

Is this the rarest honey on earth?

To most people honey is just another Premium Raw Honey spread on the supermarket shelf, nestled somewhere between the jams and peanut butter. But not this honey.

For a start, this honey comes from Kangaroo Island, a pristine, GM free, bee sanctuary 13 kilometres off the coast of South Australia.

Kangaroo Island is the oldest bee sanctuary in the world and home to the purest Ligurian bees on Earth. Renowned for their gentle nature, they were brought to the island in the 1880s, protected by a special act of parliament in 1885 and have been fortunate to avoid most of the diseases and contaminants that have affected other bees around the world.

This particular variety of honey was collected by the bees in 2019 from flowering gum trees called **Eucalyptus Remota** that only grow in one location on the planet: the western end of Kangaroo Island. But if that wasn't special enough, nearly all these trees were destroyed by the bushfires on the island in 2020 and will now take up to 7 years to fully regenerate.

You won't find this honey in a single supermarket, or store, anywhere in the world. There is simply not enough to go around. The limited quantity of jars have been hand packed on Kangaroo Island and they are only available in 300 gram numbered bottles from one website, ours.

As you can imagine, this honey has an authentic, pure, beautiful flavour. But taste isn't the only benefit provided by these unique bees. They also make propolis, a natural substance shown in University of Sydney research to be effective in the treatment of human cancer cells. Further investigation is being undertaken to determine the therapeutic benefits.

This honey is a rare and special treat, to be enjoyed, shared, or sent as a unique gift to friends and family around the world. Or you may choose to just keep it. Honey is the only food that doesn't need or have an expiry date. Edible honey was found in Egyptian tombs.

So, while honey lasts forever, this one will disappear very quickly.

Remarkable Rocks, Flinders Chase National Park

Be amazed by Remarkable Rocks

Located high on a cliff in Flinders Chase National Park, this compelling cluster of curved and jagged rocks were worn smooth by wind and waves over 500 million years. The natural forms are huge, sculptural and very much loved by photographers. The granite boulders have a striking golden-red patina owing to lichen growing on their surface.



Ravine des Casoars

Do one of Australia's most spectacular walks

The Kangaroo Island Wilderness Trail is one of Australia's newest and most spectacular wilderness trails. The five-stage, 61-kilometre walk traverses extraordinary and little-seen coastal scenery and can be done in sections or as a single trek. Together with a licensed guide, you'll encounter many of the region's famous landmarks and witness nature continuing its remarkable come-back after the 2020 bushfire.

Drink in the scenery

Distilleries, cellar doors and breweries are springing up all over the east of Kangaroo Island. KI Spirits has won international awards for spirits layered with local botanicals; Kangaroo Island Brewery operates out of a gorgeous, repurposed shed; and the island's six cellar doors blend their distinctive wines and ciders with intimate bush settings and eye-opening cliff-top locales.



Little Sahara Adventure Centre, Vivonne Bay

Surf the dunes of Little Sahara


The field of dunes in Little Sahara rises to some 70 metres above sea-level – which is a bit like standing on top of a four-storey building! At the entrance to the dune area you'll find the Little Sahara Adventure Centre where you can hire special toboggans and sandboards. You'll need a little knowledge and a bit of bee's wax (both supplied at the centre), but it won't be long before you're zipping down the dunes and shredding the sands. Huge fun.

EXPLORE

MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR VISIT TO KI

Kangaroo Island is 155 kilometres long and 55 kilometres wide. It's well-served with a sealed highway, but the eight regions are rustic in nature and gentle in temperament, with a full third of the island's 4400 square kilometres given over to national park.

The trick is not to underestimate the size of KI and to make sure you give yourself plenty of time - ideally a week - to discover its many charms.
















NORTH COAST

Incorporating Emu Bay, Smith Bay, Cape Cassini, Stokes Bay, Snelling Beach, Middle River and Western River Cove

The magnificent North Coast, with rolling hills and secluded bays, is a lesstravelled part of the island. **Expect dramatic scenery** and sublime beaches.



KINGSCOTE & SURROUNDS

PENNESHAW & DUDLEY PENINSULA

Incorporating Penneshaw, Island Beach, Baudin Cape Willoughby and Antechamber Bay

Dudley Peninsula houses the seaside village of Penneshaw, the sleepy hamlet of Baudin Beach, 'millionaire's row' at Island Beach and magnificent Cape Willoughby and

GETTING HERE

By ferry: Two service providers operate daily between Cape Jervis on the Fleurieu Peninsula (two hours' drive south of Adelaide) and Penneshaw. SeaLink vehicle and passenger ferries depart at least four times daily; the crossing takes 45 minutes. Kangaroo Island Connect runs a high-speed passenger ferry twice daily; it takes 30 minutes.

By air: Qantas Link operates daily 30-minute flights from Adelaide Airport to Kangaroo Island (Kingscote) Airport.

By coach: Mainland coach return connections are available twice daily to/from Adelaide to Cape Jervis from the Central Bus Station.

GETTING AROUND

Two-wheel-drives are suitable for use on the island's many unsealed roads, however some visitors prefer to use a 4WD. Take your own vehicle via the SeaLink ferry or pick up a Budget or Hertz Rent-A-Car from Kangaroo Island Airport or Penneshaw. Kangaroo Island Connect also has a range of hire cars, from small SUVs to 12-seater buses and campervans from Penneshaw. There is no public transport service, however transport services are available from KI 24/7 Bus Charters and Kangaroo Island Transfers.

SLOW DOWN!

Island life was never meant to be hurried. And please always remember, island wildlife is wild: the best way to see native animals is to slow down, stop and take notice!



Day One: Arrive on Kangaroo Island

Walk the new Kangaroo Island Sculpture Trail in Penneshaw. Featuring works from some of the country's finest artists, the trail meanders through ancient blackthorn and enjoys fine views.

Meet Rob and his Kelpie dogs as they put on a demonstration of shearing at his farm near Penneshaw. For lunch, enjoy a delicious pizza and a wine-tasting at Dudley Wines, while looking back to mainland Australia. Then join a guided tour of South Australia's first lighthouse at Cape Willoughby Conservation Park.

Enjoy a late afternoon wine-tasting and platters sitting amongst the gum trees at False Cape.

Day Two: Explore the South Coast

Ready for an action-packed day? Get hands-on at Raptor Domain with either the Birds of Prey display or the Fang-tastic show featuring lizards and snakes. Then join a guide for a beach-walk through a wild sea lion colony at Seal Bay Conservation Park. And don't miss hiring a sandboard, toboggan or fat-tyre bike to experience the thrills and spills of the spectacular white sand dunes of Little Sahara.

After a whiting burger at the Vivonne Bay General Store, discover the beauty of Vivonne Bay, voted one of Australia's most beautiful beaches. Take a stroll on the jetty, watch the fishermen unload their catch, and walk to Point Ellen to watch the Southern Ocean breakers rolling in. If you've still got the energy, KI Outdoor Action can have you exploring the bush at twilight on quad bikes.

Day Three: Flinders Chase National Park

Pack a large picnic – you have a long day among some of Australia's most fabulous wilderness attractions! Explore Kelly Hill Caves on the road into Famous Flinders Chase. Stop at Hanson Bay Wildlife Sanctuary for a guided koala walk and bushfire ecology tour. Continue to Remarkable Rocks, a grouping of majestic granite boulders carved by nature, standing like sentinels over the Southern Ocean. Watch the fierce ocean swells at Admirals Arch (a natural archway framing

long-nosed fur seals basking on a rocky shoreline), discover Weirs Cove and be in awe of lighthouse life at Cape Du Couedic.

Day Four: Wildlife on the **North Coast**

At Kangaroo Island Wildlife Park, you can cuddle a koala or get up close to a snake, plus see a wide range of Kangaroo Island's rare and special species. At Stokes Bay. clamber through the group of limestone boulders to reach the hidden beach, a fine, white, sandy beach protected by cliffs. Enjoy lunch at the Rockpool Café. Spare some time also to see Snelling Beach, and round the day out at Emu Bay - five kilometres of sweeping sand, loved by locals who drive on the beach to reach their sunset fishing spots.

Day Five: Sample local produce in and around Cygnet River

Take a guided tour at Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery, the only commercial distillery still in operation in South Australia, and afterwards enjoy lunch from the café on the deck. Do a tour of a working honey factory and learn about the island's unique species of Ligurian Bees at Island Beehive or Clifford's Honey Farm.

Alternatively, take lunch at Emu Bay Lavender Farm before exploring the Cygnet River Artisan Trail. You'll sample premium wine at Islander Estate and Springs Road Wines.

Round the day off tasting the gins, vodkas and liqueurs at KI Spirits. South Australia's original boutique distillery using native Australian Botanicals and locally grown or sourced ingredients.

Day Six: Marine encounters

Take a morning swim with a pod of up to 100 wild dolphins (is there a better way to start a day?) with Kangaroo Island Marine Adventures. Sample some freshly shucked oysters from The Oyster Farm Shop in American River, showcasing the best of KI's aquaculture and sustainable seafood. Or become a beekeeper, don the white suit and handle a Ligurian Beehive at KI Living Honey. Then burn it all off by climbing Prospect Hill – a great place to watch the sunset.

Depart for the mainland.

TOURING

TAKE A GUIDED TOUR TO MAKE MORE OF YOUR VISIT

An all-of-island tour with single-day or multi-day itineraries can be tailored to suit your interests or must-visit wish-list. From Cape Willoughby to Cape Borda, you'll be taken by 4WD to the famous attractions and a few highlights that only the locals know about. Specialist tours cater to wildlife lovers, birdwatchers, gourmands, cyclists, hikers, kayakers and those wanting to do adventure activities. Tours can start in Adelaide, at the ferry terminal in Cape Jervis or from your accommodation on the island.

Guided walking tours are an ideal way to properly immerse in the landscape and learn about what makes the island so special. Going on foot is also a more intimate way to see wildlife. Licensed operators are currently leading guided tours of the spectacular Kangaroo Island Wilderness Trail over five sections, and other trails right across the island.

Half-day and full-day marine tours get you up close with all the amazing sea life - so close in fact that you can enter the water with pods of wild dolphins. Fishers will delight in the search for the renowned King George whiting - and your skipper knows where to find the fish, so no one should go hungry.

Wanting to try **something different**? Look out for short tours on e-bikes and fat-tyre bikes in and around Little Sahara or the Cygnet River. There are also quad bike and UTV tours to make for an especially exhilarating way of exploring bushland. Learn what it's like to be a beekeeper on a tour that will have you suited up and working amongst the hives of Ligurian bees. You can also watch shearing and sheepdog displays on a working farm in Ironstone. And at American River, you'll meet with volunteer craftsmen of the Rebuild Independence Group, men and women who are recreating an 1803 American schooner.

WILDLIFE **Dolphins and whales** There are large pods of dolphins in the waters of Snelling Beach, Penneshaw and Emu Bay; they can also sometimes be seen catching the waves at Pennington Bay. Whenever you're on a beach, simply keep an eye out; for a chance to swim with dolphins, join a marine tour or snorkelling tour. From May to September, watch the horizon for breaching humpbacks and southern right whales.

Kangaroos

The Kangaroo Island kangaroo is unique to the island; it's smaller and darker, with longer fur than the Western Grey. It shares its home with the fine-featured Tammar wallaby, which is now all but extinct on the mainland. Look out for both species all over the island, especially at dusk and dawn. There are large mobs at Cape Willoughby lighthouse, Stokes Bay and Pelican Lagoon.



Ligurian Bees

Ligurian bees

Introduced to the island in the 1880s, the Ligurian bee has thrived. Today, the local population remains the purest strain in the world and is prized for delicious honey. The bees can be seen at three specialist centres; you can also try honey-infused products at cafés and restaurants right across the island and even become a beekeeper to handle the bees yourself.





Australian sea lion

Australian sea lions and long-nosed fur seals

The colony of Australian sea lions at Seal Bay are justifiably famous; not only is it the world's largest breeding colony of the endangered mammal, it also occupies a spectacular part of the island. You'll reliably see long-nosed fur seals at Admiral's Arch and Kingscote Wharf, usually dozing after a long day of catching fish.



Koala

Koalas

The koala population was introduced to the island and is one of many species that suffered in the 2020 bushfires. The populations are robust, however, so look out for them in the forks of eucalyptus trees, especially in Cygnet River and Duck Lagoon; there are also rehabilitated animals in KI Wildlife Park



Little penguin

Little Penguins


There are small resident populations of penguins at Penneshaw and Emu Bay. They can be seen on the move after dark, when they go down to the shoreline to embark on nightly fishing forays. Still with nocturnal species, look out for possums and boobook owls on your travels, or join a wildlife tour to learn more about their nocturnal activities. Always use a red light at night, not white light.



Echidna

Rare native animals

Echidnas, platypus, Rosenburg's goannas and glossy black cockatoos can all be found on the island but you may need a bit of local help to locate them. Tour guides not only improve your chances of seeing these free-roaming animals, they provide plenty of context relating to the wider ecology.

Flinders Chase National Park (West End)

Multiple walks - including the 61-kilometre Kangaroo Island Wilderness Trail

As well as being a vast tract of native bushland, Flinders Chase offers some of the island's most striking - and famous - sights including Remarkable Rocks (dramatic, wind-sculpted rocks on a prominent headland), Admirals Arch (a vast wave-formed arch and home to a colony of fur seals) and Cape du Couedic Lighthouse (a 1906 lighthouse made of local stone). All three are accessible by car.

Following the 2020 bushfires, short walking trails are reopening, including the Ravine des Casoars and Cape du Couedic hikes. The more challenging Kangaroo Island Wilderness Trail (five stages, 61 kilometres) is also open but can only be undertaken with licensed guides.

Cape Borda Lightstation is a unique square lighthouse built in 1858 and the nation's third-oldest.

Seal Bay Conservation Park (South Coast)

Boardwalk: 900 metres return

Seal Bay is home to one of the world's largest breeding colonies of Australian sea lions. Join a guided beach tour to observe the natural behaviour of the wild animals at rest, at play and in courtship. The 900-metre Don Dixon boardwalk is an easy stroll into the amazing amphitheatre of rock, leading to a platform overlooking the beach. The Visitor Centre has interpretive displays and a touch table.

Kelly Hill Conservation Park (South Coast)

Kelly Hill Conservation Park (including Kelly Hill Caves) is available via guided tours. The park has reopened, however some rebuilding will continue until April 2023.

While rebuild works are undertaken, visitors can join behind-the-scenes tours with park rangers, taking in the park and the Kelly Hill Caves system - a chance to learn about Kangaroo Island's geology and heritage, and see bushfire recovery up-close.

Cape Gantheaume Conservation Park and Wilderness Protection Area (South Coast)

Multiple walks

This important sanctuary on the south coast offers 20,000 hectares of wilderness, as well as Murray Lagoon (a huge breeding area for birds) and D'Estrees Bay, which is home to relics of the 19th century whaling industry. Several short walks take you around the lagoon (ideal for birdwatchers), into dunes and remote coves; the Cape Gantheaume Trek is a seasonal 34-kilometre trail suitable for experienced hikers. Camp sites available.

Cape Willoughby Conservation Park (Penneshaw & Dudley Peninsula)

Cape Willoughby Lightstation Heritage Hike: 1 hour, 1.9 kilometres return

This park is famous for Cape Willoughby Lightstation (the state's oldest) and spectacular ocean views. Self-tour or join a guided tour of the 1852 lightstation and grounds to hear stories about working and living in this harsh and remote environment. Visitors can also overnight in the Lighthouse Keepers Heritage Accommodation.

Baudin Conservation Park (Penneshaw & Dudley Peninsula)

Ironstone Hill Hike: 1 hour 30 minutes, 4 kilometres return

Start in Penneshaw on the Town Walk and keep going into the stunning surrounds of Baudin. A family farm from 1861 to 2001, Baudin Conservation Park offers sheoak woodland (a great place to see the endangered glossy black cockatoo), rolling hills and views across Backstairs Passage. The Ironstone Hill Hike follows a historic bullock track to Cape Willoughby, leading to Ironstone Hill and the ruins of the Bates family cottage. Interpretive signs explore the life of Harry Bates and his early farming endeavours.

Lashmar Conservation Park (Penneshaw & Dudley Peninsula)

Lashmar Conservation Park adjoins the long sandy beach at Antechamber Bay. Just a short drive from Cape Willoughby Lightstation, it's an ideal location for swimming, fishing and birdwatching. The park can also be explored by canoeing along the Chapman River which flows through the park and into the sea at Antechamber Bay.

A beach to call your own

Even KI's most popular beaches – Emu Bay, Vivonne Bay and D'Estrees Bay to name three are rarely if ever what you'd call crowded. The reason? They're big. Emu and Vivonne are five kilometres, Brown is three kilometres, so you really don't have to walk far to find a stretch of sand where no-one has been. If you really want to play castaway, simply follow your nose down one of the quiet country roads to find secret beaches like Redbanks and Bales.

Fishing

Drop a line from one of the jetties, cast from the beach, or bring your boat. Don't know a sinker from a float? Then hire a charter! Your friendly local skipper will take care of all the messy business of packing bait and tying hooks, and better yet, take you to all the secret spots where the big fish are biting... Anglers love KI's waters for big whiting, trevally, tommies, garfish, squid and flathead. Between April and September there's an abundance of large snook.

Beach driving

Vehicles are permitted to drive on the spectacular five-kilometre-long white crescent that is Emu Bay Beach and Snelling Beach. These are the only island beaches where it's allowed. Drivers should always take care and be mindful they're driving on nesting bird habitat.

Surfing


The island offers excellent surf breaks, suitable for both experienced surfers and beginners. The best are found on the southern coast off beaches such as Vivonne Bay, D'Estrees Bay, Hanson Bay and Pennington Bay (all generally accessible by car with parking available). There are safe breaks at Stokes Bay on the North Coast though be prepared to share your waves with resident dolphins!

Snorkelling

KI waters are renowned among scuba divers for excellent temperate ocean diving, fabulous diversity and a chance to see the rare leafy seadragon. Snorkelling can be just as rewarding, especially at Stokes Bay's rockpool and the quiet waters of Rolls Point in front of the Kingscote Yacht Club (both brilliant for kids), as well as Vivonne Bay jetty, Penneshaw and Western River Cove.

Marine tours

Don't forget there are experts with all the gear - and the expertise - to get you better acquainted with the marine ecosystem around KI. Marine tours run regularly out of Emu Bay and Penneshaw to introduce you to local wildlife; they'll even have you kitted out with snorkel and mask so you can enter the water with the local dolphins.

GO A LITTLE WILDER

Little Sahara

The field of monster dunes known as Little Sahara has long attracted sand boarders and toboggan riders. The tallest dunes crest around 40 metres, offering a thrilling ride whether you're a beginner or a shredder. Boards and toboggans can be hired at the entrance to Little Sahara, but remember to collect your cubes of beeswax - you need to wax the underside of your board to ensure it glides over the sand!

Fishing charters

The waters off Kangaroo Island are some of the cleanest in the world, and renowned for big King George whiting. Join a fishing charter out of Emu Bay or Western River Cove to stretch your arm on a wild adventure.

Walking trails

KI has a trail for everyone, whether you're an ambler, a rambler or a hard-core hiker lugging a 50-kilo pack. For interesting history and plenty of stunning scenery, check out the easy town walks in Penneshaw, American River and Kingscote or climb Prospect Hill. For the mother of all treks, join a licensed tour guide on The Kangaroo Island Wilderness Trail, a stunning five-day hike in and around Flinders Chase, taking in huge stretches of wild coast. New campsite infrastructure will be installed in bushland locations at five points along the walk early in 2023.

Get moving

Hire a kayak (or join a kayaking tour) to explore one of many beautiful rivers flowing to the ocean. Keep an eye out for local inhabitants such as birdlife, kangaroos, echidnas, dolphins and sea eagles. If you're looking for a bit more roar with your tour, there are quad bike, buggy and fat-tyre bike tours which will have you deep in otherwise inaccessible parts of the island.

Ocean adventures

Snorkelling tours, swim with dolphin experiences, boating adventures... You'll find a raft of on-water adventures off the shores of KI. Tours go out of Emu Bay, Stokes Bay and Penneshaw. If you fancy a bit of DIY snorkelling, try Stokes Bay Rockpool (brilliant for small kids), or the shallows off Brown Beach and Rolls Point in Kingscote (a family-friendly place where you can spot zebrafish, eagle rays, little weed whiting, and western talma).

4WD adventures

Tour the icons and then push into some of the less-visited parts of KI on a 4WD tour. You'll jump into a few action distractions, stop at a farm gate or two, meet the locals and experience the thrill of finding a beach with no footprints on it except your own...

Caving

Descend the steep staircase into Kelly Hill Caves. These otherworldly limestone chambers of stalagmites, stalactites and fossils were discovered by a stockman in 1885 when he stumbled into a sinkhole while looking for lost sheep. At present the caves can be visited with a guide, part of a tour to see how the region is in recovery after the 2020 bushfires.

TASTE THE FLAVOURS OF A PRISTINE ENVIRONMENT

Cleans seas, rich soils and a benign Mediterranean climate have all combined to render Kangaroo Island a by-word for top quality produce.

Sampling local, sustainable seafood is a highlight on Kangaroo Island. Abalone, lobster, King George whiting, not to mention crab, calamari, garfish and oysters can all be enjoyed within sight of the ocean at cafés, restaurants and cellar doors. Don't miss the local marron: it's similar to a yabby, abundant in local freshwaters and quite a local delicacy.

Vines have been grown on Kangaroo Island as far back as 1837, although wine production only commenced in the 1990s. Today, there's around 150 hectares under vine. You can sample wines (perfectly matched with local food) in the Dudley Peninsula, Cygnet River and Kingscote regions.

Kangaroo Island's gin distillery boasts awards from around the world for handcrafted spirits and liqueurs flavoured with fresh, local, seasonal botanicals. Growing in popularity, it's worth a visit to the location in Cygnet River that started it all.

Microbreweries have been growing in production and reputation, with local ingredients at the fore. The likes of honey and sheoak are used to produce distinct island flavours. Thanks to the cool climate, locals are also growing the perfect cider apple; 30 local varieties go into a range of beverages, both alcoholic and non-alcoholic.

The island is also home to the world's purest strain of Ligurian bees. The bees' honey is prized for its quality and is used in a whole range of products from beer to ice cream. Visit honey producers and sample their different honey flavours harvested from diverse flora. You can even suit up like a professional to become a beekeeper for a day.

Dining on the island is very much about brilliant produce served in extraordinary locations. Whether you're grabbing a burger made from freshly caught whiting or sitting down to a five-star degustation featuring southern rock lobster, expect to savour every moment.



ART, MUSEUMS AND MARKETS

KI is home to a substantial artist community. in fact one in 10 islanders are engaged in creative pursuits. This is reflected in the huge amount of art on display in both public spaces and local galleries, with the landscape and the local wildlife invoked on canvases, in glass, in ceramics, in textiles and in sculptures wrought from the like of steel, stone and even driftwood.

There are galleries right across the island, as well as collections on display in cafés, hotels and cellar doors. There are also impressive public works to view, including the 175th Commemorative Sculpture by Deb Sleeman on Dauncey Street in Kingscote and the 25-metre mural on the Kingscote silos (Cam Scale's KI kangaroo and glossy black cockatoo look especially striking at night).

Don't miss the Kangaroo Island Sculpture Trail in Penneshaw. Winding through 1.5 kilometres of native bushland and dunes on Hog Bay, you'll find sculptures inspired by nature and a sense of place. Along the trail, look out for dry limestone walls, hidden picnic spots and a swing bridge - as well as the native wildlife, plants and scenery that inspired the sculptors.

KI has a fabulous history, one that's well worth exploring on your visit.

Kangaroo Island's European history dates back to 1802 when English and French explorers, as well as sealers and whalers, made it to these shores. There were no native peoples on the island at the time, though excavations suggest early First Nations people lived here until as recently as 2000 years ago.

The discovery of hammer stones at Hawk's Nest near Murray's Lagoon in 1903 was the first evidence of Aboriginal habitation on Kangaroo Island. In the 1980s, excavations at Black Swamp in Flinders Chase suggested Indigenous occupation between 16,000 and 4000 years ago, suggesting Aboriginal People had come from the mainland when sea levels were much lower. In the 1870s, the island was known to have been home to three Tasmanian Aboriginal women - Sal, Suke and Betty who practised traditional land clearing and hunting with dogs. They were believed to have

been Aboriginal women who were brought to the island by European sealers before 1836. For early European history of the island. perhaps start with The Rebuild Independence Project in American River, where a volunteer group is re-creating the first vessel ever built in South Australia - the 45ft United States Schooner Independence, built by American sealers in 1803. Visit the RIG Boathouse to learn more about the sailors as well as the explorers Nicolas Baudin and Matthew Flinders.

Kingscote was established in 1836, predating Adelaide settlement, and an early contender for the colonial capital. Be sure to do a walking tour of Kingscote, including Reeves Point and the remains of the earliest settlement; this includes the cemetery (South Australia's oldest), and the Old Mulberry Tree, said to be planted in 1836. There's a museum in Hope Cottage, one of three original cottages built in 1856, which houses a collection that reflects early life in the settlement.

The self-guided history walk takes in 25 historic buildings, including the 1884 Chancel (now St Alban's Church), the oldest public building in the town.

Other museums and historic attractions on the island include The Penneshaw Maritime and Folk Museum (featuring displays, information and artefacts on the maritime and folk history of the Dudley Peninsula) The Parndana Soldier Settlement Museum (a modern historical display telling the stories of the post-war soldier settlement scheme which did much to transform the landscape of the island), lighthouse museums at Cape Borda and Cape Willoughby, and Emu Ridge Eucalyptus Distillery (continuing a manufacturing tradition that was a mainstay on the island and said to give Australia its first true overseas export).

Markets are held seasonally around Kangaroo Island. Kingscote Farmers and Artisan Market is held twice monthly, with stalls offering artisan arts, crafts and regional foods, enlivened by community activities and musical entertainment. Penneshaw Markets (first Sunday of every month) is a showcase for local artists, gardeners, growers, authors, photographers, artisans, and small-scale food producers.

EAT, SLEEP, RETREAT

For generations of South Australians, Kangaroo Island has always been the place where you went to stay at a 'beach house'. It's not so very different today, with families still making their memories among humble (and not so humble) shacks that are only a hop, skip and a jump from soft sands.

But the options on the island are surprisingly diverse, offering everything from apartments to far-flung farmstays, motels to lodges, dining-inclusive resorts to off-grid retreats.

If you're new to the island, a personal introduction can be had by staying in a **bed and breakfast**. Your hosts will be delighted to share their knowledge of the area, in fact a few hosts offer tours and other experiences. Alternatively, get back to the land with a **farmstay** (always brilliant for kids).

KI's upmarket retreats indulge their guests in one of the modern era's greatest luxuries, the opportunity to find true solace with only the waves and wildlife for company. Cast yourself away in one of the island's handsome off-grid ecostays or lodges, tucked away in bushland sanctuaries and secret coves. You'll find them usually appointed with fine furnishings, a swag of leisure facilities and generous decks.

One of the most frequently asked questions is, 'what's happening with Southern Ocean Lodge?' The six-star retreat that arguably took KI to the world was destroyed in the 2020 bushfires, but it's set to return in mid-late 2023. Occupying the same spectacular cliff-top location, 'SOL 2.0' will feature 25 suites with the addition of a new ultra-premium suite called the Ocean Pavilion.

Some of the most remote – and spectacular – dwellings on the island were traditionally taken up by the men and women who ran the island's lighthouses. You can experience that remoteness for yourself with a stay in a **lighthouse keeper's cottage** at Cape Willoughby and Cape Borda.

If you've embraced the freedom of the caravan, camper or tent, you're spoiled for choice with caravan parks, holiday parks, council campgrounds and options within the many National Parks. SeaLink

offers specials throughout the year for caravans and camper trailers, so keep an eye on their website. Backpackers will find low-priced accommodation at a number of parks offering cabins and coastal units in Kingscote and Penneshaw.

Two things to bear in mind ahead of your trip. (1) Owing to the size of the island, you can make better use of your time by staying in several places rather than basing yourself at a single address. And (2) it's important to book your accommodation and travel in advance — it can get busy, especially during holiday periods.

When you arrive in Penneshaw by ferry you're greeted with your first glimpse of the essential KI experience – long stretches of white, sandy beach and water so clear you can see the fish!

Penneshaw is a pretty coastal town with a vibrant village feel. Get your bearings with a short drive out of town to discover stunning clifftop views back to the mainland over Backstairs Passage, and perhaps celebrate your arrival at one of the peninsula's cellar door experiences. Alternatively, kick back in one of Penneshaw's dining outlets, where the wines are perfectly paired with local produce.

Penneshaw has several walking trails but is best known for the lovely Kangaroo Island Sculpture Trail. This winding 1.5-kilometre trail takes in scenic lookouts, ancient vegetation and stunning ravine walls – and also showcases sculptures by local artists. There's plenty of wildlife to keep you company, too.

If history is your thing, Penneshaw is home to the Maritime Museum featuring displays, information and artefacts on the maritime and folk history of the Dudley Peninsula. And be sure to venture out to Cape Willoughby for a guided tour to the top of South Australia's first lighthouse, an 1852 beacon that warned sailors off the rugged coastline.

For an altogether different perspective, take a boat tour and let a local take you to where the dolphins and seals play. Care to join them? You'll be kitted out with all the gear before you plunge into the ocean for one of life's great marine adventures...

At dusk and dawn you'll see plenty of wildlife, but don't forget about the creatures that inhabit the dark - best seen on a nocturnal wildlife tour. You'll see the furry locals going about their business, and you'll also get to witness a stunning southern night sky.

Dudley Peninsula is home to four of the island's most celebrated beaches - Hog Bay, Brown Beach, Antechamber Bay and Island Beach. The latter is popular with holiday makers for its clean, stunning sands and safe swimming. It's a great spot to launch a fishing boat, or simply take a stroll.



Incorporating Pelican Lagoon, Redbanks and Pennington Bay

Just 30 minutes from Penneshaw is the small seaside town of American River, one of the island's best kept secrets. It's one of the top fishing locations on the island, and a great place to relax, pick up some local seafood and chill out.

At the entrance to the town, you'll be welcomed by a monument to the schooner Independence. It was the first vessel built in South Australia, constructed by American sealers in 1803. Today, a band of tireless volunteers is currently rebuilding the schooner in the boathouse on the town's wharf. Stop in to check on their progress and find out more about the history of the vessel.

Be sure to do the excellent Town Walk to get your bearings. The town sits on an inlet which flows into **Pelican Lagoon**. The lagoon is a bird watcher's paradise and the town itself is home to a flock of endangered glossy black cockatoos, drawing twitchers from all over the world. Species of local birdlife can be observed from hides along the shoreline; look out also for Tammar wallabies when taking one of the walking trails. The quiet lagoon waters are ideal for paddling a kayak, which can be hired at the American River wharf.

Keen fishers and sailors are drawn to the calm waters, but if you're not in the mood to catchyour-own you can enjoy find a showcase of the island's sustainable seafood in an outlet opposite the wharf. Depending on the catch and the season you'll find oysters, abalone, King George whiting and freshwater marron. Local oysters are highly prized and land-based, guided tours of the oyster farm are available.

American River is home to award-winning restaurants and quaint dining locations. Enjoy oysters overlooking inlet or dine surrounded by nature and wildlife. If you're hungry for knowledge, you can become a beekeeper for a day (don a suit, learn about bees and watch a live hive in action); alternatively, you can learn about permaculture and get some tips on how to get your garden performing at its best.

Before you leave the area, don't miss the opportunity to visit spectacular Pennington Bay where you can catch a wave with the local dolphins, stroll the white sands, cast a line from the beach or simply take in the views.

The climb to the top of Prospect Hill just off the main road is well worth the effort, rewarding climbers with sweeping views back towards Penneshaw and over Pelican Lagoon. A staircase has been constructed to protect the local landscape and make the climb a little easier - but it'll still get the heart pumping!

The largest township on the island, Kingscote sits on picturesque Nepean Bay, with Bay of Shoals just around the point. It's easily explored on foot but venture a bit further out and you'll discover a wide range of experiences.

Start your day with a brisk walk along the Coastal Walk from Kingscote to Brownlow where you'll find a family-friendly beach ideal for shallow swimming and wading. The Brownlow end is teaming with birdlife. If you're really keen, you might take an early dip in the tidal swimming pool along the wav.

Continue the walk to Reeves Point with much to learn about the history of South Australia's first European settlement. While at the point, take a walk up Flagstaff Hill for great views, and stroll down to Hope Cottage Museum. The walk continues onto the local winery and winds its way back past the silos and into town.

After all that exercise, you'll need something to eat, so call into one of several cafés or restaurants, or grab some fish and chips to enjoy while looking over the ocean. No one's busier than KI's famous Ligurian bees so look out for local products (including the island's stellar ice cream) and learn how this unique

population came to call KI home. The island's ever-evolving drinks scene is alive and well in Kingscote, with a winery and brewery on the outskirts of town.

Kangaroo Island is home to a vibrant art community and you'll find public artwork everywhere you go. There's also a real street art scene developing in Kingscote, with murals even extending to the 25-metre-tall silos. There's also plenty of local galleries where the range of creative talent is on display.

If you like to be active, Kingscote offers boat hire, marine adventure charters, sailing lessons (available from the Yacht Club) and golf at the Kingscote 18-hole course. A popular park run takes place at 8am every Saturday morning, starting at the Tidal Pool.

Incorporating Cygnet River, **Duck Lagoon and Magilivray**

Located some 15 minutes from Kingscote and five minutes from Kangaroo Island Airport is the township of Cygnet River. The settlement is tiny but no less interesting - or lovely for that. It's also home to a growing community of artisan producers.

The local Cygnet River Artisan Trail is a meandering trail of growers and makers. You'll find two distinctive styles of wine, a world-renowned producer of spirits and liqueurs, authentic wool products and delicious food. The trail easily warrants half a day of your time, offering the chance to meet people who've brought ingenuity and creativity to their boutique operations.

Pack a picnic using goodies you've collected on the trail and head to idyllic Duck Lagoon. It's home to a population of koalas (look up to see them dozing in the trees) as well as plentiful kangaroos and birdlife.

The prolific eucalypt forests around the lagoon were harvested for their leaves in the 19th century, indeed the remnants of a eucalyptus still – used to extract the essential oils prized for aromatic, homoeopathic and cleaning uses - remains at the site. There's a modern-day operation at nearby Magilivray: visit to learn about the distilling process as well as eucalyptus oil, said to have been Australia's first true export.

Cygnet River is home to the Kangaroo Island Racing Club and comes alive in February each year for the SeaLink Kangaroo Island Cup Carnival. One of the most anticipated events on the calendar, the February weekend comprises the Dudley Wines Cup (expect posh frocks and lots of bubbles!) and a suite of after-race events held by local restaurants and wineries.



Parndana is friendly country town ideally located in the heart of the island. Base yourself here and you're perfectly placed to do day-long trips of the South Coast and/or North Coast.

The town has all the essentials covered – including pub, petrol, post office and some good-old-fashioned country cooking - so it's a great place to restock and refuel before heading to more remote locations. The seven-day supermarket and 24-hour laundromat are go-to destinations for visitors staying in the town as well as those in holiday homes on both coasts.

Established after World War II to support the Soldier Settler Scheme, Parndana welcomed 174 families in the 1950s which almost doubled the island's population. The town remains the agricultural hub of the island, although these days farmed products like marron, wine grapes, vegetables and honey have been added to the more traditional meat, wool and broadacre farming. The Parndana Soldier Settlement Museum provides an insight into the challenges of transforming a native landscape into agriculture.

The town is home to an area school and sports club. Typical of all country towns, sport plays a very important part in the fabric of the community, so don't hold back if you fancy joining the locals to watch a game of footy or netball.

Nearby, you'll find Parndana's most recently added attraction, a Community Garden created with the assistance of gardening personality Sophie Thomson and Regrowth Garden Recovery. Run by volunteer guardians, it's just one part of a program designed to rebuild landscapes and lives of those impacted by the 2020 bushfires. Approximately the size of a tennis court, the garden of raised beds, companion plants and fruit trees is completely enclosed to deter the native animals - however visitors are welcome to pick a handful of herbs or take a vegetable or two.

Activities in and around the town include a playground and barbecue area, an 18-hole sand-scrape golf course and a BMX track. Natural scrubland around Parndana provides bushwalking trails and opportunities to see the local wildlife; visitors in late winter and early spring are always delighted by the array of wildflowers.

Families with young children will enjoy a visit to the nearby wildlife park where you can cuddle a koala and feed kangaroos and wallabies, and find out more about the park's efforts to rehabilitate animals injured in the bushfires.



The bitumen will take you from Kingscote to Emu Bay. After that you're on a network of unsealed roads proliferating across the North Coast - roads less travelled that provide spectacular clifftop scenery and a holiday away from it all. Favoured by locals and visitors alike, the North Coast is dotted with holiday accommodation to suit all tastes and budgets. Plan ahead and pack your bags for a memorable holiday exploring the pebble-strewn coves, fishing hotspots and endless beaches.

Go looking for crabs at the western end of Snelling Beach. Plan a day at Stokes Bay (just follow the signs through the rock tunnel and prepare yourself for one of the most magnificent 'reveals' in South Australia). Experience the cliffs and wavecut platform of Cape Cassini. Western River Cove is two beaches, both of them seemingly cast away from the rest of the world. And Emu Bay is especially lovely at sunset: the five-kilometre stretch of white sand is one of the great fishing beaches, and comes alive in late afternoon when the locals take to the sands in their 4WDs to find their favourite places to cast a line...

It pays to expect the unexpected on the North Coast. George Turner's Castle boasts 40,000 lights - a bizarre fantasy by day and night. Just give George a call (8553 5213) and he'll turn them on for you. Drop into the Old Wisanger School and check out what it was like back in the 1890s. And Middle River is home to the Enchanted Fig Tree, one of the nation's most amazing dining experiences.

The fig tree, planted 120 years ago to supply fruit to hungry settlers, has grown into a giant sprawling canopy covering several tennis courts. Rooms have been fashioned from within the tree's low, gnarly branches to create magical spaces. Degustations are occasionally held among the boughs, but only when the tree is in full leaf, making it a true 'catch-it-while-you-can' experience.





Incorporating Flinders Chase National Park, Admirals Arch, Remarkable Rocks, Cape du Couedic, Cape Borda and Hanson Bay

The West End is dominated by Flinders Chase National Park a vast and important expanse of native bushland, pristine beaches and soaring headlands. The park was established in 1919, and is the second-oldest national park in South Australia. Today, the area amounts to some 300 square kilometres.

Bearing the brunt of the bushfires in early 2020, the West End region has proved to be just as rugged and resilient as it was in the days of the lighthouse keepers.

After being hit hard by the bushfires of summer 2019/20, the region has made an extraordinary recovery. Vegetation is thriving and native animals are returning to the habitat. And the attractions that have made this part of the world famous are once again open to the public. including Remarkable Rocks, Weirs Cove, Cape du Couedic Lighthouse, Admirals

New facilities and attractions include a brand new boardwalk at Remarkable Rocks, enabling visitors to once again immerse themselves in the ancient rock formations and take in the surrounding views. Self-guided tours are available at Cape Borda Lightstation and work has begun rebuilding the new \$16 million

Arch and Kelly Hill Caves.

Visitor Hub at Flinders Chase National Park (scheduled to open late 2024). The viewing platforms at Admirals Arch (home to a colony of long-nosed fur seals) and Cape du Couedic Lighthouse are also open.

You can reach the remote Cape Borda Lightstation by car, a wild and lonely place on towering cliffs overlooking Investigator Strait. The lighthouse is adjacent to the Ravine des Casoars Wilderness Protection area where you can explore the Valley of the Cassowaries, named after the now-extinct dwarf emu.


The Kangaroo Island Wilderness Trail in and around Flinders Chase provides a special opportunity for walkers to see vegetation in the throes of recovery as well as dramatic, 'unmasked' landscapes. The 61-kilometre trail is not only one of Australia's newest trails, it's also one of the nation's most beautiful, offering panoramic views of headlands and Southern Ocean. Five-day hikes are available with licensed operators.





Allow yourself plenty of time to explore the South Coast, home to some of the most talked-about attractions and experiences on the island.

Wake up to the beauty of D'Estrees Bay with a stay at a cottage, beach house, or pitch a tent in a campground. The views and wildlife make this area something of a hidden delight, with trails for walkers and experienced hikers alike.

The region's most famous residents are undoubtedly the Australian sea lions of Seal Bay. Be sure to pre-book online for an unforgettable guided tour which will take you into the heart of the colony to observe their antics and learn about this endangered species. If you prefer to observe at your own you pace, you can take the signed boardwalk to a number of viewing platforms.

A NOTE ON **BIOSECURITY**

Kangaroo Island's remoteness and isolation has created a special environment, free from many of the pests and diseases found on mainland Australia. The arrival of new pests and diseases has the potential to devastate our local environment and our agriculture industries.

As such, there are some items that you cannot bring to Kangaroo Island. Please dispose of any prohibited items before travelling to Kangaroo Island. Severe penalties apply.

You cannot bring:

· Bees, bee handling equipment and honey products (yes, that means no jars of honey!). Kangaroo Island is a sanctuary to the only Ligurian bee

- population in the world and these items can spread disease threatening a significant KI industry. Help keep this species pure and disease free.
- · Unwashed or dirty potatoes may carry disease which could devastate the island's seed potato industry. Please leave them behind. Note: washed or brushed potatoes in new packaging are permitted for consumption only.
- · Foxes, rabbits and declared weeds. The introduction of these pests would create an environmental disaster. For further information contact: Biosecurity SA, PIRSA Kangaroo Island on 08 8553 4949 or pir.sa.gov.au

Other things you can do to protect Kangaroo Island

- · Visitors must notify the Kangaroo Island Council if they are bringing a dog or cat to the island. Simply call Customer Services on 8553 4500 or email kicouncil@kicouncil.sa.gov.au
- Pets are not allowed at Seal Bay or any national park on Kangaroo Island (including car parks).
- · Residual plant material may be on your vehicle, camping equipment and hiking boots. Make sure they are free of soil before visiting Kangaroo Island.
- · Your boat and boating equipment can also carry marine pests. Make sure they are clean before visiting the island.
- · Farm biosecurity is designed to protect a property from the entry and spread of pests and diseases. Farm biosecurity is not only the responsibility of farmers but of every person visiting or working on property. For further information visit the Farm Biosecurity website (farmbiosecurity.com.au).


Checks of travellers to Kangaroo Island

When travelling to Kangaroo Island you may encounter a random biosecurity check. Our staff are stationed at Cape Jervis Ferry Terminal and Kingscote Airport and will be looking for restricted items.

Amnesty bins are available at all entry points to Kangaroo Island. If you have a restricted item, you may dispose restricted items in these bins.

Banking

Bank SA has a branch in Kingscote. There are ATMs in Kingscote, Penneshaw, Parndana, and at Vivonne Bay General Store, while EFTPOS facilities are widely available at businesses. The American River & Penneshaw Post Office has banking services including cash out.

Mobile telephones

Telstra Next Generation coverage is widely available across the island; however, other carriers drop in and out, or have no reception. There is limited Optus, Vodafone and Telstra GSM digital coverage available from Kingscote to Penneshaw and adjacent areas.

Fire danger

During Fire Danger Season, generally from November to April, there are strict conditions for lighting any fires, including campfires. On Total Fire Ban days, all fires are banned. Avoid severe penalties by checking cfs.sa.gov.au before lighting any fires.

Visit cfs.sa.gov.au and subscribe to bushfire warnings and other important information and check the CFS Facebook page to stay informed. Monitor the daily weather forecast and Fire Danger Ratings, know your Bushfire Safer Place, and listen for warning messages and updates on your local AM radio station. Further bushfire safety information is available by contacting the Bushfire Information Hotline on 1800 362 361 (TTY 13 36 77) or visiting cfs.sa.gov.au


