## 8 Days of History, Highland Fanfare & Scenic Splendour

<b>Day 1</b>	<b>Monday 13<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Northern Rivers-Argenton: Rolling South</b>	<b>LD</b>
Departing from the lush Northern Rivers, our journey begins with a scenic drive south, cutting through rolling farmland and leafy ranges. By evening, we settle into the welcoming Macquarie 4 Star Hotel in Argenton, nestled on the bank of Cockle Creek. A restful night sets the tone for the cultural riches ahead. <b>Day 2</b>	<b>Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Argenton-Canberra: Capital Bound</b>	<b>BLD</b>
We continue our adventure toward the nation's capital — Canberra — a city of wide boulevards, grand institutions, and stories carved into sandstone. This is a day for travel and anticipation, with time to settle into our accommodation and prepare for two full days of exploration in the heart of Australian governance and remembrance. <b>Day 3</b>	<b>Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Canberra: Democracy, Remembrance, City Views</b>	<b>BLD</b>
		Today begins with a tour of Parliament House, where marble pillars and modern design meet the pulse of national decisions. Morning tea can be enjoyed at the Queen's Terrace Café, before a scenic drive to Mt Ainslie Lookout, offering postcard-perfect views over Canberra's geometric cityscape. Lunch awaits at the tranquil Poppy's Café, followed by an afternoon immersed in reverence at the Australian War Memorial. We explore the highlights before pausing for the emotive Last Post Ceremony, a solemn daily tradition that honours Australia's fallen.	
<b>Day 4</b>	<b>Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Canberra: Stories of a Nation</b>	<b>BLD</b>
We begin at the National Museum of Australia, where ancient Indigenous culture meets contemporary storytelling. Morning tea is your choice at the museum's café before we explore history from another perspective at Old Parliament House — once the beating heart of the nation's political scene. After a relaxed lunch at the National Gallery of Australia, we depart with minds full of stories and eyes full of iconic architecture.			
<b>Day 5</b>	<b>Friday 17<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Canberra-Goulburn: Science &amp; Shiraz</b>	<b>BLD</b>
The day begins with wonder at Questacon, Canberra's interactive science centre — perfect for minds young and curious at heart. After a hands-on morning, we travel north into wine country for lunch at Lake George Winery, framed by rolling vineyards and views that stretch forever. Our evening brings us to Goulburn, nestled in the Southern Highlands, where cool-climate elegance and garden charm await. Accommodation: Mercure Goulburn 2 nights			
<b>Day 6</b>	<b>Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Bundanoon Gathering: Bagpipes &amp; Highland Fling</b>	<b>BD</b>
			
<b>Day 7</b>	<b>Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Goulburn-Gloucester; A Change of Pace</b>	<b>BLD</b>
After breakfast, the journey begins with a scenic drive to Bowral. With time to explore boutique shops and enjoy a morning treat, this elegant Southern Highlands town offers a lovely pause. Next, it's on to Mt Annan Botanic Gardens, where a picnic lunch is enjoyed among native blooms and peaceful surroundings—a refreshing midday retreat. The road north continues through rolling countryside, before arriving in Gloucester. Surrounded by mountains and farmland, this welcoming town is the perfect place to relax over dinner and settle in for the night. Accommodation: Bucketts Way Motel			
<b>Day 8</b>	<b>Monday 20<sup>th</sup> April</b>	<b>Gloucester-Northern Rivers: Homeward Bound</b>	<b>BL</b>
Today, we travel back to the Northern Rivers, bringing home a heart full of memories — from the solemnity of the Last Post to the spirited skirl of the Highland pipes.
