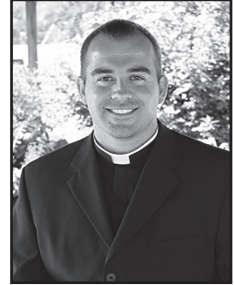

## **Dear friends and members of Holy Family Parish, will you help me?**

You may know that the Church teaches that the Eucharist is the “Source and Summit” of our Faith. It’s the *source*, because the Eucharist enables us to *make present and offer anew* Jesus Christ’s one redemptive Sacrifice of Calvary, which began with His Passion (CCC 1362-68; 1341). It’s the *summit*, because the Eucharist is truly a foretaste of heaven, in which we partake of Jesus’ body and blood as heaven and earth become most profoundly one. Jesus Christ and His Church are present on earth in order to bring as many people in to heaven as possible. We gather at the altar to feed on His Body and Blood in order to become one with Him and to share in eternal life with Him. The Church strengthens and feeds its own members and it calls others, who do not yet know Jesus Christ, to share in His Word and Presence.



In a liturgical way, we can see these two different actions taking place through the Sacrifice of the Mass by making holy its members and also through more public forms of worship and evangelization like Eucharistic Processions, which we have every year on Corpus Christi Sunday. Through both the Mass and Eucharistic Processions, our Lord is calling all people to Himself. However, a large part of this work is done outside of the Mass and not during a Eucharistic Procession. Yes, a great deal of the work to be done is accomplished by the laity. The central call of the Second Vatican Council is one of evangelization by the lay faithful. This mission begins with those who are already Catholic and no longer attend Mass. Jesus tells us, “Unless you eat my Body and drink my Blood, you will have no life within you.”

The national average of Catholics attending Mass is less than 25% and an even smaller percent than that believe in Jesus’ presence in the Eucharist. This should concern us. As you can imagine, the reasons for this could be many. It could be the busyness of people’s lives, eating away time that could be spent teaching your family our Catholic faith and our children how to worship God. Or, it could be the unholy example at times of Church leaders and clergy. I believe one of the prevailing reasons is simply the growing belief that we don’t really need to know Jesus Christ. One might say, as long as I’m a ‘good person’ everything will be fine. Jesus condemned this belief many times. He said, “Many will say, ‘but Lord, we saw you in the streets and in the market places.’ And I will say to them, ‘but I never knew you.’” Today, we might say, “But Lord, I’m a cradle Catholic, and my grandmother prayed the rosary.” Jesus may say, “Yes, but I don’t know you.”

Whether we know it or not, we need a savior, and we need to know Him. So, friends I ask you, will you help me? Will you help me in bringing back the fallen away Catholics? Will you help me by inviting someone back to Mass, back to the life-giving presence of Jesus? Many times, we can think that evangelization is intimidating and boring. Friends, it is an adventure. You don't need to be an expert in knowing God's Word. It's simply about inviting people you know and love back to Jesus; back to His Eucharistic Presence at Mass. Allow this Ministry Guidebook to be a tool to help reconnect with a friend or a loved one, or perhaps that co-worker who might be on the edge of returning anyway. Our Lord is calling us to act. It is time. Most of us are not only very capable of doing this, but are called to do it. Yes, God is calling the laity to bring His people home. Will you help me?

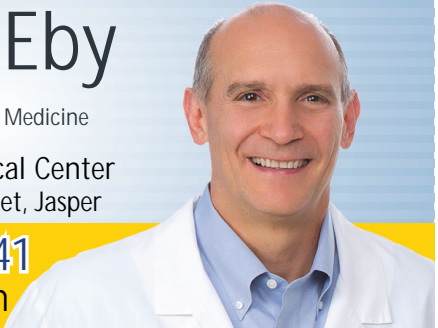

## Holy Family Parish Pastoral Council

The following ministries have a voting representative on the Council: Finance, Communications, Family Life, Social Concerns, Spiritual Life, and Holy Trinity School Council. ## Sacraments and Faith Development

### **Baptism**

By Baptism, God the Father adopts us as His own children, beginning our life in the Church and our journey in brotherhood or sisterhood with Jesus Christ. Please contact the parish office at least one month in advance of the time you anticipate having your child baptized. The registration forms can be requested from the office at 812-482-3076, or downloaded from our website: [holyfamilyjasper.com](http://holyfamilyjasper.com). Baptisms are normally scheduled for Sundays, but can be a different date if necessary. No Baptisms are scheduled during Lent, except for an urgent necessity.

### **First Holy Communion and First Reconciliation**

First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion are normally held during a child's second grade year. While children may receive theological instruction on the sacraments at release time or Catholic school, children should also receive spiritual preparation for this important sacrament in their home parish. To register your child for sacramental preparation, contact the Director. First Holy Communion is held on the last Sunday of April at the 10:30 a.m. Mass. ### **Reconciliation**

The regular scheduled times for Reconciliation are: Saturday 4:00 - 4:45 p.m.; Sunday 8:00 – 8:15 a.m.; Tuesday 5:00 – 6:00 p.m.; or anytime by appointment. Call the parish office for scheduling individual Reconciliation. Deanery communal Reconciliation Services are also scheduled during Advent and Lent.

## **Confirmation**

The sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated during the sophomore year of high school. The registration forms, requirements, and the schedule are posted on our website: [holyfamilyjasper.com](http://holyfamilyjasper.com). If you are older than tenth grade and have not been confirmed, you can enroll in Confirmation preparation sessions provided by our Invitation to Catholic Teachings Team. ## **Marriage**

Holy Family Parish has the responsibility of ensuring that marriages recognized and blessed by the Catholic Church will be lived in the faith. Marriage preparation involves assessment of the couple's communication, compatibility, and faith commitment, along with participation in the Unveiled Marriage Preparation, and planning the wedding ceremony with the presiding priest. Please contact the parish office at least eight months in advance of the date you are planning your wedding.

## **Anointing of the Sick**

The sacrament of Anointing, in which Christ is encountered as healer, is administered upon request for those seriously ill, facing major surgery, elderly, or those at the point of death. In addition, a communal reception of the Sacrament of the Sick is celebrated once a year during Advent, or at other times as it is related to Scripture.

## **Holy Orders**

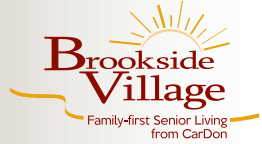
**Priesthood:** The ministerial priesthood is conferred by the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The normal period of preparation is four years of college and four years of theology. Information is available at the Vocations Office at the Catholic Center at 812-424-5536.

**Permanent Diaconate:** This ancient order, restored to the life of the Church, is open to married and single men who are at least 32 years old. Men who are ordained receive the Sacrament of Holy Orders. The term "permanent" means that a man is ordained a deacon for life, as opposed to the "transient" deacon, who is a deacon for just a short while and then becomes a priest. The priorities of a deacon are: family, job, diaconate. For information on the permanent diaconate call 812-423-1721.

## **OCIA**

The OCIA or Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (formerly known as RCIA) is a sacramental process by which non-baptized adults and children age seven and older, and baptized members of other Christian denominations, are received and welcomed into the Catholic Church. Baptized Catholics, at the age of seven and older, who are not catechized in the Catholic faith are also invited to participate in this process in preparation for the sacraments of Holy Eucharist and Confirmation. Through prayer, study, and fellowship, the participant is led to a deeper understanding and appreciation of the Catholic faith. The OCIA team helps to facilitate the conversion experience - or walks the journey with the candidate. The first step or phase is called Inquiry - a time during which the inquirer can ask questions and a time during which discernment is made about moving forward in the process. Formation in doctrine, liturgy, church life, and service is a part of the process. Divided into various periods or stages, the rite respects the individual's journey of faith. The length of time in the process can vary for each individual. A church sponsor is chosen to support the candidate along the way. These stages of initiation are marked by community celebrations that serve as transitions or steps throughout the rite. This process requires parishioners in key roles of ministry, such as the role of catechist and the role of sponsor on the OCIA team, who through their presence and prayer support those on their life-changing journey. ## **Welcome**

Welcome (formerly known as CRHP) is a spiritual renewal program held in a weekend retreat format. These retreats - one for men, one for women - are held once a year in February or early March and are combined with the other parishes in Jasper/Ireland. The retreat team consists of parishioners who have made previous Welcome/CRHP weekends. These weekends are wonderful opportunities for individual spiritual growth, as well as fellowship and friendship-building with fellow parishioners and others from our faith community.

Over 350 parish members have participated in the Welcome/CRHP experience over the years. The program is supported and maintained by a Continuation Committee that meets periodically to pray together, plan, and ensure the ongoing success of the program. ### **Holy Cross Religious Vocations**

Most Catholics are aware of the shortage of priests, sisters, brothers, and deacons. To promote religious vocations, we invite our parish family to join us in praying regularly for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. ### **Holy Family Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament**

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is held every Tuesday beginning at 7:00 a.m. and concludes with Benediction at 6:15 p.m. Holy Mass will be offered following Adoration and Benediction at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesdays for vocations. In the event of a funeral, Adoration will begin at 1:00 p.m.

### **Patriotic Rosary Service**

The Patriotic Rosary Service is held periodically throughout the year, coinciding with a national holiday or election, and is typically held on Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. This service includes a beautiful Rosary for our country with patriotic songs sung between the decades of the Rosary, prayers for our leaders, the military, and for freedom, and a Litany of Saints for the United States.

### **Blessings**

At various times during the liturgical year, special blessings are given: Stephen Ministers, catechists, candidates for Confirmation, couples celebrating anniversaries, and special occasions such as Mother's Day and Father's Day. Home blessings are also available. Contact the parish office to schedule a special blessing for your family.

### **Mass Intentions**

Masses will be offered for your loved ones at your request. Deceased parishioners may have two weekend or Holy Day Mass intentions, and one weekday Mass intention during the first year following their death. Deceased parishioners may have one weekend or Holy Day Mass and one weekday Mass intention per calendar year. Deceased non-parishioners may have one weekday Mass intention per year. Mass intentions may be scheduled one year in advance, and can include up to two names. The suggested stipend for a Mass intention is \$10.00. Upon request, Mass intentions may be sent away to retired priests, Duputy, Haiti, or other parishes. Depending on the Mass schedule and the number of Mass intentions available, these guidelines may be adjusted at the discretion of the parish office. Contact the parish office to schedule Mass intentions.

### **Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration**

The Divine Providence Adoration Chapel is located at 1385 W. 6th St., Jasper, Indiana. We, a community of faithful souls, are making Eucharistic Adoration a reality 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, by committing ourselves to a scheduled hour in Adoration with our Dear Jesus. We give glory to God; we pray for vocations; we pray for the protection of our families, community, and the world to make His Kingdom on this earth a loving and peaceful place to live.

The Divine Mercy group prays the Chaplet of Divine Mercy and the Rosary on the first Monday of each month at 6:00 p.m. Everyone is welcome. ## Spiritual Life

The Spiritual Life Committee coordinates all of the parish spiritual ministries, and responds to the ministry needs of our faith community. ### **Invitation to Catholic Teachings**

This ministry consists of a team of Catholics who are available to support and serve baptized Catholics along their journey of faith. For inactive Catholics who have questions about their faith – regardless of how long Catholics have been away from the church, this ministry invites them to renew their relationship with the Catholic Church. For baptized and catechized Catholics who previously were not able to complete the sacraments of First Communion and/or Confirmation, this ministry prepares them to receive these sacraments. On a year-round basis, committed team members are available who will address questions or concerns that you may have, and who will walk with you and welcome you on your journey of faith. 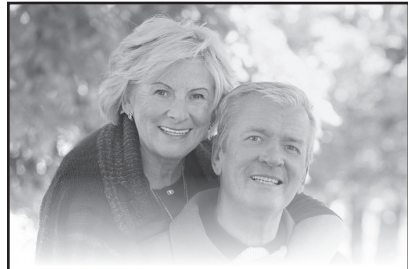

### **Lectors**

Readers proclaim the Word of God at Mass and at other prayer services. Volunteers are trained at least once a year. Call the parish office if interested.

### **Music Ministry**

We have several groups of music ministers, and everyone is welcome and encouraged to join: our adult choir, the guitar ensemble, our cantors/song leaders, and the funeral choir. We also have a youth choir that sings twice a month, as well as singers, and instrumentalists who are always welcome. ### **Sacristans**

Sacristans are responsible for preparing the worship space for the different seasons of the liturgical year. They also help set up for weddings and funerals. ### **Servers**

Servers are trained every year from the fifth grade to assist Father and the Deacons at liturgies and other parish prayer services. It is an opportunity for the young people to participate in ministry as part of their stewardship of time. Adults are trained to serve at weekday, non-school Masses, Saturday nights, and funerals. ### **Greeters**

Greeters provide a welcoming atmosphere by greeting the assembly as they attend the Mass celebrations. ## **Stephen Ministry**

Stephen Ministry equips lay people to provide distinctively Christian, confidential, one-to-one care to those who are experiencing all kinds of life challenges. These needs include, but are not limited to - the hospitalized; the terminally ill and their families; those grieving a death or serious loss; the homebound; those with a job crisis; those with disabilities and their families; those needing the support of a Christian friend; the separated or divorced; those in spiritual crisis; the aging and elderly; or those facing any other single or series of crises. Stephen Ministers listen, explore feelings, pray, share Christ's love, maintain confidentiality, and attend to the care giving process, leaving the results to God.

Stephen Ministers work together with Father Jeff to reach more people with Christian care than he can reach by himself. Stephen Ministers receive 50+ hours of training provided by Stephen Leaders. When this training is completed, Stephen Ministers are commissioned. They participate in continuing education and skill building throughout their years with the ministry. Stephen Leaders are trained for their roles through Stephen Ministries, St. Louis and remain in contact with them.

## Finance and Administration

The role of the Finance and Administration Ministry is to advance the mission of Holy Family Parish by being good stewards of parish finances. It is also the ministry's responsibility to inspire parishioners to give back to God a portion of the financial treasure He has provided. The ministry prepares and monitors the annual budgets and advises the Parish Finance Administrator and Parish Pastoral Council regarding stewardship of our financial treasures.

In addition, the Finance Ministry keeps and reports parish financials and administers the annual Catholic Ministries Appeal (formerly Catholic Parishes Campaign or CPC.) This ministry serves as a liaison with the Parish Council and is also responsible for the review and approval of capital operating expenditures prior to submission to the Parish Council for final approval. ### **Facilities Management Committee**

Our focus is to develop and implement a long-term plan for the optimal use of all the buildings and grounds of Holy Family Parish. The committee is determined that several things happen. First, we want the plan to have something in it for every member of the parish. Next, we want to plan long term so that the facility needs for Holy Family are covered for at least the next ten to fifteen years. All endowments established for the benefit of Holy Family Parish and Holy Trinity Catholic School are managed by the Catholic Foundation of Southwestern Indiana, Inc. For information contact the parish office.

### **Bereavement Endowment Fund**

Bereavement meals are provided for family and friends, following the funeral services of a deceased parishioner. The families are asked to give a free will offering toward the cost of the meal. Because funerals are very expensive and sometimes there have been long, costly illnesses, some families are not able to contribute the full cost of the meal. The Bereavement Endowment Fund was established to help pay for supplies, and drinks, which are furnished by the parish, and also to help cover remaining expenses from the bereavement meals. Donations may be sent to Holy Family Parish, marked for the Bereavement Endowment Fund, and can be made as a memorial donation in memory of someone. ### **Catholic Ministries Appeal (Formerly Catholic Parishes Campaign)**

This annual campaign is a means of providing financial support for various service programs offered by the Catholic Diocese of Evansville. The campaign is coordinated by the Finance and Administration Ministry. The financial goal is set by the diocese. Any money collected above the goal is returned to the parish. Any shortfall must be paid by the parish.

For over thirty years, Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Dupity, Haiti, and Holy Family have worked in solidarity to alleviate poverty in Dupity. Financial assistance is used to support the pastor, catechists and parish work, provide for food and clean water at the school and nutrition centers, sponsor an orphanage, support the medical clinic, assist in transportation needs, provide for several religious sisters working in the parish, provide for upkeep on the 12-mile stretch of mountainous road (the only lifeline to the outside world), and fund many other activities in this village of 17,000 people in the remote northeast region of Haiti. The Student Sponsorship Program provides an individual, family, group, or organization the opportunity to sponsor a student in the Catholic school of the parish, which provides tuition assistance and school lunches. A Women's Microlending project provides funds for women to begin small businesses.

The pastor of their parish is in direct communication with the committee. Fully 100% of donated funds are distributed directly toward the needs of the community where the extreme poverty results in routine hunger and harsh living conditions. ## Holy Trinity Catholic School

Catholic education has been an integral part of the fabric of our community since Saint Mother Theodore Guerin began the first school in Jasper. Over the years, there have been many changes to Catholic education in our county, yet the tradition of forming students in the image of Christ, while also emphasizing academic excellence, has remained strong.

Holy Trinity Catholic School opened its doors in August 2015 as the new, regional, Catholic school for the Catholic community of Dubois County. Our students, faculty/staff, and families strive to reach our mission as we go throughout each and every day of the school year: We, the Community of Holy Trinity Catholic School, come to learn and go forth to serve while trusting in Divine Providence. There are three words in this mission statement that truly define the work we do at Holy Trinity: Learn. Serve. Trust. Our students come to school each day, not only to learn in the classroom, but to more fully understand how to serve others and trust in our faith at all times.

Academically, our students are challenged across all subject areas by high expectations, based on the College and Career Ready Standards. Students learn to work independently, as well as in small groups, as many classrooms have structured learning centers or stations tailored to student needs. Technology is a part of every classroom. All students in grades 3-8 are 1:1 with electronic devices, which has created a wonderful, more engaged, learning experience for those students. Whether it be with our mobile labs or through computer lab time, students in preschool-2nd grade also work very closely with technology as they maneuver through their education. In addition to the classroom setting, students are also engaged in art, music, computer applications, physical education, and library time throughout the week. Our students in grades six through eight are organized in one of six Houses, which also serve as a homeroom. Students switch classes and teachers for various subjects. Our middle school students have the unique opportunity to choose an elective class each semester, such as baking, STEM, and yearbook, to name a few!

Our students in preschool and pre-Kindergarten join with students in Kindergarten through grade eight for our all-school Masses throughout the year. Students at both campuses are encouraged to participate in Student Ambassador led service projects throughout the year, such as our monthly food drive. Outreach opportunities, such as a partnership with Habitat for Humanity, are supported through our Religion classes and the Builders' Club. Through these opportunities to serve others, students are given the chance to practice Corporal Works of Mercy, which they learn about as a part of our Religion curriculum.

Holy Trinity Catholic School welcomes all current families from our surrounding parishes, as well as new students whose families desire an academic education rooted in Gospel values. We encourage you to reach out to any of the staff members or current families to find out more about what Holy Trinity Catholic School has to offer! ### **School Council**

Holy Trinity Catholic School has a consultative School Council consisting of one member from each parish (Holy Family, Precious Blood, St. Joseph, and St. Mary, Ireland) along with one member representing the other parishes in the county. There are also three additional members in specific areas of expertise in marketing, finance, and building and grounds. Finally, there is one member appointed to represent those students who are members of a faith community outside of the Catholic Church. The pastors from the county, along with the administration and teacher representatives, are ex-officio members. The goals and functions of the Holy Trinity Catholic School Council include coordinating educational functions relative to the school, establishing and monitoring policies under which the principals shall operate the school, and establishing goals and an annual school budget.
