Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

On July 6, 1415, 610 years ago, John Hus was burned at the stake for the crimes of heresy against the church. In that period of time, heresy was on of the worst crimes you could be convicted of. Heresy is, according to dictionary.com, "an opinion or doctrine at variance with the orthodox or accepted doctrine, especially of a church or religious system." So, what were these heresies that caused such a harsh sentence of judgement to be passed down on Hus?

Well, he would conduct the mass in the local language, Czech. See, at that time all services had to be conducted in Latin. Imagine if you came to church one Sunday and I conducted the entire worship in Latin. Also, Hus began to translate the bible into the Czech language as well. Imagine coming to bible study and I gave you a bible written in Japanese to read.

Hus allowed the congregation to sing in the hymns that were sung in the course of worship. Only professional choirs of men were allowed to sing, of course, in Latin. Now, as Moravians, we couldn't imaging going to church and not singing, but what would you think if there was a service in which there was no music to sing?

Did I mention that Hus also began to preach to people in Czech. Imaging coming to worship on Sunday and I gave a sermon completely in Mandarin Chinese. That's what it must've felt like to go to church in the days of Hus. The common people couldn't understand or have a connection to God in worship.

But, maybe the most egregious affront that Hus committed was to share the Cup of Christ with the congregation. It was mandated by the church that the congregation could only receive the Bread of Christ and not the Cup. Why? Well, the church didn't think ordinary people couldn't understand the concept of the Blood of Christ. Hus thought that was ridiculous. He thought that the Last Supper that Jesus shared with his disciples in that upper room during Passover was to be shared in its entirety by everyone, not just a select few.

These "heresies" lead to his demise at the stake. However, the fire was lit in the people who followed and agreed with Hus would not be quenched. And, on March 1, 1457, the founding of the Unitas Fratrum, the forbearers of the Renewed Moravian Church would continue Hus' cause for reform and the spread of the Gospel to everyone, everywhere, and everyplace. As we gather to commemorate his martyrdom, let us remember the sacrifice that Hus made on our behalf. For if it wasn't for Jan Hus, we wouldn't be the Moravian Church we are a part of today.
