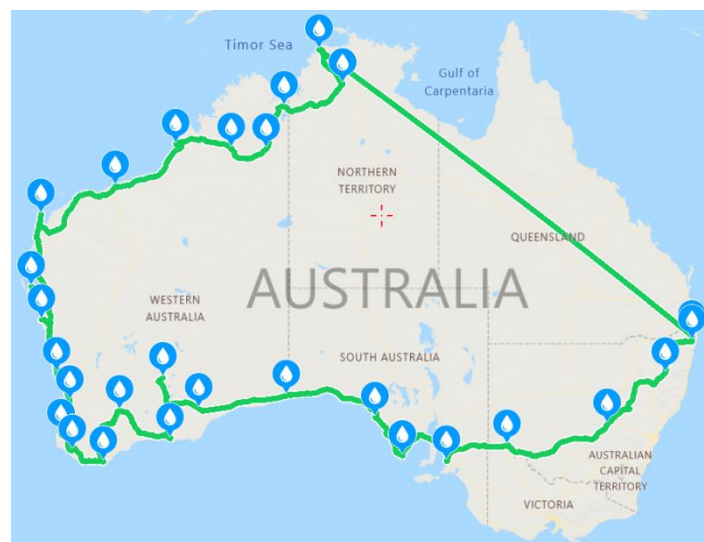

Day 1	Thursday 27th August	Northern Rivers-Darwin	Inflight meals/Dinner
We transfer you to Brisbane Airport for your flight to Darwin where we will transfer you to your hotel where you will meet your coach crew and fellow passengers at a welcome dinner.

Day 2	Friday 28th August	Darwin	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner
This morning, we have a guided tour of Darwin City with informative commentary. Discover the historic sites of Darwin city including the East Point Military Precinct and Stokes Hill Wharf as well as gaining some knowledge and insight into Australia's World War 2 history and the bombing of Darwin, with time to explore the Museum and Art Gallery of the Northern Territory . Enjoy a free afternoon to explore at leisure.			
Day 3	Saturday 29th August	Darwin-Katherine	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner
After departing Darwin, we travel through Litchfield National Park, home to several stunning waterfalls that cascade into crystal clear pools, iconic magnetic termite mounds and clusters of weathered sandstone pillars. During the Second World War, Adelaide River was the headquarters of a large base and the Adelaide River War Cemetery was created especially for the burial of service men and women who died in this part of Australia. Nabilil Dreaming Sunset Dinner Tour Considered the jewel in the crown of the Nitmiluk experience, this is a must-do experience for your stay in Nitmiluk. Sit back, relax, and be transported to a spiritual world of Jawoyn culture and history in tranquil surroundings. Discover the stories and ways of the Jawoyn people against the magnificent backdrop of Nitmiluk Gorge. As the colours change with the setting sun and the night sky emerges, you will enjoy a candlelit, fine dining experience prepared by your onboard chef and delivered by attentive wait staff. Your delectable three course meal features fresh, local, Australian produce cooked onboard and service with a complimentary glass of sparkling wine.

Day 4	Sunday 30th August	Katherine-Kununurra	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner
Today, we head west on the Victoria Hwy. The scenery along the highway as it winds past immense escarpments split by the mighty Victoria River ranks as some of the most stunning in the Territory. The roadhouse has a small shop and an accommodation complex on the banks of the Victoria River with shady camp sites and amenities. Gregory National Park protects the area's colourful scenery featuring grassy plains, boab trees and majestic gorges carved out of sandstone escarpments. The Victoria River is renowned for great fishing and abundant birdlife. On arrival in Kununurra, we'll have a short orientation tour before booking into our accommodation.

Day 5	Monday 31st August	Lake Argyle/Ord River	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner

Lake Argyle and Ord River Cruise: Sit back and relax as we transfer the 70kms from Kununurra to beautiful Lake Argyle. Enjoy commentary about the local area, communities and industries with an experienced driver. Stop at the **Durack Homestead Museum** and learn about this pioneering family before meeting up with your skipper. During your cruise you'll enjoy informative commentary on the natural history and development of Lake Argyle, The Ord River Irrigation System and The Aquaculture Industry. You'll encounter rock wallabies, crocodiles, wallaroos (euros) and the diverse array of birdlife that call Lake Argyle home. After lunch, cross the **Ord Top Dam wall**, see the Ord Hydro-Power Station before boarding the **Triple J Tours boat** for a scenic 55km journey back to Kununurra. Marvel at the spectacular scenery, wildlife, flora and fauna found along the way, including the elusive freshwater crocodile! Take in a colourful East Kimberley sunset on Lake Kununurra before docking at the Marina.



Day 6	Tuesday 1st September	Kununurra-Halls Creek	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner

OPTIONAL EXTRA: Take off in a fixed wing aircraft for an amazing two hour Bungle Bungle air adventure to see the famous Bungle Bungle Range, Lake Argyle and the Ord River Irrigation Area. Be amazed by the patchwork of the Ord Irrigation Area, the mighty Ord River and Spillway Creek. View the Durack Family Homestead and the Ord River Hydro power station in action below the Lake Argyle Dam wall. Be wowed by the incredible size of Lake Argyle! This is where you will appreciate the unbelievable vastness of this freshwater lake. Get your camera ready as the awe- inspiring Bungle Bungle Range with its striped bee hive domes rises 300m out of the desert to meet you. Spot the famous Cathedral Gorge and Piccaninny Gorge as you orbit above. Be fascinated by the site of the Argyle Diamond Mine as we fly above, which until recently was the largest producer of pink and coloured diamonds in the world. After leaving Kununurra, we make our way to Wyndham. From the **Five Rivers Lookout** on the top of the Bastion Range at Wyndham, you can see where five mighty Kimberley rivers meet and flow into the ocean. Enjoy spectacular views of the Ord, Forest, King, Durack and Pentecost Rivers where they combine and enter the Cambridge Gulf, surrounding mangrove swamps & mudflats. We then make our way to Halls Creek, situated in the heart of the Kimberley.

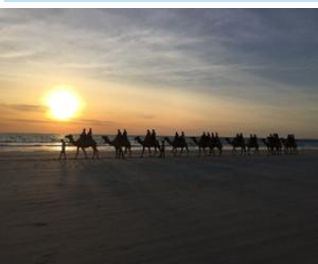

Mimbi Caves Tour: An amazing Kimberley experience, 350 million years in the making. The Gooniyandi people share a strong connection with Mimbi Caves and the surrounding country. It has been both home and a place of spiritual significance for thousands of years. On the tour, your guides will share ancient Dreaming stories about the caves and their importance to the Gooniyandi people. After the tour, you will have the opportunity to cool off in one of the many permanent, freshwater pools near the caves campsite.

Derby is our first stop today. Home of Australia's largest tides, **Derby** is a friendly and historic outback town perched at the edge of the King Sound near the mouth of the mighty Fitzroy River. We check in to our central Broome accommodation to freshen up before departing for the famous **Cable Beach**. **OPTIONAL EXTRA: Sunset Camel Ride.** The sunset camel ride is a relaxing and informative experience along the beautiful white sands of Cable Beach. Watch the awe-inspiring backdrop of the sun setting over the Indian Ocean, from atop your camel.

Today you have two options. **OPTION 1:** A visit to **Willie Creek Pearl farm** is included in your tour price. On this tour you will gain a unique insight into the fascinating process of modern pearl farming, from shell to showroom. See the inner workings of an operating commercial pearl farm and discover exactly what makes the perfect pearl. You will leave Willie Creek Pearl Farm as a pearling expert! Cruise the calm azure waters and view live oysters suspended in their natural environment amongst the spectacular native flora and fauna.

OPTION 2: OPTIONAL EXTRA: Experience the incredible Horizontal Falls and pristine beauty of the Kimberley with a half-day tour. Enjoy low level flying over the amazing islands of the Buccaneer Archipelago and Cape Leveque before your seaplane lands safely in the calm waters of Talbot Bay. Your tour continues with an exciting cruise through the Horizontal Waterfalls, plus a relaxed island cruise followed by the shark show and swim in the marine viewing platform. **This tour is dependent on favourable tides – we can confirm this option closer to departure.**

After leaving Broome, we travel through a very remote area with only a couple of roadhouses along the way. We call in at Eighty Mile Beach, a 220-kilometre long, uninterrupted beach, renowned for its stunning natural beauty and a popular destination for fishing, shell collecting, and camping.

We have an early start today. Our morning tea stop is at the town of **Karratha** which adjoins the port of **Dampier** in the Pilbara region. After a lunch stop at Nanutarra Roadhouse, we leave the National Hwy to make our way up the **North West Cape** to the town of **Exmouth**, a small resort town and gateway to nearby Ningaloo Marine Park with its coral reefs, colourful fish and migratory whale sharks. Nearly surrounding Exmouth, Cape Range National Park has kangaroos, sheer cliffs and red, rocky gorges.

Explore the coral gardens of **Ningaloo Reef on the Coral Explorer glass-bottom boat cruise**. Discover the incredible coral gardens of Ningaloo Reef through large glass panels only inches below your toes. The open aired Glass Bottom Boat means you can see above AND below. With engaging and informative commentary by friendly and experienced crew. On the journey to and from the reef, you have an opportunity to see the **Mildura Shipwreck** and take in the breathtaking "birds-eye" views of the Ningaloo Reef from the historical **Vlamingh Head Lighthouse Lookout**.

We have a stop in **Coral Bay**, a marine-lovers paradise and one of WA's premier family holiday destinations. Named Coral Bay due to the beautiful coral gardens which lie mere metres from the pristine white sandy beach, this tiny, laidback seaside location is a must-visit destination for nature

lovers. Coral Bay is all about the water and the coast, and it's hard not to fall in love with the picturesque town. Carnarvon is our lunch stop. **Carnarvon** is a prosperous service town and holiday destination famed for its produce with the rich flats of the Gascoyne River being used to grow a huge variety of fruits and vegetables. This afternoon, we enter the **World Heritage listed Shark Bay Region**, noted for being one of the world's greatest wilderness treasures.

We leave early this morning for **Monkey Mia**, home to one of Australia's most famous wildlife encounters. Bottlenose dolphins have been visiting the beach at Monkey Mia for more than 40 years after local fishers began sharing their catch with some local dolphins. On the way into Kalbarri, we'll stop at the **Kalbarri Skywalk** which offers breathtaking views of the Murchison River gorge and the spectacular surrounding landscape. You will feel like you are floating on air as you take a thrilling walk out along two cantilevered viewing platforms that hang in mid-air 100m high above the gorge. **Nature's Window** is one of WA's most iconic natural attractions, formed from layers of tumblagooda sandstone. The natural rock formation perfectly frames the rugged upstream view of the Murchison River.

Kalbarri National Park Coastal Cliffs: The Kalbarri coastline has some amazing views as the cliff edge drops dramatically into the ocean some 100m below. We explore some of these this morning, including Red Bluff Lookout, Pot Alley, the Natural Bridge and Island Rock Lookout. **Hutt Lagoon Pink Lake** at Port Gregory is an iconic sight along the Coral Coast Hwy. We'll enjoy a picnic lunch along the Geraldton waterfront before visiting the magnificent **HMAS Sydney Memorial**. Late this afternoon, we arrive in Cervantes, home to beautiful white sandy beaches and turquoise waters teeming with marine life.

Today is set aside for searching for wildflowers. We visit Buntine, Three Springs, Perenjori and Lesuer National Park, all known for their magnificent wildflower displays.

Day 17	Saturday 12th September	Cervantes	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner

This morning, we take a magical **Sea Lion tour** to the islands around Cervantes to see one of the world's rarest seals. Upon arrival at the Cervantes Islands, we head into shore, as the Sea Lions begin to stir. These unique and playful creatures will jump and somersault out of the water and entertain you for hours. **Swimming is permitted with snorkel sets available on board. There is an "Enter At Own Risk" policy for any passengers wanting to swim. If you wish to swim, please ensure you book a 'swimming' ticket (optional extra – no additional cost).** After the cruise, we enjoy lunch at the **Lobster Shack** where you can sample the local fresh lobster. This afternoon, we visit the famous **Pinnacles of Nambung National Park** which are natural limestone structures, dating back 25,000-30,000 years!

Experience the magnificent architecture, the cultural and historic heritage, the art galleries and museum, join a spiritual retreat, take in the serenity of the bushland setting, taste the delectable New Norcia food, wine and ale or just to walk around the town and enjoy the peace and beautiful serenity on a guided tour at **New Norcia, Australia's only monastic town**. On our way into Perth, we drive through Toodyay, an historic town in the picturesque Avon Valley.

Today is a free day in Perth. We recommend you plan your day prior to departing the Northern Rivers. You may like to relax around the resort, take a cruise to Rottnest Island, cruise through the Swan Valley, catch up on some shopping in the CBD. The Perth Explorer Hop On Hop Off Bus departs from our hotel.

Day 20	Tuesday 15th September	Perth Sightseeing	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner

We have a local company to take us on a tour of the sights of Perth and Fremantle today. Starting in Perth, the tour takes in all major attractions of the revitalised Perth CBD, passing Western Australian Cricket Ground (WACA) and Optus Stadium. Then on to Kings Park Botanical Gardens, where you have the opportunity to view wildflowers or take in the stunning views from the war memorial looking back over the city skyline. Continue through the affluent Western Suburbs of Perth, known as Millionaire's Row, passing by Cottesloe Beach where the Indian Ocean sparkles. Travel on into historic Fremantle, viewing the impressive facades of this heritage listed city including a brief stop. Return to Perth on a **Swan River Cruise**.

Day 21	Wednesday 16th September	Perth-Busselton	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner

We visit some unusual sights today. First, is **Wellington Dam**, the South West's largest dam and built to supply the Collie River Irrigation District. It is also the second largest man-made reservoir in Western Australia, Lake Argyle is the largest. The standout attraction is a giant mural painted across the dam surface - the biggest dam mural in the world. **Gnomesville** is one of those places that everyone is curious to explore and has been discussed all over the world. You will be amazed! Then, we travel to **Busselton Jetty**. Sit back and relax while **the train** driver takes you on a 1.7 kilometre journey across the calm, clear waters of **Geographe Bay** to the **Underwater Observatory**. As you descend deeper beneath the waves, a world of natural wonders unfolds below the Jetty. Inside the 9.5-metre diameter observation chamber, 11 viewing windows offer unique vantage points to observe the piles that create Australia's largest artificial reef. Here you will learn about the vibrant forest of tropical and sub-tropical corals, sponges, fish, and fascinating invertebrates that live in Geographe Bay.

Margaret River, Caves & Cape Leeuwin Lighthouse Tour: Known as one of Australia's finest wine regions, the Margaret River region is an area blessed with natural beauty. Providing a diverse range of activities, this tour allows you to experience this high-profile Western Australian area in one

day. Visit **Mammoth Cave**, a fascinating natural time capsule, home to ancient fossil remains of long-extinct Megafauna; Cape Leeuwin, the most south-westerly point of Australia, with Cape Leeuwin Lighthouse being the tallest lighthouse on mainland Australia; a local Margaret River brewery or winery for a lunch featuring the local produce and complimentary beer or wine tastings.

Day 23	Friday 18th September	Busselton-Albany	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner
Today, we drive through towering marri, jarrah, karri and tingle forests. We stop for morning tea at Pemberton , popular for canoeing, fishing, swimming, bushwalking and mountain biking. And totally different scenery is the spectacular coastal scenery of Greens Pool , famous for its large granite boulders, green turquoise water and white sandy beach. Our lunch stop is the charming town of Denmark , surrounded by a striking natural backdrop of native woodland, green farmland and the rugged south coast.

Day 24	Saturday 19th September	Albany	B*fast/Dinner
Albany’s Historic Whaling Station is the only experience of its kind in the world. Explore an intact whale processing factory and whale chasing ship – fully restored and ready for you to discover. The Cheynes Beach Whaling Company was the last whaling company to cease operations in Australia, closing in 1978. It is now home to an interactive museum on whales and whaling. Explore the stunning scenery of Torndirrup National Park which is home to a range of spectacular natural wonders including the Gap and Natural Bridge which have been formed over hundreds of years by the ocean eroding a large gap in one rock face and a natural arch in another. We head to Middleton Beach where you can purchase lunch.			

Day 25	Sunday 20th September	Albany-Hyden	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner
We head north today through Lake Grace and Kulin to the Tin Horse Hwy . One of Australia’s most iconic natural land formations ‘Wave Rock’, attracts thousands of visitors each year. On the route to Wave Rock (Hyden), you will find the vibrant country town of Kulin which has become the home of a unique tourist destination. Kulin entertains its visitors with a fun and exciting collection of colourful characters invented and created by the residents of this small farming community. The dusty paddocks have become a living gallery of bright, quirky, community creations. The Tin Horse Highway provides a seriously entertaining tourist drive and a fun alternative route through to iconic Wave Rock.

Day 26	Monday 21st September	Hyden-Esperance	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner
	Before leaving Hyden, we’ll visit the famous Wave Rock , rising 15 metres from the ground and more than 100 metres long, and looking like a giant surf wave of multicoloured granite about to crash onto the bush below. It’s believed this amazing formation was more than 2,700 million years in the making. We’ll stop for lunch and to view the Ravensthorpe Silo Art on our way to Esperance, one of the most visually captivating places in the country.

Day 27 **Tuesday 22nd September** **Esperance**

And today, we visit many of the beaches that are truly captivating. First, we travel to Cape Le Grand National Park. This pristine park is known for its stunning scenery and idyllic beaches with landscape changing from massive granite outcrops to freshwater pools and unbelievably white sandy beaches with views over many islands. In spring the Park bursts into colour as wildflowers bloom, including groves of banksia. Our time in the Park includes Hellfire Bay, Thistle Cove, Lucky Bay and Whartons Beach which feature regularly in the list of the world’s best beaches. Our lunch today is at Condingup Tavern before returning to Esperance for a walk on the magnificent Twilight Beach.



Day 28	Wednesday 23rd September	Esperance-Kalgoorlie	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner
Our northern journey takes us through Norseman and Kambalda where we visit the Red Hill Lookout for a bird’s eye view of the massive salt lake, Lake Lefroy. We’ll continue on to Kalgoorlie, arriving early afternoon with a short orientation tour on arrival. After booking into our central accommodation, we’ll have time to explore the town on foot.

Day 29	Thursday 24th September	Kalgoorlie-Balladonia	B*fast/Lunch/Dinner
Throw on a high visibility vest and safety glasses and come and experience a tour of Australia’s largest gold producing mine, the Super Pit . You will be visitor inducted to the KCGM Super Pit and view the mining and milling operations through the Fimiston Milling Plant from the safety of the Mine-Spec Bus. Be amazed by the size of the 793 dump trucks as we travel along the haul roads on site with the trucks. The view of the Super Pit from Harvey Hut will take your breath away as you see the old miner’s workings with old shafts and view the modern mining machinery working in the pit. Your tour guide has a passion for showing visitors to Kalgoorlie Boulder the best possible experience, they have a wealth of knowledge and are more than happy to answer any questions you may have while on the tour. We travel then through Norseman to Balladonia, our first stop as we cross the Nullarbor Plain.

Our first leg today, takes in Australia’s longest straight stretch of road being the “90 Mile Straight”. From Madura Pass, our elevation reduces by over 100m to the Roe Plains and we rise again at Eucla.

What a different coastline today! **The Bunda Cliffs** are one of the most awe-inspiring sea cliffs in the world and are a dramatic display of the edge of the Australian continent. They will enchant the travellers' eyes and make their visit utterly memorable. **Southern Right Whales at Head of Bight** take up 'residence' for an entire 5 month period between June and October and generally remain within a 15km long section of coast. From the boardwalk you can marvel at the lopping, diving, spy hopping and slow motion somersaults of these majestic whales. See these magnificent, endangered creatures mate and calve in the nursery waters or simply watch them arrive from Antarctic waters with humpback whales. If you listen carefully you may even hear the moaning of the Southern Right Whales as they swim within the bay.

Before departing Streaky Bay, we drive the **Cape Bauer Loop** – a scenic coastal adventure. Discover the rugged beauty of the Cape Bauer Loop, a breathtaking coastal drive along the Great Australian Bight. This scenic route offers spectacular ocean vistas, unique geological features, and fantastic photo opportunities. We continue along the magnificent south coast to Port Lincoln.

Port Lincoln Untamed Adventure: Wind your way along a slice of Australia's most breathtaking coastline, encountering abundant wildlife, secluded pockets of paradise and seafood sourced from the surrounding waters along the way. Roam, where the bush rolls into the sea at one of the Eyre Peninsula's famed beaches, then meander along an iconic stretch of coastline where rugged cliffs give way to the sapphire ocean below. This tour is designed for active seniors and it is an essential requirement that each passenger be able to negotiate coach steps without the aid of our crew or other non-related passengers. No passenger will be permitted to continue on the tour while their mental or physical condition is such as to render them incapable of caring for themselves. As part of our ongoing commitment to delivering safe and enjoyable travel experiences, we encourage passengers to ensure they are fit to undertake the activities and travel outlined in our tour itineraries. If unsure, passengers should enquire with our staff at the time of booking. Where a passenger is unsure of their fitness to travel, they should consult a doctor for advice prior to booking travel. Passengers who take regular medication should ensure they carry enough to cover their daily requirements for the duration of the tour.

MOBILITY

- ❖ Walking is a fundamental part of this tour and as such, requires, at the minimum, a moderate level of fitness. You will be expected to walk and stand for extended periods, including walking upstairs unaided and climbing hills and walking over uneven ground including soft sand. If you choose to book this tour and don't meet the mobility requirements, you must expect that you will not be able to participate in all tours, attractions and activities. Walking aids are not suitable for this tour.
- ❖ Get on and off transportation multiple times unaided.
- ❖ Downstairs rooms and walk-in showers are not available in some locations and cannot be guaranteed in others.
- ❖ You **must** be able to manage your own luggage to and from allocated rooms, which could be upstairs or some distance to walk, without assistance from our crew or other passengers.

- ❖ **Accommodation** will be a variety of motel/hotel style rooms. We use 4/5 star venues wherever possible, or the best available in remote locations. All will have private ensuites.
