St. Paul Epistle December 2025

Candles, Community, and Christ

Can you believe that December is already here?! For the church, this means that we are starting a new church year and entering into the season of Advent. November 30 is the fourth Sunday before Christmas this year, so it is the start of the season.

The word Advent comes from Latin, and it means "to come." These weeks before Christmas are a period of waiting for Jesus to come to earth, to be born and laid in a manger.

Perhaps one of the most iconic fixtures of the season of Advent is the Advent wreath: an evergreen wreath affixed with five candles (four for each Sunday in Advent and one Christ candle to light on Christmas). The purpose of an Advent wreath is to ritualistically light one of the candles each Sunday to remember that even in the darkness of winter, we can wait with hope for the Light of the World to come. As each of the candles has a different word and meaning associated with it, we do this waiting knowing that the One who is coming, the Light of the World, is the One who will bring Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love to the world: Jesus Christ.

This period of Advent, or waiting, also mirrors the waiting we do as Christians who await the coming of the Kingdom of God to earth. We spend not only a season waiting, but also lives waiting - anticipating the coming of Christ who is the source of Light and Life.

Something that I find interesting about the Advent candles is that while each has a shorter word that is associated with it, there is also another name or theme that goes alongside it, and that theme is always rooted in relationship: relationship with God and relationship with one another as a Christian community.

The first Sunday in Advent is for the Hope candle, also called the "Prophecy Candle" and it takes us back to Isaiah and the prophet's words of promise of the birth of Christ. This first week in Advent reminds us to be strong in reminding one another of the Hope in the world - reminding one another that even in the darkness, there is light to come in the form of Jesus Christ.

The second Sunday in Advent has the Peace candle, also known as the "Bethlehem Candle." This candle reminds us of the journey - the journey that Mary and Joseph took to Bethlehem, the journey in the Old Testament from a promised land to exile and back, and the journey of life now as we await Christ's return. The end of the journey, or the destination, is one of peace - peace on Earth as Christ has come. This is your reminder that journeys are rarely taken alone. The road is much less arduous when there is someone to lean on, and the destination so much more sweet when there is someone to share it with. Peace isn't for one, but for all - the peace of God in Christ through the Spirit is meant to be shared with the world!

Our third and iconically pink candle is the Joy candle! We also call this candle the "Shepherd's Candle." This candle reminds us of the shepherds who so joyfully made their way to Bethlehem to be witnesses to this Christ child. Sometimes the church calls this Sunday "Gaudete Sunday," which means to rejoice or praise. The angels came to the shepherds to tell them of "good news of great joy," and the shepherds shared that joy with one another and with Mary, Joseph, and Jesus. Joy is not meant to be held alone - it's meant to be shouted about! It's meant

to grow with anticipation and bubble out to all you meet - to rejoice in Christ our Savior, the Source of our joy, is one of the greatest parts about being in a worshipping community.

Our fourth and final candle is the Love candle, also known as the "Angel's Candle." This candle is the reminder of the Angel's announcement of just who is being born for us: "the Messiah, the Lord." God loves us so much that God sent Jesus to live with us. Even as his earthly life came to an end, God in Christ through the Spirit continues to love us instead of forsaking us as we were raised to new life along with Christ. It is a great thing to be so loved by God that God chooses to be close to us. We wait, basking in the promise of great love from God for all of creation. How can we not be like the angels and share this tenderness, care, and love?

So, this Advent, I hope you can take a moment to join us either online for our noon devotions or in-person on Sundays for worship so that together we can explore what it means to be in this season of waiting. As we engage with the traditions of Advent, may we remember that we do so in community, waiting to be drawn closer to God and one another by the coming of the Christ Child, Jesus Christ.




