NEW HIRES IN ENERGY SOFTWARE FIRMS A Rockwood Report



Summary

In the last 12 months, the 49 firms in our survey hired 615 people. That represents 6% of the 10,500 people on staff. After deducting summer interns (49), the percentage dropped to 5%.

The survey covered firms with less than 1000 people working for firms that focus on energy applications.

Data came from analysis of LinkedIn profiles of companies and staff. Since LI profiles are voluntary, the results are lower than in real life, but we don't know what that difference might be.

The report is still valuable since it reflects the roles of people being hired under market conditions.

Here's a summary table in decreasing order of total headcount.

Survey Methodology/Comments

Period of time covered: August 1, 2024 to July 31, 2025

Used LI data for people. That data is created voluntarily by the person. The minimum response rate for people is thought to be 50%, but since getting a new job is celebrated, the response rate is more than that. How high is unknown.

The size of the company workforce is a LinkedIn number from LI Sales Navigator.

Classifications are done by title and by review of the people's data.

Titles like "Consultant" are ambiguous, but in the world of high tech software, the title is probably tilted toward customer support (as in ETRM systems).
