# The NEED

In 2022, we launched an online survey asking parents and the community more broadly questions concerning education in Brisbane. The overwhelming response pointed to two key areas:

- A growing desire for an alternative to the current offerings of the schooling system in Australia.
- A wide range of support amongst practicing Catholic families in Brisbane for a school offering a classical education.

#### THE CLASSICAL EDUCATION MOVEMENT

In the United States, the classical education movement has swept across the country over the past decade. In 2025, the Institute of Catholic Liberal Education (ICLE) had 283 member schools, with over 183 of these schools joining since 2021.

In Australia, classical, Liberal education is beginning to attract significant attention in the national educational conversation, with Catholic Schools NSW and Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools both taking steps towards integrating the liberal arts/classical education into their schooling systems. There are also a number of new and intentionally classical Christian schools opening across the country.



# The ANSWER

## St John Henry Newman College will answer this need, on Australian soil, in our local Brisbane community.

Our school will be a classical, independent, co-educational school opening in January 2026. With the initial intake of Years Prep to Three, the College will become a full P-12 school with separate Primary and Secondary campuses in the subsequent years.

It will provide a classical education that immerses students in the Truth, Beauty, and Goodness of God and His world, forming them in wisdom and virtue to become faithful Catholics prepared to contribute to God's work in the world.

Classical education responds to a cultural and spiritual need by offering an alternative to the status quo, in step with the invaluable traditions of Western education. It seeks to form the whole person, through the best that has been thought and said throughout history, introducing young minds to the works and ideas that have made the civilisation we live in today.

That is why we are committed to a classical Catholic education for St John Henry Newman College.

#### **OUR SCHOOL CREST**

Our crest was developed with the desire to connect to the tradition and heritage that Newman College inherits. Its elements all speak to the identity of the school.

The cross and three hearts are elements taken from Newman's own crest. The cross represents the centrality of Christ in the purpose of the school. The three hearts represent both the Holy Trinity and Newman's motto of 'heart speaks to heart', referring to the communion of God and man, and our nature as relational beings made in the image of God.

The book of Alpha and Omega represents the educational purpose of the school which is to introduce students to the best that has been thought and said, recognising God as the beginning and end of all learning.

The papal keys form the foundation of the crest, speaking to the school's submission to the teaching of the Magisterium of the Catholic Church.


The gold of the shield and keys comes from the gold on Newman's crest, and represent the sovereignty and glory of God. The blue represents the school's pursuit of truth and piety.


### Saint John Henry Newman

The College is named after Saint John Henry Newman (1801–1890), an English Catholic Cardinal, Doctor of the Church, theologian and scholar. Newman had an important influence on education, founding the Literary and Historical Society while the rector at the Catholic University of Ireland, Dublin, and later publishing a volume of lectures entitled *The Idea of a University*. He was a supporter of the renewal of the vision of a liberal education, rather than an education aimed at purely 'useful skills':

"Good indeed means one thing, and useful means another; but I lay it down as a principle... that, though the useful is not always good, the good is always useful."



# Our SCHOOL MOTTO



## Ex umbris in veritatem Out of shadows into truth

Our motto derives from the inscription on Saint John Henry Newman's tombstone, which communicates two distinct yet connected metaphors central to our school identity.

Firstly, it speaks to the educational journey of the formation of a learner, and as such has classical connections to Plato's 'Allegory of The Cave' in his *Republic*, which tells the story of the journey of wisdom presented as an individual's escape from a cave in which shadows on a wall are presented as the totality of reality.

Progressing through the darkness and into the light of truth and reality is the difficult but necessary journey for all people. But this journey is not merely intellectual, as the second metaphor is found in moving from shadows into truth, symbolic of the journey of faith and the sanctification and growth in wisdom and virtue that is the gift of the grace of Christ.

"Newman College is a beacon of authentic Catholic education, offering a rigorous classical curriculum rooted in truth, beauty, and goodness. With a deep commitment to the Church's teachings, Newman forms students intellectually and spiritually, preparing them to think critically, live virtuously, and embrace their faith with confidence. It's more than a school—it's a place where young minds are shaped for wisdom and souls are formed for eternity."



# The Classical DIFFERENCE

## A classical education asks a long-neglected question: What is the purpose of education?

Rather than education being about job-ready skills and career-oriented learning, a classical education sees wisdom and virtue as its purpose, seeking to shape the mind and soul of the student through the eternal realities of the True, the Good, and the Beautiful.

Shaped by the Trivium established in Ancient Greece, and codified in the Medieval Period, this pedagogical approach is rooted in **Grammar**, **Logic**, and **Rhetoric**. It teaches the 'best that has been thought and said' through the great works of

the Western Literary canon

A classical education focuses upon the humane arts of Literature, History, Philosophy, and Theology, emphasising their value not only as skills, but as foundational knowledge that informs our understanding of what it

means to be human (anthropology), how best to live our lives (ethics), the appreciation of beauty (aesthetics), and the joy of

knowing God (theology).



From Aristotle and Homer to Aquinas and Austen, it is through the great minds and works that have shaped Western civilisation that a classical education teaches students to make sense of our modern world, and instills within them a passion to make it a better place.

## Our CURRICULUM

As a classical Catholic school in the Liberal Arts tradition, there are many distinctive elements of education at St John Henry Newman College:

#### **GREAT BOOKS:**

Our students will study, read and enjoy 'the best that has been thought and said,' as contained in the classic works from authors such as Beatrix Potter, Laura Ingalls Wilder, C.S. Lewis, Kenneth Grahame, J.R.R. Tolkien, Jane Austen, Dante Alighieri, John Milton, William Shakespeare, Mary Shelley, and Fydor Dostoevsky.

### PHILOSOPHY: We also integrate

philosophical thinking into our classes, gently at first, but gradually we introduce a historical overview of important thinkers from Socrates through to Pope St John Paul II. For example, Year Five students are introduced to Plato's Cave at the same time as reading C.S.

Lewis' *The Silver Chair*, which shares many similar themes.

#### **DIRECT INSTRUCTION:**

Classical education, unlike recent contemporary trends, has always highlighted the importance of direct teacher-led instruction. Classrooms can be orderly and still enjoyable and engaging, and direct instruction teaching is a

valuable approach to introducing new concepts and skills to students.

#### **HISTORY:**

As part of our Classical Studies programme, students will be introduced to the story of the world, forming a deep knowledge of the history of Western Civilisation, not just through memorisation of dates and events, but also by embodying their new knowledge in cultural events at the school such as medieval banquets.

We approach the Australian Curriculum through our lens and implement it based upon the classical and Catholic philosophy and theology of our school.

### Integrating History

Where possible we integrate curriculum areas together, presenting students with a coherent harmony of understanding, rather than siloed fragmented subjects. We do this through a chronological approach to history in our Classical Studies subject, which is a school-based subject taught in addition to the Australian Curriculum.

### Grammar, Logic & Rhetoric

We teach these liberal arts – sometimes called the Trivium – across all subjects. We also teach them as distinct skills and content, with a particular focus on teaching grammar skills like parsing sentences when students are young, then teaching logic and critical thinking as they get older, and always encouraging their rhetorical skills in public speaking.

### Music, Poetry & Visual Art

While we prize all of the arts, we have a special focus on music, particularly choral music, visual art such as sketching and painting, and on poetry memorisation and recitation.

### Religion

Religion is another school-based subject, meaning it is taught in addition to the AC requirements. We use religion time as catechesis to teach children about the Bible, and our Catholic faith and its history. Our Catholic faith is the foundation upon which our school is established, and religious instruction naturally permeates all aspect of school life.

#### Latin

From Prep, students will learn Latin. Not as a 'dead' language, but as one which opens the door to the Romance languages, a language which teaches logic and grammar through its structure and gives the gift of reading in their original language some the great works of the Western canon.


