

The following is Pr. Riley's response to Toby Moore's article that was in the local paper on August 13th. Her response was published.

Do Pray Like You're Begging: A Response to Toby Moore

While I admire the confidence of Toby Moore in his article published on August 13, when it comes to prayer, he got it wrong when he suggests to "pray like it is already yours." Pray like you are begging! In fact, God loves when we pray like we are begging. Just as God loves when we pray with confidence, with hesitation, with certainty, in joy, in thanksgiving, with sorrow, and with anger. Because God loves it when we pray. Full stop.

My main problem with Moore's view on prayer is that there is a way we can get prayer wrong. When we say that there is a wrong way, and therefore, a right way to pray, we diminish the work of God into that of something like a vending machine. A vending machine works so that if we punch in the right numbers and enter the right currency, we will get something from it. The same goes for this view of prayer - that if we do or say the correct things, and pray with the right amount of audacity, then we will achieve a certain result.

But this misses the point of prayer. I agree with Moore when he says that prayer isn't passive. However, the activity in prayer is found in the conversation and relationship that we are building with God, not in a one-sided command. In his piece, Moore cites the story of David and Goliath as evidence in manifestation realized in prayer. David's proclamation to Goliath is one of great faith (1 Samuel 17:45-47). That kind of faith is indeed admirable! To have the conviction to approach a situation, especially one that would leave most shaking in our boots, with such confidence in God is something to be celebrated.

And, there is also validity in the prayers of those with less faith, less certainty, and less confidence. God loves us and wants to be in relationship with us. Wouldn't we, then, approach God similar to the way we do with those we trust and love - those we are in close relationship with? How many times have we picked up the phone to our closest friend after the worst day, spewing the woes of the world, only to leave the conversation feeling better because not only did we share, but we were heard? What a relief it is to be able to approach God in the same way - able to tell God about the joy and the pain of the world, knowing that God not only hears us, but understands us as Jesus Christ, who is fully God and fully human, walked with us so that no matter what we experience, we don't do it alone. God even understands and welcomes our prayers when we have no more words to speak (Romans 8:26).

Prayer isn't about us getting a result or an answer. Prayer is about having a conversation with our Creator, even if that conversation doesn't include any words. God is great enough to hold all of our prayers. When Job screams to God in anger and exasperation, God still holds his prayers and joins in the conversation (Job 40:6–42:6). While the answer is more cosmic than definitive, God does not abandon Job in his time of desperation and does not admonish him for coming to God in his distress.

My last thought is that when we say that we manifest our realities through the confidence of our prayer, it invalidates so many of God's people who pray with massive amounts of earnestness and faith only to achieve a less than ideal result. However, when we reframe prayer to become a relationship-building conversation, we are opened up to the reality that no matter what we are going through, God is with us. In Luke 11:13, after Jesus teaches his disciples the Lord's Prayer, he tells a parable about perseverance in prayer. And at the end of the parable, he reaffirms the goodness of God by saying that despite humanity's shortfallings, God responds with love.

There is no right way to pray. God welcomes relationship with those whom God created (us) and one way to build that relationship is through prayer, no matter what it looks like. God is asking us to trust God with the unknown of our lives, knowing that we have been heard, and to not leave God out of the conversation.

Financial Update for St. Paul Announcement of a Congregational Meeting

Dear St. Paul, we are extremely grateful for your continued generosity and willingness to show up. We continue to tread water, each month we need the previously approved money from the St. Paul Investment Fund to make ends meet.

At the Synod's recommendation, a special Task Force was created to suggest immediate action to provide some breathing space and add a cushion to ensure bills are paid. Its members include Pr. Anthony, Pr. Riley, Brenda N, Patty H, Joyce C, Roger A, John S, and Julie P. This Task Force has recommended to Council to call a congregational meeting to approve using an additional \$50,000 from the St. Paul Investment Fund to meet our projected deficit for 2025. Council approved this recommendation.

A Congregational Meeting of St. Paul Lutheran Church will take place on Sunday, September 14th immediately following worship.

On the agenda we will: Receive an update on our financial status, hear of the joys and accomplishments of the past year, and vote to approve using an additional \$50,000 from the St. Paul Investment Fund.

Please make plans to attend the Congregational Meeting that day. Your voice is important as we work towards sustainable ministry. Please address any comments, questions, or concerns to Pr. Anthony, Pr. Riley, or Council.

Every time we decide to be grateful it will be easier to see new things to be grateful for. Gratitude begets gratitude, just as love begets love.

I'm excited about this and I know it will be life-giving for me.




