WELCOMING NEW MEMBERS

Overview

Once a player has made the decision to join your club, you need to ensure they have a great experience so they become a member for life. Use Welcome Packs to introduce your club fully to new players, and create a Buddy System to use existing members to help integrate them into the club.

Brief Summary

- Create a welcome pack to introduce new members to your club
- 2. A new member will always have a lot of questions so include as much information about the club and its activities as you can
- You may also like to include other free perks like a bar voucher or coupon they can give to another non-member friend of a free court hire
- 4. Set up a Buddy System where existing members will 'buddy up' with a new member and help integrate them into club life
- Make sure you have regular contact with new members and help them get the most out of their membership. This will assist in retaining them long term

Key Points

- A new member will always have a lot of questions which they may be afraid to ask, so a welcome
 pack is a good way to supply them as much information as possible to allow them to make the
 most of their membership, and ultimately remain a member
- 2. Include information about the club such as your programme schedule, contact details of other members, coaching opportunities, membership benefits, social events, competitions, and more
- 3. You may also like to include other perks like a free drink from the bar, a Pro Shop discount voucher, or a coupon they can give to another non-member friend for a free court hire. Some clubs even go as far as offering new members a free coaching lesson. These create great opportunities to get them to test out your club's services and to encourage them to introduce others to the club straight away.
- 4. Use a 'Squash Buddy' who ideally is a current, established club member around the same age and level who can help integrate the new member into the club
- 5. This person can be a first point of call for the new member and can help introduce them to other club members, making this process a lot less daunting and far more enjoyable. Some clubs will nominate a particular person at their club as the 'New Member Liaison' who will perform this duty for all new members.
