

AGENCY –

PROOF OF IDENTITY –

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) requires passengers to carry a government issued identification (ID) card in order to board a flight. The name, date of birth and gender that appears on the traveler's ID card must exactly match the same such information that is listed on the airline ticket and in the booking records.

International travel requires travelers to have a valid US Passport and may also require one or more Visas, depending upon the traveler's destination and nationality.

Travelers under the age of 18 not traveling with both parents may need additional special or legal documentation to travel.

It is the traveler's responsibility to be aware of, obtain, and provide the proper documentation required for their trip. Failure to strictly comply with these requirements may result in denied boarding, undue delays, and/or fees resulting in additional cost to the traveler(s). Brentwood Travel is not responsible for these fees and no refunds will be made.

Non-U.S. passport holders should contact the embassies of their destination and transit countries to obtain entrance requirements. RATES & INCREASES –
