternal life with God in heaven.

COLLABORATING WITH OUR NEW MISSIONARY POPE

Somewhat shockingly, however, until May 8, 2025, we had never had a Pope whose vocation in the Church had been to serve the Church's missions to the nations: leaving home and traveling to a far different part of the world to share the Gospel in places where people have not yet heard it or where the Church is too young, too poor, or too persecuted to be self-sufficient.

That was the vocation of Father, and later Bishop, Robert Francis Prevost. As a child, he nourished a priestly vocation through celebrating "Mass" at home on an ironing board, preaching to his forbearing older brothers. He entered an Augustinian high school seminary and continued his formation at the Augustinians' flagship university, Villanova, before officially becoming a novice and making first vows. Living in community with fellow Augustinians, he met several friars who had returned from the Order's missions in Peru, established in 1551, and developed a desire, should God want it, to dedicate himself to that work. He served there for a year in between advanced studies in Rome. After completing his doctorate, he was delighted to be assigned full-time to the missions in Peru for the next decade.

He was then elected by his fellow Augustinians in the United States their prior provincial, or superior, and two years later, the prior general of the nearly 3,000 Augustinians across the globe. The latter position was a different type of missionary work, traveling half the year to the 50 different countries where the Augustinians are trying to reap the Lord's harvest, including the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Kenya, Nigeria, Tanzania, Peru, Argentina, Chile, Colombia, Cuba, Mexico, Panama, Ecuador, India, Korea, Indonesia, the Antilles, the Philippines, strengthening the Order's missionary work and her missionaries.

After 12 years of that service, he returned for a short stint serving his Province in the United States before Pope Francis sent him back as a missionary to Peru, naming him Bishop of Chiclayo and later apostolic administrator of Callao. After nine years, Pope Francis summoned him to Rome to serve as Prefect for the Dicastery of Bishops.

Reflection on the Gospel Reading (John 11:17-27).

As you gather as a family, remember the names of family members or friends who have died. Talk about these people, sharing memories of their lives and their influence on your family. Recall that today is All Souls Day. On this day we remember all those who have died, and we pray for them. Read today's Gospel, John 11:17-27, in which we hear Jesus console his friend Martha after her brother's death. Talk about Jesus' promise of eternal life and our hope of eternal life for all those who have died.
